#### WELCOME FROM HOLY CROSS & ST MARY'S CHURCH



Dear Friends,

There's no doubt about it, we are living in uncertain times. Blaise Metreweli, the newly appointed head of MI6, the Secret Intelligence Service, said in her first major public speech on 15th December, "Let's be in no doubt. Our world is more dangerous and contested now than it has been for decades. Conflict is evolving and trust eroding..." highlighting the broad shift in global security challenges.

As we enter 2026, there will be new challenges, new opportunities and the usual ups and downs of life. What we

should not do however, is live in fear. There is a lovely verse in the Bible that goes like this: "Perfect love casts out fear," 1 John 4:18. It is in finding and dwelling in the secure love of God that we find security, hope, fulfilment and purpose. Without God in our lives, we live in a vacuum of hopelessness, insecurity and ultimately, despair because we are simply travelling into a black hole of nothingness. Wow! That's heavy – but true.

C. S. Lewis (1898–1963) was a scholar, literary critic, philosopher, and writer, and in his brilliant book "The Great Divorce," in which he argues for the authenticity of the Bible and Christian faith, he says, "There are only two kinds of people in the end: Those who say to God, 'Thy will be done,' and those to whom God says, in the end, 'thy will be done.'

You may remember that in October 2024, fifty of us gathered on Mill Hill, lit a bonfire and blew a shofar (ram's horn) as we pronounced God's blessing on Quainton and all the villages around us in preparation for 2025, a year of hope. We were following the ancient Biblical tradition of Jubilee – historically, God's call to celebrate service, sharing, peace and hope. And last year that's exactly what we tried to do in a variety of ways.

This new year of 2026, we are celebrating "A Year Of Light", when we will explore ways of shining a light in the darkness of despair and hopelessness and find ways of bringing love, practical support and hope into the lives of the many people with whom we have contact day by day.

Will you join us? Some people say to me, 'you don't have to go to church to be a Christian.' I profoundly disagree. God never made us to be free lance Christians. We were made for community, or as the Bible describes it, to be 'the body of Christ,' part of the family of God. Christianity without church is like a Fish Out Of Water. A great album title by Chris Squire, bassist with one of my favourite bands, YES, but no way to nurture faith, grow in community and share the adventure of faith together.

May you know real blessing this year as you step out in faith.

#### Does anyone know of a link between Isaac Newton and our church?

I have been asked to write a piece about the link between Sir Isaac Newton and the Church of England here in Quainton. I am interested to hear from anybody who has any information, fact or anecdotal, about such a link. The story so far...

The Reverend Jeffrey Elkins was the local vicar from 1732 to 1765. He was the executor to Lady Lymington, to whom he was related. Her mother was the nearest relation to Newton when he died and inherited his estate, which included manuscripts and writings. When the Rev Elkins died in 1773, these papers passed to his son who was then our local vicar. The linen-fold carved chest/coffer in the church belonged to him. A lockable-coffer like this would have been the equivalent of a safe in those days and may have stored valuables such as the Newton papers. It was most likely located in the rectory at that time. In 1882, the Ekins family bequeathed the papers to New College, Oxford.

#### The Chairman's Report:

Dear Residents,

I hope you had a relaxing and restful Christmas and May I wish you a very Happy New Year ahead for 2026.

I firstly wanted to highlight to you that the Parish Council will now no longer be known as Quainton Parish Council. It was resolved

at full council that from the 10th of December the council henceforth will be known as Quainton Rural Community Council and your parish councillors will now be known as Community Councillors. This is a push in the direction of modernity and a fresh look on the council's work. We want to be inclusive and move away from the parochial sense. This was backed by council, and we have now started the legal process with Buckinghamshire County Council to official change our name. This comes alongside our work to launch a new refreshed website which improves on our accessibility and our facilities. So, from now on the Council will now be styled as Quainton Rural Community Council (QRCC).

The 4-year plan for Quainton has now been officially approved; this remains and active and open document which can adapt to the needs of the community if there is further appetite to change the direction of the Community Council if necessary. There are a range of community projects that are laid before us, and a more digestible document will be published shortly with a leaflet hitting your doorsteps/mailboxes in February. Anyone wishing to see the full 29-page document, please contact the clerk who can provide a digital/printed version.

The council is also now in the process of putting together the Budget for 2026/27 financial year. Changes to your precept charge will be communicated with you through your Buckinghamshire County Council Tax Bill. Currently a typical Band D household in Quainton pays £48.32 annually to the Community Council (Formerly Parish Council). This equates to 92p a week. Due to a no real terms increase in funding for devolved services from Buckinghamshire County Council and further costs rising inline or faster than inflation, the position of the Community Council would be that it will be unlikely that we will freeze our precept this year again and that in fact decisions will have to be made that may see an increase in that precept. However, all this will be communicated to you once we have finalised our budget for the next financial year.

As many of you will have seen in the local press or on social media, that Buckinghamshire & Milton Keynes Fire Authority are currently going through their on-call Improvement Programme consultation. As chair of the community council, I announced my support for the recommendations made by the fire authority in a statement made at full council on the 10th of December. QRCC will now consider the information and data provided in the consultation and will submit their consultation before the deadline in January. This is a full council decision like any normal consultation, so the onus is on all councillors to read and come to a final view before submission.

As outlined in my statement to full council and of which I will iterate here – I am disappointed this has been used as a political football and I hope that those who have used it as such reflect on the inflammatory language used and comes to the table to negotiate a fair deal for all residents.

We are as a council still needing to fill a vacancy for community councillor on the QRCC. If you want to the serve the community of Quainton and our rural clusters, do come forward, we are at an exciting time in our history and would welcome new faces to our community council. As a reminder you will need to:

- At least be 18 years old on the date of co-option.
- A British citizen, an eligible Commonwealth citizen, a citizen of the Republic of Ireland, or an EU citizen with retained rights.
- Your name is on the local government register (electoral roll) for Quainton.
- You don't need specific qualifications, just a passion for your community and a willingness to contribute.

#### **QGS Garden Tips for January**

#### **Pruning & Plant Care**

- Prune apple and pear trees while they're dormant to encourage healthy growth later.
- Cut back gooseberries and currants, leaving three buds on side shoots.
- Remove old hellebore leaves with black blotches to prevent disease.
- Continue pruning climbing roses while they rest.

#### Planting & Growing

- Plant bare-root roses, shrubs, hedging, and fruit trees if the ground isn't frozen.
- Establish new colonies of snowdrops and hellebores by planting them in flower now.
- Sow broad beans, onions, and early lettuce under cover for a head start.

#### **Garden Maintenance**

- Clear away collapsed perennial stems and compost them.
- Tidy lawns and paths by removing fallen leaves.
- Repair fences, trellises, and raised beds while growth is slow.
- Clean pots, seed trays, and tools ready for spring.

#### Soil & Planning

- Add well-rotted manure or compost to improve soil health.
- Mulch beds to protect soil structure and cover bare soil.
- Sort seeds, discard old packets, and plan your crop rotation for the year.
- Order seed potatoes, onions, shallots, and garlic bulbs for spring planting.

#### Ramblings from Finemere Wood by Charlotte Karmali, Volunteer Warden

As another year draws to an end, the woodland workers gather in the ancient meadow in the heart of Finemere Wood to celebrate a year of hard work, fun, and friendship. It is a mild day, and the sun shines brightly as a bonfire is carefully constructed. The only task that is essential today is to produce a fire with fiery embers, in which potatoes can be cooked to perfection, our Christmas tradition.



Fortunately, amongst us are many who delight in

playing with fire. There is something primal about it: coaxing it into life, tending to its every need. It requires a quiet, mindful focus, clearing the mind of all other thoughts.

A robin sings above the crackling fire, its winter song so beautiful: soft, wistful, and a little mournful. This iconic bird sings all year round, its tone changing with the seasons – from mellow and soothing during the cold months, when testosterone levels are low, to powerful and vibrant in the summer.

Robins have autumn and winter territories, which are protected ferociously by a single bird. It is about individual survival, securing resources, food, and shelter. In summer, their territory expands as a pair of birds defends their breeding territory assertively

I love the sparkle and togetherness that Christmas brings, but it is a poignant time too, as we remember those we have loved and lost. Folklore holds that the robin is a spiritual messenger, hence the saying, "When a robin appears, a loved one is near." I, for one, find this comforting and grounding. A robin watches as I tend my garden or sings while I work in the woods, and in those moments, I feel my deceased father's presence deeply.

With ruddy, sooty faces, the caretakers of the fire extract our lunch from the red-hot embers. There is nothing like a potato baked in a bonfire; it is simply delicious, and this year they were the best yet.




#### Construction works updates

We were delighted to witness the installation of the first steel bridge on our 50-mile stretch of construction works at the Waddesdon Greenway on December 3. During the 45-minute lift of the 40m structure, we spoke to a number of local cyclists and pedestrians using the temporary alignment who were all looking forward to the bridge being open for public use next Summer.

Progress on all other structures, roads and earthworks has continued at pace during November and December.

The 880m long Thame Valley Viaduct, which will carry HS2 across the River Thame now has almost 65% of the concrete deck poured and 291 of the 716 concrete parapet sections that form the barriers have now been installed.

The permanent road signage installation on the A41 started in October, with many of the new signs being erected. The remaining signage will be completed in January 2026.



In the north of Waddesdon, reinforcement works for the wing wall slab for the WAD/4 footpath crossing have been cast (currently closed as it crosses our construction site), whilst top soiling of the Bicester Road West Embankment continued during November.

#### **EKFB** Christmas shut down

All EKFB sites will close from Friday 19 December 2025 and reopen on Monday 5 January 2026. Some site offices will remain open until Wednesday 24 December, including the A41 near Fleet Marston. A limited amount of activity will still take place such as, servicing of vehicles and machinery, rainwater storage management, office cleaning and security patrols.

#### Upcoming and ongoing works

- The Grendon Underwood Public Right of Way (GUN 28) will remain open every Sunday as follows: 1 October to 31 March 8am to 4pm, and 1 April to 30 September 8am to 7pm.
- Station Road South, closure in place to enable works for the western tie-in to the new alignment 20 October 2025 - 31 May 2026. Cont'd overleaf

- Station Road North, 2-way lights in place to safely manage the traffic flow and will continue until the realignment of the new road opens on 31 May 2026.
- The closure on Shipton Lee to enable the alignment of the new road over the new Edgcott Road overbridge will be completed by end April 2026.
- Fiddlers Field will remain closed until the new Station Road re-alignment opens on 31 May 2026.
- In the Waddesdon area, there will be series of overnight road closures from Monday 12 January to Saturday 17 January 2026 for the completion of permanent signage installation works on the A41. The new A41 Bicester Road, the old narrowed section of Bicester Road and a small section of Blackgrove Road will be closed. Dates for these works are to be confirmed.

Please check the HS2 website for regular updates and note that dates for planned works may change.

#### **Community Engagement activities**

The final community drop in events for 2025 were held during November, at Edgcott and Grendon Underwood village halls, The Railway Club in Aylesbury and a coffee morning at Twyford.
