Welcome from Holy Cross & St Mary's Church



Dear friends,

One of the most moving images coming out of that extraordinary funeral service of HRH Prince Philip, the Duke of Edinburgh, was the solitary figure of Her Majesty the Queen. The Covid-19 restrictions have touched all of us in different ways, none has been left unscared or unaffected. We are very fortunate in our village to live off the beaten track, with such a caring community around us and with local facilities near at hand. But we are still under the same rules as everybody else, as are the Royal Family.

We have asked the question before, but now, as we slowly come out of lockdown, the question is even more pertinent: what have we learnt from this last year and will we live any differently as a result?

An anthropologist showed a game to the children of an African tribe.

He placed a basket of delicious fruits near a tree trunk and told them that the first child to reach the tree would get the basket. When he gave them the start signal, he was surprised that they were walking together, holding hands until they reached the tree and shared the fruit!

When he asked them why they did that, when every one of them could have got the basket for themselves, they answered with astonishment, "Ubuntu". "How can one of us be happy while the rest are miserable?" Ubuntu in their community means, "I am because we are".

In the Western world, this kind of attitude is harder to find. At least it was, until the year of the pandemic. In countless situations across our nation and the world, people have been rising to the occasion and offering practical help to their neighbour.

Most religions use what is known as "The Golden Rule": "Do not do to others what you would not want them to do to you." Jesus was one of the few spiritual leaders who turned the Golden Rule on its head, reversing the meaning from a negative, "Do not do...." To a positive, "Do to others what you would have them do for you."

I find it interesting that there seems to be a God-shaped hole in our lives, and this gives us something unique as humans made in the image of God. The ability to know right from wrong, to know the difference between love and hatred and to gravitate towards living out The Golden Rule, especially when those around us are in need of some tender, loving care.

We re-open our church for services on Pentecost Sunday, May 23rd at 6.00pm.



Covid-19 Update: Roadmap out of Lockdown Continues!

The next relaxation of lockdown restrictions is **Stage Three** - due no earlier than **17**th **May** - when it's hoped:

- People can meet in groups of up to 30 outdoors
- Six people or two households can meet indoors
- Domestic overnight stays allowed with people not in your household or bubble
- Pubs, restaurants and other hospitality venues can seat customers indoors
- Up to 30 people can attend weddings or other life events, like christenings
- Remaining outdoor entertainment, such as outdoor theatres and cinemas can open
- Indoor entertainment such as museums, theatres, cinemas and children's play areas can open
- Performances and large events can restart, but with limits on audience numbers
- Hotels, hostels and B&Bs can reopen
- International leisure travel may resume
- Adult indoor group sports and exercise classes can restart

Please wait to hear the next announcement from the Government before moving to Stage Three restrictions!

The Chairman Reports:

New Parish Council: You will surely have heard that when applications closed on April 8th it was revealed that five of the exiting council were standing down and, regrettably, only three people had put their names forward for the seven vacancies. Two, Nick Butler and John Knox, were from the existing council and one new name, Nicolette Smith from North End Lodge. Three being the number required to make a quorum this means these three may now co-opt up to four others to bring the Council up to full strength. Any interested and eligible individuals (electors resident in parish for previous 12 months or tenant of land/premises therein for past 12 months, or a person living within 3 direct miles of the parish or having their principal place of work in the parish) should notify the Clerk of their interest, so they may be asked for fuller information such as relevant experience, if any, existing contributions to, or interests in, community life, familiarity with online communication, and other skills considered helpful. There is plenty of work to do so please seriously consider coming forward to ensure that your Council continues to function effectively in representing all interests, and ensuring that Quainton remains a desirable village where people feel welcomed and secure.

Traffic calming: Initial training on the use and retrieval of data from our SID has now been received by a small number of volunteers. We still await HS2's placement of poles on which to position the equipment in approved additional places than just the one existing by our School. We have received apologies for the delay, said to be caused by essential work being behind schedule. It is also still intended to acquire a second SID and to continue with Speedwatch which we have just been notified that we are permitted to use again. Of course, such measures depend on how many come forward to volunteer. Presently there is a great shortage of such people. You only need common sense, a spare hour every few weeks, and a desire to make the village a safer place. Doesn't that cover everyone?

Planning Matters: New applications: a non-illuminated sign for the Village Store to go next to the present G&D sign at the bottom of The Green; garage and single storey side extension at 77 Station Rd; single storey side and rear extensions at 12 Church St, which has aroused concern about the possible effect on the neighbouring residence; and a dwelling on the former Station Rd Farm, where there are concerns about the extent of hard surfacing planned, the future of the paddock and consequent lack of green space.

Neighbourhood Plan Please do not tire of this subject. If you wish Quainton to retain its individualism and rural attractiveness this is your main tool for the future. As a consequence of Bucks County and residents' comments changes have been made. Now a Strategic Environmental Assessment of the plan has to be made by Bucks before it can be endorsed by the Parish Council – hopefully by the end of May. Many, many thanks again to the compilers' diligence and patience.

The New Estate to the rear of 151 Station Road will have 40 residences, 22 on Clifford Road and 18 on Romney Lane. Consultation over street lighting there should result in light pollution and active hours being in line with the rest of the village and have limited effect on neighbouring properties.

Changes to route of Station Road Without prior consultation the placement of the proposed spur road leading into the cul de sac has been changed so that fewer properties than originally planned will now be in the cul de sac. It is also apparent that when arriving at Station Road crossroads from Waddesdon direction you will have to turn left for a short distance before turning right towards the diverted Station Road which will then run north of the Hatchery over an elevated section before returning to the present Station Road. We would like to show you a large-scale map but so far have only received a series of slides. The need for a footpath along these new stretches of road and a 30mph limit has been underlined.

New Prison The Ministry of Justice continue to cogitate over responses to their proposals before deciding whether to take the next step of making a formal planning application. Beware - this is exactly how would be planners tire you out.

Defibrillators: A resident recently made us think for a moment when asking how to acquire the code needed to access either the one on the School or at the Railway Centre. Recalling training given to us prior to installation it was stressed that most important is to start CPR immediately and continue while a second person phones 999, whereupon an ambulance will immediately be despatched and the necessary code given to enable the second person to access the defib equipment. Step by step instructions on its operation will then be received but immediate CPR is the priority. Many thanks to the questioning resident who has thus provided us all with this opportunity to be re-alerted as to how we might save a life.

Road Closures: The advertised closure of Snake Lane is now delayed, with no new dates given yet. Never assume a local journey will be obstruction free. The prolonged closure of Station Road is deplorable.

The Beacon: What a welter of emails was received on this subject. Understandably, there were many requesting the Beacon be lit in gratitude and respect for the life of the Duke of Edinburgh. Thank you for understanding this was a worthy idea but in conflict with protocols we had received and the wishes of the deceased and his family. With regards to the Beacon being left permanently in its position on Mill Hill, this would contravene its certificate of lawfulness. It had only remained in position until Covid regulations permitted the necessarily-sized team to meet and remove it. This was planned for April 17th but was deferred for a week so as not to coincide with the Duke's funeral. The new PC will decide whether to support an application to Buckinghamshire Council for the Beacon to be permanently placed.

Dogs in the Play Area: Dogs are not allowed in the play area on Upper St; notices are clearly displayed. **Water leak in Upper Street:** After six frustrating weeks of being passed between and around Thames Water and Vale of Aylesbury Housing Trust, the latter finally accepted they were the cause and promised

a repair team. When you read this the promise will hopefully have been fulfilled but......?

Grass cutting: Apologies that information regarding the date for our new contractor's visits was later changed. We have now been informed that verges and other public roadside areas will be cut on the third Monday of the month, commencing on 19th April.

The verge opposite the main gate to the Church by Brudenell House has become an eyesore owing to extended vehicle usage in wet weather. The PC wishes to see this area re-grassed but also wants its use as convenient car parking to continue, a challenging compromise to achieve.

Footpaths: Volunteers have offered to improve the junction where three paths meet at the kissing gate to the rear of 44 North End. A new metal kissing gate will be installed and the surface rebuilt. The same group, to whom we are very grateful, aim to improve access to Mill Hill from the 'Goosey Gander' path running between 10 and 12 Upper St, so have fenced off the spring which causes frequent boggy conditions. The wooden sleepers will be renewed. The new paddock in the field behind Bones Close was sited sensitively and sensibly to avoid the well-used line of the footpath running between Bones Close and Mill Hill but has led to questions about the actual placement of the path as shown on the definitive map.

Traffic Lights: There is barely a local road without these features. It was particularly galling to find them on the A41, at its junction with Station Road, with absolutely no work being done on the main road to justify such obstruction. East West Rail construction at Calvert and neighbouring villages has led to further traffic light hold ups and, to be cynical, more hard-hatted, orange clad adults standing around ostensibly consulting one another. The frequent breakdown of our four phased system at Berryfield Crossroads, when all lights have been stuck on red, has led to frustration and greater danger than if the junction was left as normal. The powers that be refuse to remove them, insisting that the lights are regularly checked at two hour intervals, something no one believes.

Next Parish Council Meeting is scheduled for Thursday 13th May, at 8pm. Presently further online meetings are not permitted so this should be a face-to-face meeting in the committee room of the Memorial Hall, with due respect paid to whatever requirements Covid restrictions demand. The new councillors will be required to formally take up office and to elect their Chair.

A Personal Farewell from me in gratitude for your friendship, support and good humour. It has been a great honour to be on the Council. How lucky to be housed in Quainton, all those 51 years ago, among such affable people. Thank you to all who care about the village, organise clubs and activities, use its businesses and facilities and show genuine concern for all residents. Please keep going.





News from Quainton School

I am pleased to say we have finally received the results of Ofsted's recent remote monitoring inspection of Quainton Church of England School that occurred on March 16th 2021. As the report states, this is an additional inspection as part of the normal Ofsted cycle. It does not result in a traditional grading (i.e. requires improvement, good, outstanding) but



instead states whether the school is taking effective action to provide education in the current circumstances or not taking effective action. I am very happy to say that the opinion of the inspectors is that we are taking effective action. The inspection was a positive and fair experience. The inspectors themselves stated that it is hard to get across all the positives that came from the day. For example, the results of the staff survey showed 100% support in the leadership of the school, in Ofsted's own words this is 'virtually unheard of'. In addition, the results of the parents' survey were overwhelmingly favourable to the school and all that we are trying to achieve, again this exceeded the normal expectations from comparable surveys. These survey results show the fantastic support we have, therefore allowing us to focus on the improvements needed. I would like to thank all staff and parents for their feedback and support.

A review from 'An enthusiastic resident' who emailed the Editor:

"Should you ever find yourself in the village on a Wednesday morning with a free moment, I highly recommend a visit to The Rolling Oats van which will be parked in the car park of the Memorial Hall between 9.45 and 11.15 every week. As a local resident, I had not visited before and was given a warm welcome by Millery, who, together with Chris, has cleverly converted a van into a mobile treasure trove of food stuffs. The idea is to reduce packaging, so all dry goods are weighed out to your specification into brown paper bags and liquids decanted into bottles you bring with you. My haul on Wednesday included delicious English breakfast loose leaf tea, a bag of coffee beans (these can be ground by prior arrangement I believe), rice, pasta, sea salt, whole almonds, shampoo and conditioner and laundry liquid. Lots more items are available and all of it is carefully sourced and beautifully presented. My view is that we are so lucky to have yet another great business in the village in addition to the two fabulous shops we have already and I wanted to share this discovery with you."

UPDATE FROM GRENDON UNDERWOOD AND EDGCOTT PARISH COUNCILS

The consultation period ended on 5th February 2021

We have recently been informed by the Ministry of Justice (MoJ) that in order to fully consider responses received during the public consultation period, they have taken a decision not to submit an Outline Planning Application (OPA) at this time whilst they review the consultation responses in more detail. This is a great outcome as the MoJ was originally planning to submit an OPA in mid-February.

However, this does not mean that an OPA will not be submitted so the fight goes on!

Across the eight-week consultation period there were 3,734 online submissions alongside 70 emails and 6 written responses. This is a total of 3,810 submissions, and includes comments from a range of local Parish Councils, Buckinghamshire Council and the Member of Parliament for Buckingham. 1,147 submissions were from a postcode within Buckinghamshire, with the remainder coming from postcodes located across the UK or without an address. This was a fantastic response bearing in mind the Christmas and New Year distractions and the lockdown difficulties.

The MoJ recently met with Bucks Council and stated that further surveys, e.g. on great crested newts and some infrastructure investigations, would take place prior to any final decision being made on whether or not to submit an OPA. However, we have to assume that an OPA will be submitted and the best estimate we have of the timing of a submission at the moment is mid-end May.

The Grendon Underwood and Edgcott Parish Council's Joint Working Committee has continued to work on the strategy for dealing with an OPA. Along with input from our MP, Councillors and other residents, some with expertise and insight into planning matters and new prison projects, a wide range of activities have been ongoing including:

NO, NO NO!!!

- A number of Freedom of Information requests have been made to the MoJ and other Local Authorities to gather information related to such matters as site selection justification and other sites assessed in addition to Grendon Underwood
- Communications with the Planning Department at Bucks Council to highlight failings of the MoJ and emphasise the recent rejection, at appeal, to plans for residential accommodation on the field just inside the prison gates (rejected for the same issues that the new prison would bring to the area)
- Communication with the MoJ to challenge them on a range of issues
- Literature review on the impact of light and noise on wildlife to emphasise the damage the new prison development would inflict on wildlife in the locality
- Gathering information, facts and figures on other prisons in the South East including the post code, prior to sentencing, of inmates in prisons located nearby and details to refute claims made by the MoJ
- Landscape photographs of the prison site from a wide range of positions which have been marked onto a map
- · Photographs of the wildlife areas in and around the prison site
- Photographs of standing water in and around the prison site as well as of flooded ditches and footpaths
- Photographs of the very narrow footpaths both in Edgcott and on the route to Grendon Underwood plus their poor condition
- Further correspondence is planned with different parties to emphasise both the current and past mis-management by the MoJ
- Collating data gathered to date so it is in an easy to read and accessible format for residents to use in their objections

The Working Party Committee will keep you informed and should an OPA be submitted then you will be advised of the objection procedure and the strongest and most relevant planning matters on which to object. This will be a very critical part of the campaign against the new prison.

Thank you all for your time and effort in submitting your comments at the consultation stage and a similar response at the planning stage will hopefully result in an application being refused.

Did you know that scams cost the UK economy between £5 – 10 billion pounds a year, with only 5% of them being reported? 53% of people over 65 years old have been targeted by scams.

There are 4 main types of scam: postal, telephone, doorstep and online scams. Recent examples have included those related to council tax rebates, personal protective equipment and vaccines for COVID-19, fake lottery wins and scam phones calls pretending to be from HMRC, Amazon or similar.

You can protect yourself and others by following these 5 tips:

- * Be sceptical, don't be afraid to hang up, bin it, delete it or shut the door
- * Never disclose your personal or bank details
- * Don't assume everyone is genuine
- * Take your time, don't be rushed into making decisions
- Stay in control

If you receive lots of nuisance phone calls, we can help stop this. Buckinghamshire and Surrey Trading Standards are offering free call blocking devices to all eligible residents. The device plugs into your landline and works with your existing phone. It is programmed with your known contacts and allows other trusted organisations (e.g. GP) to get through via a filtering system. All other nuisance calls are then blocked.

To help you feel more empowered on your doorstep to say no to unwanted knocks on your door, we have free 'No Cold Calling' stickers that you can display. Other residents have found that they act as a deterrent to unwanted traders.

relatively new member of the group, cheerfully and effortlessly found her niche in the well-established team. And thus, another unique and vital piece of the Finemere volunteer jigsaw puzzle is slotted into place.

Working in the pharmaceutical industry for many years, Jacqui managed and directed global clinical research projects, which entailed a great deal of travel. Her focus latterly was upon cancer treatments where it was hugely rewarding when a drug was finally approved and released to patients. Having had a lifelong passion for conservation and wildlife, with childhood heroes Diane Fossey, Jane Goodall and Peter Scott inspiring her interest, Jacqui often thought she should have pursued a career in the outdoors with nature. Now, early retirement has



Enabled her to immerse herself in this world. Becoming a BBOWT member led Jacqui to my blogs, and thus she decided to join the Finemere workers. Here she enjoys being part of a team whilst benefitting from fresh air, exercise and nature as she learns about managing woodland.

Photography is another love of Jacqui's, and very good at it she is too! Involved with the Amersham Photographic Society, this talented woman seeks out photography exhibitions and courses wherever she can. Nature, wildlife and landscape, being her genre, have led her to extraordinary places, such as the Tatra mountains of Slovakia to photograph wild brown bear. An ambition to photograph the brown hare may be realised nearer to home, as they can be spotted out on the Finemere meadows. Quite an artist too, Jacqui spends many a happy hour visiting galleries and enjoying the splendours of city life with her two London-based daughters.

Favourite Finemere species? The Marbled White butterfly and the Scarlet Elf Cup fungus. Favourite Finemere activities? Chatting to fellow volunteers over coffee and cake (in those bygone pre-Covid days when we could share food); gathering seeds from wildflowers and spreading them around the site; cleaning the algae-ridden information signs (at last! I have been waiting for a volunteer like this) and securing deer fences. And it just so happens that at this first Finemere gathering of the year, many of these activities were on offer. Areas cleared of scrub in the Autumn must be fenced in to protect new growth from the munching of deer; signs need a good scrubbing and much chatter is clearly essential.

Jacqui volunteers regularly in a variety of other settings, for BBOWT's Hedgerow Havens project and in a Rennie Grove charity shop, where the team were honoured to receive the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service some years ago. Her most favourite volunteering activity was as a Games Maker at the 2012 Olympic Games in London, which involved meeting and greeting, checking tickets and crowd management. It was a great experience and she didn't want it to end.

Now she has Finemere, which will never end, not that it's a competition, I'm just saying...
