
Hello everyone,





The last Ordinary Meeting of the Council was on 14th July. The meeting in August was cancelled as many Cllrs were unable to attend and we might not make quorum to make any decisions.

Next meeting: Thursday 1st September at 7:30pm in the Memorial Hall. This will be an Ordinary Meeting of the Council. Parishioners are invited to attend.

SKATEPARK: THE SKATEPARK IS STILL CLOSED!! We had arranged for a repair to be carried out in July, but due to the first heatwave the technician couldn't carry out the work. Sadly he has since been unwell and we are hoping he will soon be able to come and fix the skatepark. We reiterate that if anything happens to people using the skatepark whilst it is out of service you are NOT covered by the Parish Council insurance. We do need to move along with the redesign and set up a working group to carry out the design and fundraising. THE GEORGE & DRAGON PUB: After the last publication of QN we held the community meeting about the George & Dragon Pub. As a result a Community Action Group was formed and the Steering Committee have been working hard in the past weeks to put together a business plan and options to raise funds for a Community Pub. The Steering Committee are meeting on a weekly basis and have organised a Community Survey and contacted local breweries and held meetings with Moogies, who run The Black Boy in Oving and also some other Community Pubs. Meetings are ongoing and emails are being sent out to anyone who has indicated they wanted to be kept informed. CHOW: A wildflower audit took place in July. Volunteers have been digging up ragwort in August, and cracks in the ground around the young trees have been filled with soil and extra mulching has taken place. A local farmer has lent the group a water bowser so they can water the trees. The group was given a lawn mower by a generous resident. A grant application to Haddenham & Waddesdon Community Board has gone in for a strimmer and a notice board. One of the group members is holding a monthly bee walk. Another apple pressing day is being organised in September. The meadow is due to be cut soon. SPEED WATCH: our two HS2 funding applications for a sentinel and for the work to site the poles for the SIDs have been approved, this means we can now engage the contractors to carry out the works to put the poles for the SIDs in the ground and purchase the sentinel for the Speed Watch Group.

PLANNING: The modified Quainton Neighbourhood Plan has been made and is now officially in place. At our meeting last month we only had a Variation of Condition 2 (Plans) relating to 15/04276/APP erection of 13 houses on land south west of 62 Station Road. The Council did not have any objections as it is not a huge change to the overall design on the initial planning application and parking is proficient and meets the new QNP and we have noted and reiterates that the existing hedges are to remain in place.

ROADS: We continue to report issues with our roads on FixMyStreet and follow up Buckinghamshire Council on our list of roads that needs repairs this ranges from potholes to damaged kerbs, damaged drains to bollards and traffic signs, as well as the issues with heavy traffic coming through the village.

BUS SERVICE: we're still receiving complaints. Once we know who will be running the service, we can carry on campaigning for our bus services to be improved. Some positive news about the buses in the section about the Station Road bridge. Meanwhile, the Quainton Emergency Team is available to help people get to appointments. The bus time table can be found here: https://www.buckscc.gov.uk/media/4518148/16-red-rose-travel-may-2022.pdf

THE BRIDGE: We have some potential success in the case for the bridge on Station Road to be repaired or replaced, so we can get the weight limit lifted and get Station Road reopened. We have been informed that Buckinghamshire Council and Network Rail are communicating about when exactly Network Rail will be repairing the bridge. In order for this work to take place, understandably, Station Road will need to be closed whilst works are carried out. This will likely take place in conjunction with when HS2 create their haul road crossing over Station Road, which is to be sited between the bridge and the Station Road Junction. Once the bridge is repaired, the weight limit should be lifted and this will mean that bus services can resume along Station Road as they were before the weight limit was issued. Nothing has been confirmed for certain at this stage, but the working assumption is that the Bridge may be repaired before the end of 2023.

Station Road Crossroads: Barwood Homes were tasked with installing a Vehicle Activated Light-up Sign. We have informed them of the type of sign we would like to see and hopefully that work will take place soon, pending Buckinghamshire Council approval and HS2 works no doubt.

HS2/EKFB: As part of their continued works in Quainton, EKFB will be constructing the Quainton Railhead this September. Quainton Railhead will begin receiving deliveries from Monday 19 September 2022 through to 2025. Deliveries to the railhead will take place during normal working hours between 8am - 6pm. For reasons of safety, EKFB insist they will be closing a section of Station Road between the bridge and Station Road/ Snake Lane/Quainton Road crossroads. This closure will be to facilitate the construction of the railhead, the movement of aggregate between Quainton and Calvert North as well as junction improvement works to the Station Road cross roads. This section of Station Road they want to be fully closed, 24 hours a day, no emergency services access from September 2022 to Autumn 2023 with a diversion in place, some of this will be the same time as the Station Road Bridge will potentially be repaired or replaced, but has not been confirmed yet. They also want to close Snake Lane for a further two years after the closure of Station Road for over a year. As you can imagine we have had some frustrating meetings with HS2/EKFB about these road closures in and around Quainton.

HS2/EKFB cont'd: Some of these have already taken place between 14 and 19 August, but a major closure of Station Road and Snake Lane are still under consultation with Buckinghamshire Council. We have so far managed to get them to review a potential 3 year closure of that Station Road section from the Railway Centre to the Crossroads. We have made it very clear that this is unacceptable, especially considering that we've been working so hard to get the bridge repaired so we can resume our bus services in and out of the village via Station Road, only for them to try and close Station Road for several years after the bridge repair is to take place. Buckinghamshire Council and Greg Smith MP's office have been involved and have given their commitment to us that they will not allow this to happen and we remain in close contact with the Buckinghamshire Council Cabinet for Transport and their Deputy Cabinet Member Transport (HS2/EWR) to ensure we will not be faced with lengthy road closures that obstruct the flow of traffic for the residents and businesses in and around Quainton. HS2 works have to continue, we can't stop them and by law we shouldn't cause undue delay as stated in the HS2 Act, Schedules 4 and 17, but they do need to consult with and obtain permission and approvals from the local authorities, emergency services and other relevant key stakeholders under Schedule 4 and 17 of the HS2 Act. We shall hold them to that.

EKFB's MOBILE INFO UNIT: have suggested they will visit the village again with their mobile information unit at the Memorial Hall and the Railway Centre. We have requested they come at a time that allows for residents to come in after work or on a weekend if possible.





George & Dragon Update:

As you may have noticed the George and Dragon in Quainton is up for sale. With the support of the Parish Council, a small Steering Group has formed to explore the possibility of community ownership. This would only be as a last resort, and only if no suitable commercial buyer, that can preserve our pub offering all the services that we have enjoyed in the past, can be found.

The aim is to keep the George and Dragon as a key part of our community, with no major changes, with regular hours and, we hope, with regular food!

We are exploring various business models – but in essence members of the community could buy shares and own a stake in the future of the George and Dragon (which continues to be a successful commercial venture). However, it is likely professionals would be hired to manage the day-to-day operations of the pub. This kind of venture has been successfully achieved in many other communities all over the UK.

We've run a survey in the village and there was almost universal support with many pledges of financial support.

The Wildlife Area at The Strand

The small green space alongside The Strand and White Hart Field has been set aside by the Parish Council to encourage wildlife. A resident kindly planted some heritage fruit trees and wildflower seeds and the Parish Council, with the support of Hedgerow Havens and BBOWT, planted mixed hedging and pollinators, plus more wildflower seeds. The Village Society planted a tree and placed a bench on the area. The established trees such as alder, ash and an American Holly add interest and further sources of food and shelter for wildlife.

In a few years the hedging will be established and provide food and shelter for a number of species, as well as providing easy access for wildlife to travel through to other green spaces and gardens as they search for their daily needs. The grass is cut short up to and around the bench but beyond this the grass is left so the wildflowers can grow and flower. Only after the seeds have set is the long grass cut. Having the different grassed areas provides food sources for a wider variety of creatures. There is a mound at the back with sticks and some leaves which could provide shelter and hibernation areas for creatures such as hedgehogs. It is not a compost heap. The Wildlife Area is not designed to look manicured.

Seven Known Windmills in Quainton over the last 600 Years





Quainton Windmill

Tony Diggory and Ian Bragg have worked together to research documents in the Buckinghamshire Museum in Aylesbury dating back to 1580. Below is a brief summary, more details are displayed in Quainton Windmill, open every Sunday morning 10.00 to 12.30 hrs.

See Ref 1. on the above map – 1390 Mill Hill Windmill (SP 741214, its OS map reference). This windmill was recorded in the parish, and mentioned in a title deed, in 1390. The mill would have been located on the top of the hill to the north of the current mill. In 1422 work was needed on the mill and the estimated cost was four shillings and sixpence!

Ref 6. – 1580 Post Mill (SP 715187). The Doddershall Estate map of 1580 shows a Windmill beside Old London Road. It would have been a Post Mill, where the entire body of the building revolves around a vertical post. In 1972 a ditched circular mound remained, 470m south east of Binwell Lane Farmhouse, but this later became the location of a National Grid Gas Compression Station.

Ref 7. – 1630 Post Mill (*SP 731205*). A title deed from May 1630 exists showing the release of land which included a Post Mill and its turning circle. The title deed released "all such land as the Wyndemille in Queynton doth reach, extend, over-reach or encompasse for the turning of the said Mill and Tayle thereof."

Ref 3. – 1797 Blagrove or Banner Mill 1797 (SP 759191). Details are given in an old pocket book covering 1794-1800. It was a Post Mill and was described as the Blagrove Mill, it

took four months to build in 1797. Thomas Anstiss Junior was the miller, it is shown on the 1822 OS map marked as Banner Mill. Sometime later it was moved to Mursley. The mound on which the original mill was built remained, barely perceptible, until July 1983.

Ref 4. – 1798 The Old Mill, or Curtiss Mill (*SP* 471192). (Photo right). This Post Mill stood on a shallow mound in a paddock on the right-hand side of the road going down from the village to the station. It was probably in the field behind 139 Station Road.



In 1798 the miller is listed as Thomas Anstiss, another member of the local milling family. Members of the Curtiss family ran the mill for a number of years including Robert Curtis, said to have been an expert on the weather who could scent the wind coming two or three days beforehand! In 1854 it was advertised for sale, referring to it as "that highly famed old windmill in Quainton Seech Field".

Ref 5. – Unknown Date - Windmill Knob (SP 729192). In the 1930's a mill mound (the "Knob") stood here on Fieldside Farm. At that time the foundations of the structure were still present, and in the past large pieces of stone had been turned up by ploughing. The mound has now been levelled due to ploughing. No information can be found on the age or type of mill located on this site.

Ref 2. – 1832 New Mill or High Mill (SP746203). (Photo right). This is the current Quainton Windmill. This Tower Mill was built by James Anstiss. His family have prior involvement with the Blagrove Mill (Ref 3.) in 1797 and The Old Mill/Curtiss mill (Ref 4.) in 1798. It has remained in the same family since it was built 190 years ago and much of the original equipment remains. It was derelict by the end of the 1890s.


Nick's plan was to introduce Francesca to Mike and Ian Bragg and leave them talking. He then took their dog, Custard, up to third floor, which has the outside Gallery with wonderful views of the village. He tied a bandanna around Custard's neck. 

RAMBLINGS FROM FINEMERE WOOD: Charlotte Karmali, Volunteer Warden

What a summer we are having! Endless hot, dry days, with not a drop of rain in sight. Fields of grass, baked brown to a crisp by the heat of the sun. The clay soil of Finemere Wood, dehydrated and cracked due to lack of water. But the show must go on, and so the volunteers keep plugging away in all but the most extreme of temperatures.



It is the time of year for the annual cutting of the ancient drovers' track. Not only will this prevent encroachment of scrub, but also it will keep dominant plants in check, allowing the more delicate wildflowers to thrive. This is the woodland workers' most special of places. Over the years we have cut back dense scrub and trees to reveal this medieval path; it is a magical place steeped in history.

The shoulder-high grass is brought to the ground with the swish of scythes and the rumble of brushcutters. The cuttings are raked and piled in heaps to the side of the track, creating habitats for many a beast. Buckets of sweat are generated and the volunteers retire, dripping, under the shade of trees for lashings of cake and tea.



There is not much colour in August as most flowers are fading following pollination. This year there is even less colour due to the scalding weather. And so it is a delight to see clumps of golden yellow fleabane scattered throughout the wood. A last burst of colour before summer reaches its conclusion. Despite a liking for marshy, damp areas, this plant is thriving along the dry drovers' track.

Common Fleabane (*Pulicaria dysenterica*) is a member of the daisy family, blooming through August and into September. Growing up to 3 feet high, the flowers reach 15-30mm in diameter. These sun-like flowers attract a variety of pollinators, including lateflying butterflies, such as meadow brown and gatekeeper.

In days gone past, *Pulicaria dysenterica* was used as a treatment for dysentery, as its name might suggest. A close relative of pyrethrum (the active ingredient in pyrethrin insecticide), common fleabane was also used to repel fleas. Bunches of dried flowers were hung in houses to keep these pests away.





Clive Dalzell: former volunteer, master of machines, tractor driver, chainsaw operator and pilot, flew back to the home counties to visit. He treated me to the most magnificent aerial tour of local BBOWT reserves on a beautifully clear and sunny day. Flying over Finemere was the highlight, and it emphasised to me what an oasis the wood is for wildlife, surrounded as it is by HS2 and weather-beaten fields.

HS2 in Quainton

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high-speed railway for Britain. We believe we are building more than a railway. Since Spring we have been completing works within the area, which will eventually lead to the construction of the new Station Road realignment and for the HS2 trace.

One of the next phases of work to be undertaken, is the set up of a railhead area. This will help us deliver aggregate to our work areas the Calvert area and also for the Thame Valley Viaduct. We will be using the disused line, south of Buckinghamshire Railway Centre, which will allow us to receive freight deliveries during our core working hours between 8am - 6pm. The trains will pull into our railhead platform and the aggregate will be offloaded. This material will then be transported along our access road to compounds and stockpile areas. This material will predominantly be used to form the base layers of the new track. We anticipate receiving upwards of 3 million tonnes of material over the course of 3 years. This means the railhead will help take approximately 260,000 deliveries off the local road network.

During the rest of the utility works and our aggregate movements, we need to implement some temporary road closures. These need to be in place due to the safety of all road users because of the proximity to the junction and to the lights on the bridge. We are still in communication with Buckinghamshire Council and Network Rail, however our current proposal has been split into two phases. Phase 1: Closure of a section of Station Road from the crossroads to the bridge, 24 hours a day, for approximately one year from September 19th 2022. Please note: this is subject to Network Rail and their maintenance plans on the bridge.

Phase 2: Closure of Fiddler's Field Road (Snake Lane) from September 2023 to 2025. However, this will be dependent on the completion of Network Rail works on the bridge.


