Dear friends,

We are indeed living in momentous days. So much happening on the world stage what with...

But now here's a strange thing (some would call it amazing!). A double rainbow was seen above Buckingham Palace, and at the same time, two more rainbows were seen in the skies above Balmoral and Windsor castle shortly before the death of Queen Elizabeth II on Thursday 8th September. I think the chances of that happening in all three places at the same time are quite remote. It was as if God himself was giving the nation a sign of hope in a time of turmoil, the kind of hope that Queen Elizabeth

spoke about on many occasions. The rainbow was also a sign to us all that God was receiving HM Queen Elizabeth II into his safe keeping after a life well lived.

Of course, we associate the rainbow with a sign of God's presence and peace following the story about Noah and the flood. But at the end of the Bible, in Revelation chapter 4, the sign of the rainbow occurs again, but this time it's in a vision seen by John. As he looks up he sees an open door and through the door he sees a throne and a rainbow. Interesting connection there don't you think. The throne, a symbol of God's sovereignty and a rainbow, a symbol of his love.

We always looked forward to the Queen's Christmas message at 3.00pm on Christmas Day. The last few years she was very open about her Christian faith.

"For me the teachings of Christ and my own personal accountability before God provide a framework in which I try to lead my life. I, like so many of you, have drawn great comfort in difficult times from Christ's words and example."

"I draw strength from the message of hope in the Christian gospel."

"For me, the life of Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace, whose birth we celebrate today, is an inspiration and an anchor in my life. A role-model of reconciliation and forgiveness"

The London Evening Standard ran an experiment. They had someone stand outside Oxford Circus Station handing out leaflets. On the front of the leaflet, there was an invitation for people to read an important message. Thousands of people passed by and many took the leaflet out of politeness, then dropped it into the nearest waste bin. Those who took the time to read it were invited to go back to the giver and receive a free gift of a £5 note! Only 11 people went back!

I often wonder how often we miss something amazing because we just walk on by and don't want to get involved. Try ALPHA! And a quick reminder that our Morning Services in Church are now at the pre-covid time of 9.30am. 1st Sunday of the month, café breakfast Church (bacon rolls etc), 3rd Sunday of the month, Family Communion.




QGS Annual Village Show


Over £300 was raised to go towards the maintenance and expansion of the orchard. Our district councillor, Phil Gomm, called in to support the event – thanks to him too!

NEW Defibrillator at Quainton Memorial Hall

QMH now has a defibrillator at the hall.

The equipment has been supplied by a charity, London Hearts with a generous 50% donation from Table Tennis England. Thanks go to Jim Styles and Quainton Table Tennis Club and Table tennis England for arranging this. The defibrillator is currently inside the hall in the entrance. But there are plans to apply for funding for a cabinet so it can be installed outside making it available at all times, not just when the hall is open and in use.

REMEMBER: In case of an emergency, dial 999 for the ambulance service. The operators will explain how to use it. In addition, instructions will be displayed on a panel as soon as the defibrillator case is opened.

The last Ordinary Meeting of the Council was on 1st September. We were supposed to meet again on 15th September, however due to the sad news of HM Queen Elizabeth II passing, we had to cancel or postpone any public facing meetings during the mourning period.

Next meeting: Thursday 13th October at 7:30pm in the Memorial Hall.

This will be an Ordinary Meeting of the Council. Parishioners are invited to attend.

SKATEPARK: THE SKATEPARK IS STILL CLOSED!! Due to prolonged illness of the technician we're looking to find someone else to come and fix the skatepark.

We reiterate that if anything happens to people using the skatepark whilst it is out of service you are NOT covered by the Parish Council insurance. We do need to move along with the redesign and set up a working group to carry out the design and fundraising. If you're interested to help build the next Quainton Skatepark and perhaps a MUGA, please join the group: https://www.facebook.com/groups/996917390903081/ there's a post up with possible dates to meet before October Half Term.

THE GEORGE & DRAGON PUB: The Steering Committee are meeting on a weekly basis and progress is being made to formulate a business plan. Meetings are ongoing. If you wish to be on the email list or get involved, please send an email to the CAG email address: pub.info@quainton.org.uk There will also be updates on the website: www.quainton.org.uk/action-group-george-and-dragon and on the Facebook Page: https://www.facebook.com/GeorgeAndDragonCAG

CHOW: The grant application to Haddenham & Waddesdon Community Board for a strimmer and a notice board have been declined. They expect the Parish Council to put money towards this. We're looking into how we can find this. Apple pressing day will be held on 24th September, which we hope will raise some more much needed funds. Follow progress on CHOW and offer your help and support via https://www.facebook.com/groups/321040946212772

PLANNING: There are a handful of new planning allocations that came in last week, We're reviewing these and will make comments, which is likely to happen before the next meeting.

ROADS: We continue to report issues with our roads on FixMyStreet and follow up Buckinghamshire Council on our list of roads that needs repairs. Please keep reporting and let us know if there are concerns.

BUS SERVICE: We still don't know if Red Rose will keep the contract. We carry on campaigning for our bus services to be improved. Meanwhile, the Quainton Emergency Team is available to help people get to appointments. The bus time table can be found here: https://www.buckscc.gov.uk/media/4518148/16-red-rose-travel-may-2022.pdf

THE BRIDGE: Station Road Bridge is to be replaced, like for like, we're waiting for the design to go to consultation. Network Rail are expecting to take down the old bridge in June/July 2023 and then build the new bridge. Station Road will need to be closed whilst works are carried out. The working assumption is that the bridge will be replaced by November 2023.

HS2/EKFB: The frustration and tension around HS2 is palpable. We are now involved in a big consultation meeting about the works that are going on, they're finally including us in discussions!

We need your help to get the message out.

EKFB have suggested that their Mobile Information Centre events were very well received and people were very positive about the work that HS2/EKFB are doing. We've told them half the village isn't receiving their communications, we checked several streets and it's hit and mis who receives the Advance Warning Notices on road closures. We've complained about the plethora of road signs that obstruct and confuse road users, we tell them about complaints we receive about noise and light pollution, etc, etc. They clearly aren't listening and they're absolutely NOT seeing the frustration that people express on social media.





Katherine Richardson was at Royal Ascot on Ladies Day on 16th June 2016. "The highlight of the day was watching the Queen go past in a horse drawn carriage with Prince Phillip. Was a goosebump moment!"

Nick Ridley: "I had the privilege of photographing the Queen during the Retriever Championships at Windsor Great Park in 2007. She was passionate about her fieldsports, and her gundogs in particular – something the mainstream media seemed to gloss over! She held the championships for both spaniels and retrievers at Sandringham and Windsor on numerous occasions and always came out to watch."



A new Champion - Di Roberts



Di's continuing improvement provided a 6lb 2oz onion and she generously donated some of her prize money towards buying next year's seeds and compost and thanked Bob and Ruth for continuing to run the competition. Nine lifters improved on their last year's weights, including Tony's second with 6lbs and Dave Raynor third with 5lbs 8oz. There was a consolation for Tony at the following Annual Village Show where 3 of his onions not only won the class for big onions but won the cup for the best vegetable exhibit. The two 'newbies', Dawn and Fiona, had very creditable first attempts and could be future contenders. In total there were 27 entries with 6 'no lifts', up from 3 last year. Bill Brooks would have been in contention for the pickling onion but the lifting team were unable to see his onion and Martin Dorrell had the dubious distinction with 1lb 2.5 oz. Debbie Bragg retained the Endeavour Salver, down last year's 4lb 10oz but with a still very solid 4lb 4oz The mixed results maybe indication of another very difficult growing season, although Sue and Theo being 5oz down may have been due to the onions losing their battle with the courgettes.


