Platinum Jubilee Beacon Burning

Thursday 2nd June at 9.30pm on Mill Hill

If ever there was the perfect event to light the beacon, this is it!

Celebrating Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II's seventy amazing years on the throne.

The official beacon burning event schedule from the Palace is printed on p5. Here in Quainton, we intend to put on a full event, including Town Crier, Bugler, Bagpiper and Community Choir who will all perform their part in the lead up to the beacon being lit.

WELCOME FROM HOLY CROSS & ST MARY'S CHURCH



Watergate was a major political scandal in the United States involving the administration of U.S. President Richard Nixon from 1972 to 1974 and it led to Nixon's resignation.

Charles W. Colson, was a "political saboteur" for the president during those infamous years, masterminding some of the dirty tricks that led to the president's downfall. Colson went to prison after pleading guilty to obstructing justice in one of the criminal plots that undid the Nixon administration. After serving time behind bars, he emerged from prison having had a "wake up call" after a spiritual experience. He went on to become an important Christian leader. He died in 2012 at the age of 80.

After reflecting on the resurrection of Jesus Christ, he famously commented: "I know the resurrection is a fact, and Watergate proved it to me. How? Because 12 men testified they had seen Jesus raised from the dead, then they proclaimed that truth for 40 years, never once denying it. Every one was beaten, tortured, stoned and put in prison. They would not have endured that if it weren't true. Watergate embroiled 12 of the most powerful men in the world-and they couldn't keep a lie for three weeks. You're telling me 12 apostles could keep a lie for 40 years? Absolutely impossible!"

In the church year, May continues the Easter Season, culminating on Pentecost Sunday, 5th June, when we celebrate the birth of the church and the coming of the Holy Spirit.

One of the things that has struck me this Easter is the simple phrase used by Mark, the writer of the Gospel, in verse 16 of chapter 16: "When the Sabbath was over..." He goes on to recount the extraordinary events that surrounded the resurrection of Christ. That little phrase, "When the Sabbath was over..." describes the beginning of something revolutionary, even shocking! Why? Because for centuries the Jews worshipped God on the Sabbath which was a Saturday. It was non negotiable, a given fact, not only an expectation but a command that religious people would worship God on a Saturday. But in this one throw away phrase, Mark describes the beginning of a radical new movement that would rock the religious establishment and change the course of history.

The early Christians changed the rules and set up, which was then an ordinary working day, a Sunday, into the new worship day for believers. Sunday, the first day of the week, was resurrection day, the day Christ rose from the dead.

Every time we come to church on a Sunday, we are declaring loud and clear, "this is resurrection day and we are God's Easter People."

But was a change of worship day a big deal? You bet it was! Not only did it rock the religious establishment but it immediately put at risk the lives of the early Christian communities that created a new way of doing things. But they didn't care. Because they were eye witnessing to something extraordinary.

May God bless you and all those you care for, Rev Steve





Parish Council Report:

We held the Annual Meeting of Quainton Parish on 7th April, starting with a reading of the Quainton Parish Annual Report by Chairman Cllr Nicolette Smith, you can read a copy of this Annual Report (and that of previous years) on our website: https://www.quainton.org.uk/reports

Quainton Vision: We're introducing Quainton Vision, with the new Quainton Neighbourhood Plan close to completion, we think it's a great idea to work on a greater vision for Quainton. Quainton Vision is going to be a long term strategic plan, to enhance the health and wellbeing for the wider community of Quainton Parish. The CHOW Project and the Skatepark redesign will be part of this plan, and other projects for example at the Railway Centre, the Church and the Recreation Ground. We have some ideas of our own, like better infrastructure in terms of roads, footpaths, bridleways, rights of way, improved recreational facilities, supporting facilities for young and old to come together in the community. However, we work for you and we want to invite people to write to us with ideas! What Vision do you have for your community? What services would you like? Are there any activities that you miss? Let us know via the contact form on our website: https://quainton.org.uk/contact-us

VACANCIES: We have 3 vacancies on the council and we invite people from the Parish to contact us and apply for the role of Parish Councillor. To find out more about the role, please go to the Quainton Village Website: https://quainton.org.uk/Media/Councillors/P-Councillor-Role.pdf

Skate Park: An inspection is scheduled to take place during May. A new Facebook group has been created and we invite people who are interested to join the group: https://www.facebook.com/groups/996917390903081/

Jubilee Beacon: Remember to make your plans to view the Jubilee Beacon as part of the Queen's Jubilee celebrations on 2nd June. More information about the Queen's Jubilee celebrations can be found on the Buckinghamshire Lieutenancy's website: https://www.buckslieutenancy.org/platinumjubilee22

CHOW: We've seen some fabulous blossoms on the young trees already. The picnic bench and two other benches are in place and the area is looking lovely. Follow progress and offer you help and support via https://www.facebook.com/groups/321040946212772

Planning: There was a number of new applications submitted on the day of our meeting, but we did not have enough time for them all to be considered. One application in particular that we discussed was the proposal of 12 new homes on Station Road adjacent to the ones currently being built by Barwood Homes. We concluded that we would put in an objection, based on the new Neighbourhood Plan boundaries, but we need to refer to the laws around this and get an objection in by 5th May.

The Bridge: We're also continuing to press for the bridge on Station Road to be repaired so we can get the 3-tonne weight limit lifted and get Station Road re-opened. We sent a letter to Greg Smith MP, and were informed that he has forwarded our concerns to Secretary of State for Transport, Grant Shapps. Rumours are that the bridge will be repaired, but we have yet to have confirmation of this. We will continue to chase this up.

Roads: We continue to follow up Buckinghamshire Council on our list of roads that need repairs. This ranges from potholes to damaged kerbs; damaged drains to bollards and traffic signs, as well as the issues with heavy traffic coming through the village.

Bus Service: Our Ward Councillor Iain Macpherson arranged a meeting with all parties, we had two representatives for the Parish Council: Mr Brian Fludgate and Cllr Nicolette Smith; Ms Lou Fox attended to represent the residents and bus users; Mr Taj Kahn represented the bus services, and two representatives for Buckinghamshire Council, from Transport and Public Transport along with Cllr Iain Macpherson. We've discussed the current bus services and talked about various alternative solutions. There was no clear conclusion on how we can solve the bus service issues. Cllr Smith reiterated how important it is to get the bridge repaired as Station Road is such an important route in and out of the village. A new timetable will start on 3rd May with an additional 9am bus between Quainton and Waddesdon, which hopefully will help people who need to go to Waddesdon Surgery in the morning. Speed Watch: We're still progressing on the installation of the four poles and two new SIDs, we're looking to engage services with the right paperwork, permissions and licenses to install the poles as soon as possible.

Station Road Traffic Calming: We now have the new drawings, with proposals that take away the chicane at the Old Farmhouse, but put in place a couple of signs that warn oncoming traffic that pedestrians may walk in the road at the section of road where the footpath is too narrow. We've suggested alternatives that would help the village, rather than saddle us with solutions that don't work for us. This is an ongoing issue and we continue to talk with Buckinghamshire Council and Barwood Homes.

Station Road Crossroads: Ward Councillor Iain Macpherson reported that we are still awaiting police reports, until then we cannot progress on this situation.

HS2/EKFB New Station Rd Layout: The new drawingsv have been presented to the Parish Council, we are working on printing some in large scale (the A4 versions we have are too small to see the details) and arrange a presentation with the residents of the village.






"Dressing The Millstones"

The purpose of the windmill is to crush grain to produce flour using the two millstones driven by the wind. The lower stone is fixed, it is known as the Bedstone, whilst the upper stone, known as the Runner stone, rotates up to 120 rpm. The grain is introduced through the centre of the rotating upper stone, and its centrifugal force moves the grain towards the outside of the stones.

The upper stone is cut with a concave area around its centre, this is called the Swallow, it allows the gradual flow of grain and an easier passage of air to help the movement of flour to the outer edge. Both millstones have carved channels cut into their faces which also help push the flour to the outside of the millstones, where it is collected within its wooden casing.

The carved channels also trap the grains and crack them open, similar to rubbing your hands together. Each grain of wheat is may be 4 or 5mm thick and it is crushed to flour 0.5mm thick at the outside edge.

The Quainton Windmill Society recently employed a skilled millwright to improve the performance of the millstones, this is known as "Dressing the Millstones". He deepening the concave hollow in the centre

of the upper stone and also increasing the depth and efficiency of the carved channels on both millstones.

The above sounds straight forward, however the millwright wore out 2 or 3 (indestructible??) diamond bladed industrial cutter and grinder plates on the day. He remarked how hard the quartzite stone was and said it was in very good condition.

You are invited to celebrate the life of Richard Brett, Rector of Quainton Church and one of the translators of the King James Bible

Saturday 14th May 2022

Dr Richard Brett (1567–1637) was the Rector of Quainton throughout his working life and was one of the Oxford team of translators of the King James version of the Bible. Over the past 400 years it has enriched the English language with phrases such as 'salt of the earth', 'the apple of my eye', 'the fly in the ointment' and many others. All adopted in everyday speech.

The incomparable language of this book has proved fitting to express the nation's joys and sorrows at services in our great Cathedrals. But it also has a simplicity which can give guidance and comfort for those who turn to it for help.

The Brett Memorial was erected by his wife in the south aisle, beautifully conserved by Imogen Paine, and funded by Basil Smith who has long family ties with Quainton.

Dr Brett (*left top*) was a Fellow of Lincoln College Oxford and the current Rector of the college, Professor Henry Woudhuysen, has kindly agreed to join us at the event, speak briefly on Brett and his circle and unveil the monument. He will be accompanied by members of the Lincoln College choir and organist. Handel (*left bottom*) drew on the King James version for his *Messiah* and the choir will sing well-known choruses including: *And the glory of the Lord; Hallelujah; Behold the lamb of God; And with his stripes.*

To Dos & Tips for May from QGS

- Sow runner beans, French beans, courgettes, squashes, marrows, sweet corn. One in each pot in the greenhouse or somewhere warm keep moist, plant out at the end of the month after avoiding late frosts
- Once the frosts are over, plant out hardened off half hardy annuals and summer bedding
- · Direct sow zinnias
- Do a second sowing of half-hardy annuals inside to give you flowers until nearly Christmas
- · Sow biennials, eg foxgloves, honesty and wallflowers ready for next spring
- · Harvest seed of cowslips and primroses before it drops, and sow straight into a seed tray
- Lift and divide overcrowded clumps of daffodils and other spring bulbs
- Prune spring shrubs, such as Forsythia and Chaenomeles, after flowering to keep them compact
- Attend the QGS Plant Sale on 14th May





RAMBLINGS FROM FINEMERE WOOD:

Charlotte Karmali, Volunteer Warden

There is no better place to be than Finemere Wood on a warm sunny day in April. The approach to the reserve is increasingly off-putting, as HS2 works escalate. The surrounding landscape is becoming ever bleaker as yet more greenery is removed. Hedges replaced with fencing. Fields of grass and flowers, now bare soil. Heavy machinery chugs around moving earth from one place to another. Yellowhammers, with their bright yellow head and underparts, once resided along the track into the wood. It was always a joy to watch as they flitted across my path, just one of many species that must find another home.

But once you have made it through this barren landscape and into Finemere Wood, another world is waiting. There is colour: shades of yellow, white, purple, pink and green. Lots of green. Primroses, wood anemones and violets are plentiful. Bugle and cuckoo flower are following suit. The bluebells are beginning to bloom. Brimstone, Orange-tip and Peacock butterflies are on the wing, enticing woodland visitors deeper into this magical place.

The volunteers soak up the colourful environment underneath the warm Spring sun. There is grass to cut with brushcutters and scythes. There is raking to follow. And there are many Heras fencing panels to be lugged along the long woodland track. I hear few complaints as the resolute souls trudge endlessly back and forth, delivering the goods to their destination.

We rest from time to time, for tea and ginger cake, and listen to the wood which chatters around us. The "chiffchaffing" of the Chiffchaff, the rich melodic song of the Blackcap, the haunting warble of the Willow Warbler and the trilling of the Wren, to name but a few.

Common lizards are spotted in the grass, basking in the sun as we do, buzzard circles high above us. Just yards from our resting place, a Red Kite sits upon its nest. The wood is brimming over with life. Spring is here. It is beautiful, it is invigorating and it is restorative.






