WELCOME FROM HOLY CROSS & ST MARY'S CHURCH



Dear friends,

There's something very civilised about receiving an invitation with an RSVP on it! 'Répondez s'il vous plait.' We've had several invitations recently from friends of ours who are getting married and naturally, there is an RSVP attached to each one – it would be rude of us to ignore it or forget to respond.

Invitations are out there to our next Alpha Course starting on Thursday 15th September at 7.30pm. We have dinner together, provided by our wonderful catering team, with wine or soft drinks. We then watch a short video and chat informally around

tables. Alpha is a great refresher course for those wanting to be reminded of their Christian faith and is great for those who want to explore the faith in a non threatening, informal atmosphere. The Alpha film series is presented by Toby Flint, a Curate from Holy Trinity Brompton and Gemma Hunt, a CBBC TV presenter alongside Nicky Gumbel. The course has proved popular in Quainton, with 8 people signing up for the first one last year, 18 for the second one at the George in the autumn and 26 for the one that has recently finished. It's open to all and it's free.

One of the greatest British painters of the Victorian era was the Pre-Raphaelite artist Holman Hunt. His most famous work, 'Light Of The World' was probably painted in the garden of Oxford University Press in the 1850s and was later donated to Keble College where it now hangs. It was based on the depiction of Jesus in the Book of Revelation in the Bible, where Jesus says to the church in Laodicea, "Behold I stand at the door and knock."

Hunt portrays Jesus, robed in splendour, standing outside the door in a tangled and overgrown garden. He is holding a lantern and wanting to come in. Hunt stated that he purposely did not paint a handle on the outside of the door, for only the individual inside can open the door and invite the visitor in. Jesus will never impose himself. He waits to be welcomed.

It is said that the elderly Holman Hunt was upset when Keble Collage began charging people to see the painting, so he began another, larger version which was installed in St Paul's Cathedral in 1908 during a special service which included the reading from Revelation 3:20, "Behold I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and eat with him and he with me."

Many years later the painting went to be cleaned from all the grime seeping into the Cathedral from traffic around St Paul's. When the restorer removed the frame and the moulding, there, in the script at the bottom, painted by the artist Hunt and to be seen by the Lord alone, was this prayer:

"Forgive me Lord Jesus that I kept you waiting so long."



The Cubs and Scouts have been kayaking at Great Moor sailing club thanks to the Buckingham, Winslow and Scout District water activities team.



Skate Park: THE SKATEPARK IS STILL CLOSED!! We know some people have removed the tape and are using the skatepark, we reiterate that it is too high risk and if anything happens to people using the skatepark whilst it is out of service you are NOT covered by the Parish Council insurance. A quote has been obtained to carry out repairs and this quote was accepted at the meeting. However these repairs will not hold for long, so we still need to press on with the new skatepark redesign. A meeting will be arranged shortly to discuss. If you're interested to help build the next Quainton Skatepark, please join the group: https://www.facebook.com/groups/996917390903081/

The George & Dragon Pub: as you will know the pub is up for sale. It is listed as a Community Asset, which means that a community group has a right to bid, therefore we booked a meeting for the community to come together and discuss the process and see if there is interest in the village to form a Community Action Group to put together a business plan and raise funds to put in a bid to keep the pub as a Community Pub. At time of this Quainton News going to print the meeting was not held yet, so the outcome will be available through our other communication channels.

CHOW: Better news from the Community Heritage Orchard and Wildlife Meadow this month, the young trees in the orchard are mostly doing well, with some bearing young fruits. CHOW is planing a Wildflower Audit on Monday 11 July at 2pm. Follow progress on CHOW and offer your help and support via https://www.facebook.com/groups/321040946212772

Speed Watch: we've received our first report from SID at Lower Street (near School) through the service provider we've engaged. We saw some vehicles race through at worrying speeds at late night hours, although the majority drive through at more appropriate speeds, we have to fully analyse the results before we can give a more definite indication of the situation with respect to speeding.

Planning: we've been asked to comment on 22/01481/ALB re: 16 The Green, we've agreed we have no objections to this provided it's done in keeping with and following conservation rules. We also discussed 22/01459/PIP Land at Doddershall, which we agreed to not support, in our opinion it is not in line with the Quainton Neighbourhood Plan, the location is open countryside, not within the Settlement Boundary and does not reflect a straightforward replacement of the loss of The Lodge, the location of Site 1 as the preferred site is along Snake Lane/Fidlers Field near Fieldside Farm, along another route into the Doddershall Estate, not along the route where the Lodge was located.

Roads: we continue to report issues with our roads on FixMyStreet and follow up Buckinghamshire Council on our list of roads that needs repairs this ranges from potholes to damaged kerbs, damaged drains to bollards and traffic signs, as well as the issues with heavy traffic coming through the village.

The Bridge: we continue to press for the bridge on Station Road to be repaired so we can get the 3-tonne weight limit lifted and get Station Road re-opened. We have exchanged emails with Greg Smith MP's office and have been assured that this will be followed up with Network Rail and the Department for Transport to obtain some clarity into what is happening with the bridge.

Bus Service: we're yet again receiving complaints about the number 16 bus, it seems the first bus doesn't turn up on time and other buses do not stop in the village at all or extremely late. We know that the route was up for tender last month and we're awaiting confirmation of who will be running the bus service. The bus issues have also been reported in our email to Greg Smith MP's office. Meanwhile, the Quainton Emergency Team is available to help people get to appointments. New bus time table can be found here: https://www.buckscc.gov.uk/media/4518148/16-red-rose-travel-may-2022.pdf

Station Road Crossroads: we are still waiting for news via Ward Councillor Iain Macpherson, however the existing Give Way warning signs are now more visible and the vision splays have been cut recently, the area is being kept as clear as possible, so the junction is visible from all 4 directions. Apparently Barwood Homes are tasked with installing Vehicle Activated Light-up Signs, we have yet to confirm this.

HS2/EKFB New Station Rd Layout: the new drawings have been presented to the Parish Council, we have printed some in A3 format to put on display in due course and arrange a presentation with the residents of the village. HS2 / EKFB have suggested they will visit the village again with their mobile information unit at the Memorial Hall. We will request they come at a time that allows for residents to come in after work or on a weekend if possible. Further details will be published in Quainton News as well as on our Notice Boards, Facebook Page, Quainton Village Life and our website.

The George & Dragon Community Action Group



Meeting Report Thursday 23rd June 2022

With the news that The George & Dragon pub is up for sale, the Quainton Parish Council (QPC) was approached to ask what, if anything, QPC was going to do about this. Since it is not up to the QPC alone, but the whole of Quainton Community, the QPC called a public meeting on Thursday 23rd June at the Quainton Memorial Hall. We had 102 residents in attendance. Below a quick recap and outcome of this meeting and ways for you to play a role in saving our pub. To be clear the Pub as well as the Café are up for sale at the asking price of £625,000 all the details are on: http://bit.ly/QuaintonPub4Sale

Asset of Community Value (ACV)

The George & Dragon Pub is listed as an Asset of Community Value (ACV) or Community Asset. ACV status means that if the owner puts the property for sale on the open market, a community group can register an interest in purchasing the property. Once the owner has notified the Buckinghamshire Council, a six-month moratorium kicks in to allow the community group to form and implement a plan to purchase the pub. The ACV status prevents the owner from selling the property to anyone else during this period of time.

Community Right to Bid - Notification of Sale

On 18 May 2022 the owner or sales agent of The George & Dragon pub, informed Buckinghamshire Council that the pub is up for sale. Quainton Parish Council received a formal Notification of Intention to Sell from Buckinghamshire Council, saying: "If community groups wish to express an interest in purchasing the property then an EOI can be submitted through our website by the 29th June 2022." The Notification of Sale starts a 6 month period or "Moratorium" during which an asset can only be sold if it is to a community interest group. After the 6 month period, the owner can sell to whomever they choose.

Expression Of Interest (EOI)

An Expression of Interest (EOI) is only a notification from the Community Group to the Buckinghamshire Council that the community would like to register an interest to buy the pub. This is not a binding contract, and does not obligate us in any way. It simply provides us the time and opportunity to take the next steps.

Formal Moratorium Period

The EOI starts a 6 month period or "Moratorium" during which an asset can only be sold if it is to a community interest group. After the 6 month period, the owner can sell to whomever they choose.

The George & Dragon Community Action Group (G&DCAG)

The meeting on Thursday was to establish if the formation of a Community Action Group along with a Steering Committee of 6-8 people was something the residents of Quainton wanted to get involved with. The result of the meeting is that more than 6 people stepped forward to form the Steering Committee and as such the resolution was made to go ahead and submit the EOI form on behalf of the George & Dragon Community Action Group. Cllr Peter Woodliffe-Thomas will be the main contact between the G&DCAG and QPC.

Expression Of Interest (EOI) Completed

Our Clerk, Katherine Richardson, has submitted the form to the Buckinghamshire Council and we now need to get the G&DCAG to meet to start the next steps over the remainder of the 6 months Moratorium. They will need to: develop a business plan, raise the finances to buy the pub, make a bid to buy the pub on the open market.





Another Quainton Centenarian

I read with interest Peter Harding's excellent article on his aunt Dorothy Ayres in the June edition of the Quainton News. My mother Laura Saunders, a friend of Dorothy and of her sister Madge, was 100 just a week later. Celebrations were very low key as Mum had been in Stoke Mandeville Hospital for several weeks beforehand following a fall and only came home on the afternoon of her actual birthday.





Laura was the youngest of four daughters of George Blake, a farmer of Steeple Claydon, and his wife Laura nee Lord. She attended the Latin School in Buckingham but left in 1939 and served in the Fire Service in Rugby during the War. She and my father had met in their teens and my father, who had survived the evacuation after Dunkirk, eventually returned to

the UK in 1946 after 4 years in Burma and India and in 1947 they were married at Steeple Claydon Parish Church.

In 1950 they moved to Warwickshire where my father was the Station Master at Dunchurch but returned to Buckinghamshire in 1958 to live in Quainton where Dad was the last

Station Master here before the Beeching closures. Mum worked for a while at the Post Office with Mr and Mrs Mole and then as an unqualified teacher at the village school with Mr and Mrs Lawes. In her 40's Mum learnt to drive and was able to attend Bletchley Park Teachers Training College and gain her teaching certificate. On qualifying she returned to Quainton School where she taught until her retirement.




Mum's other interests over the years included Country Dancing, her membership of the Baptist Church Women's Own and the Women's British Legion, where she especially enjoyed the Whist Drives.

In addition to two daughters and four grand-

daughters there are now 8 great grandchildren ranging in age from 9 to 16.





RAMBLINGS FROM FINEMERE WOOD: Charlotte Karmali, Volunteer Warden

June is a glorious month for wildflowers. For floral fanatics such as me, it can be a frantic time. Each day another species bursts into beautiful blooms, and I charge from wood to meadow, from roadside verge to riverside bank to catch these splendours at their best. I have to see them every year, pondering over each and every one's exquisite beauty; it is intoxicating.

In Finemere Wood, common spotted orchids are more widespread than ever before, pale pink with purple markings, they are a magnificent vision. Small white star-like flowers of lesser stitchwort are scattered throughout the open grassy areas. Herb robert with small, pretty pink crane's-bill flowers flourishes in the shaded areas. Meadowsweet explodes with dense clusters of small white flowers.



The woodland workers are a fine sight too. Less colourful perhaps, but beautiful in their own way, and wonderful to watch as they labour away to ensure a rich habitat for these floral curiosities.

Our summer project is to replace a section of stock fencing on the adjoining meadows. Brains and brawn are both required. Deep holes must be dug for strainer posts; multiple intermediate posts must be pounded in; old fencing must be deconstructed,

and post and rail sections of fencing must be created.

Like the flora I so revere, each volunteer is unique and critical to the job on hand. Some could dig to Australia, others are happy to pound away all day. Some like to demolish and others prefer to construct. It takes all sorts.

Selfheal (*Prunella vulgaris*) is a stunner of a plant, producing clusters of violet flowers around its cylindrical flower spike, from June through to October. A creeping plant of the mint family, it can grow up to 30cm in height. It is abundant in grassy places such as open areas of woods and on untreated garden lawns. Viewed as a troublesome weed in some gardens, I choose to nurture patches of selfheal on my lawn. It is a valuable nectar source for many pollinators, bumble bees in particular.



Prunella vulgaris has been used in herbal medicine for centuries. It is believed to stimulate the body's own healing process, hence the name selfheal. Its uses have been plentiful: to staunch bleeding, heal wounds and treat sore throats, to name but a fow

Great headway has been made on the fencing front and despite the use of many a large, sharp and heavy tool, the medicinal help of selfheal was not required this month.




