Dear friends,

There's not much we enjoy on TV these days apart from programmes like Antiques Roadshow, Gardener's World, This Farming Life, and Jamie Oliver! We like the occasional series, like Call The Midwife and Vera. We enjoyed the recent series on Channel 5, The Pennine Adventure, with Dan Walker and Helen Skelton. In fact we enjoy most travel programmes.

However, there are a couple of programmes that we've latched onto of late – Gone Fishing with Paul Whitehouse and Bob Mortimer and Love Your Garden with Alan Titchmarsh.

I'm always on the look-out for illustrations to punctuate my sermons and these two programmes provide plenty!

After a lot of effort and good conversation, Mortimer and Whitehouse catch a fish and then hold it up to the camera for all to be impressed. The poor fish is gulping air and will shortly die because the poor thing is no longer in its natural environment! I often hear people say, "I don't need to go to church to be a Christian." Well, it depends on your definition of "Christian." This word was first used to describe the followers of Jesus Christ living in Antioch (Acts 11:26). They were so serious about their faith, that they regularly gathered together to worship God on the first day of the week – a Sunday – even though it was a normal working day. They did this to remember that it was on the first day of the week that Jesus rose from the dead. There was no such thing as "freelance Christianity." They realised how vital it was to meet together in "church" to worship God, and learn how to be disciples of Jesus.

Mortimer and Whitehouse put their catch back into the water in the nick of time! If you are a Christian, your natural environment, the place where you will thrive, grow and find real meaning and life, is within the community of the church. Try to survive in your faith outside of the church, and, just like the fish, it won't be long before your spiritual life dies away. It doesn't matter what church you are part of, as long as your are part of a God centred, loving community of believers.

Love Your Garden with Alan Titchmarsh can be a real tear jerker! At the end of the programme, when they have transformed someone's garden from a rubbish dump into a stunningly beautiful space, Alan leads the people who will benefit from this transformation into the garden – they have their eyes closed. It's the moment when Alan says, "open your eyes," that gets me going! People, who have often lived challenging lives yet have served their communities and desperately need a beautiful garden, suddenly see something amazing!

For me, this describes what it's like to become a Christian. You see something for the first time and the penny drops! Open your eyes!

Remembering Ann Alcock

In the last issue, I printed details about Ann have gone into a care home. Sadly, the day after it went to print I was informed she had died that day. Peter Harding has since sent me this memory he has of Ann:

There are some small incidents in life that have such an impact that you just don't ever forget them. One of these incidents was when Ann Alcock came and gave me, aged 19 at the time, her motor cycle crash helmet to wear in the 1967 Football Club Pram Race.

Derek Maris and myself had been late entries to the race and had looked around for some fancy dress to wear. For some reason, Ann approached us and gave us the helmets, perhaps we looked under dressed compared to others! However, I am glad that I had the crash helmet on as Derek and I had a shaky start. At the beginning of the race Derek, gave the pram an almighty push and I tipped out onto my head. Luckily, I was able to scramble back into the pram with no injuries and continue with the race. I was so pleased I had the helmet on.

The pram race started at the top of Station Road. At the Sportsman Inn, we swapped roles but had to drink a pint of beer before setting off to the White Hart pub. Derek pushed me to the George & Dragon, where we swapped over for me to push the pram up The Green, along Upper Street and to the Swan & Castle. I have to admit that I struggled with this leg of the race, but Derek was vitalised. From the Swan & Castle to the finish at the junction with Station Road, we flew along Lower Street. Derek went so fast on the flat, I was scared we might have an accident, and was glad I had Ann's helmet on. Thank you, Ann.

Michael Curtis 3rd July 1935 – 23rd August 2023



Valerie Letheren 1940 – 2023

Valerie was born in Coventry, where her parents had moved to escape the London blitz – not a wise move in hindsight! They later returned to Islington in London where Valerie attended local schools and later a grammar school, Camden School for Girls in Camden Town. Following school she secured a place at Guy's Hospital School of Physiotherapy, qualifying in 1961 as a Chartered Physiotherapist and starting her career at Charing Cross Hospital. At that time this was a small, friendly hospital opposite the station entrance.

I had met Valerie in 1958 and we married in 1962, settling in new Malden, Surrey, where she worked part time in Kingston Hospital. Sons Martin and Paul were born in 1964 and 1967. We moved to Tylers Green outside High Wycombe and Valerie continued her career with part time sessions at Amersham Hospital. She later opened her private practice in High Wycombe, allowing her more flexibility to tend to the children, and giving her the business experience she enjoyed. Over many years she treated hundreds of patients before retiring in her late 60s.

Valerie was elected to Wycombe District Council in 1985 and became Chairman of the Planning Committee, Mayor of High Wycombe in 1991 and Chairman of the Council two years later. She stood down after 14 years' service to the Wycombe community. In 2001 she was elected to Buckinghamshire County Council, where she was portfolio holder for Transport and later Children and Young People. She was Chairman of the Council in 2016/17, after which she stood down.

Despite a full career in physiotherapy and politics Valerie never failed to encourage our sons to be independent and took every opportunity to help with our five grandchildren, taking them on holidays in England and abroad.

In recent years Val developed Parkinson's Disease though it was only for the past couple of years that this limited what she could achieve. Earlier this year she was diagnosed with breast cancer and it was from this that she died on 30th August.

Our move to Quainton in 2017 has proved to be a very happy one and I am so grateful to everyone in our lovely community for their help and support for Valerie and me in recent months.

Valerie had a zest for life and has been inspirational to many. After over 60 years of marriage, I shall miss her tremendously.

The Thanksgiving Service for Valerie's life is arranged for Monday 2nd October in our church.









George & Dragon Update September 2023

A lot has happened since the August/September issue of Quainton News.

Following are news updates from the Pub & Coffee Shop Community Action Group; from Darren Curtis, owner of the pub and coffee shop; and, over the page, from George Newman, the manager of the pub.





Pub & Coffee Shop Community Action Group Update

Recently, we received the disappointing news that Darren has decided to take the George and Dragon pub & coffee shop off the market as he no longer wishes to sell it. All of our offers were rejected including a proposal to buy and lease back where the community would buy the pub and then lease it back to Darren to run as well as a proposal that we would make an offer of £600k.

So, after 15 months and literally hundreds of hours of work from many people during which we have set up a suitable company, applied for and been awarded a £300k grant from the Government, launched, run and completed a community share offer, which with all your (334 people) help was immensely successful, as well as successfully applying for a grant from the Haddenham and Waddesdon Community Board and organising various fundraising quiz nights that filled the pub with customers, it is extremely disappointing that all this work has come to nothing. This means that the campaign to buy the George and Dragon Pub & Coffee shop and move it into community ownership for the long term benefit of the community has now come to an end and we have now started the large amount of work needed to wind up the campaign and all the associated things that have been put in place.

Part of this process will of course involve returning the money that was invested by the share holders in line with the terms of the Community Share Offer and cancelling the Government Community Ownership Grant of £300k. The purpose of the grant was to help fund the purchase of the pub and coffee shop and if it is not for sale the grant is not available to us. We will get a final set of accounts prepared to confirm that everybody has been reimbursed and the campaign has been suitably closed.

Your support throughout this campaign has been wonderful and most appreciated, it is a pleasure to be part of such a generous community.

George & Dragon Update from Darren

In light of the recent activity surrounding the community purchase of the George and Dragon pub and coffee shop, I feel it necessary firstly to thank the committee for all their time and effort they have put into trying to make the sale happen. Unfortunately, after 21 years at the pub, I felt the original offers and subsequent offers that arose later were not acceptable and did not reflect the valuation which my agent had put on the property and current business.

After some other options were put forward, I made a decision that didn't come lightly and resulted in me removing the pub and coffee shop from the market. I was asked if I would be prepared to make a payment towards incurred costs for floorplans, survey and negotiators however, the advice I have received from my agents Fred Barrett and sons was that these fees are not the responsibility of the seller. This was advised to both myself and the CAG. At the beginning, recommendations on how to purchase a hospitality business were offered to the CAG group by my agent, as this is his area of expertise but the decision was made by them to pursue alternative options.

So what does this mean?

As a result of my decision the pub remains open, as will the coffee shop, which is what the community has always had at its heart, and after all the years of me owning and operating the business is what I have always wanted.

How will this happen?

An agreement between George Newman and myself has been put in place whereby George will take tenancy of the pub, which means he will pay a rental fee to me but the business is solely his to do as he wishes. I will continue to run the coffee shop with some changes on how we operate.

There are going to be changes so please bear with us and be patient as we figure out a few details and make the necessary changes.

When will this happen?

As most of you are aware George is currently managing the pub for me whilst I focus in the coffee shop, the change over where we become separate businesses is dependant on banks and other professions time scales. We are both hoping that this can be done as soon as possible.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of our regular customers for their continued support and custom since I first made the decision to sell and the subsequent decision to remove the business from the market.

I appreciate there are mixed opinions in the village about what has happened but this is a personal and business decision and secures the long term future of both the pub and coffee shop in the same way in which the community buy out would have been. For the last 21 years of operating the pub and coffee shop through a recession and covid along with personal challenges I have always held the community at heart and look forward to your continued support.



This means I will be independent from the coffee shop however we will still be sharing some of the facilities and we work together when needed to for events etc. I have got to find and create a team of staff that are loyal, friendly and passionate not only about their job but also the community in which we live and work. Once I have a team of employees who are confident and comfortable behind the bar, I will be bringing food back, a traditional village pub menu will follow as this is what the village asked for in the very beginning when surveys were done by the CAG and published in Quainton News. Unfortunately, I can't give you any official dates but as this goes to press, I am currently working on our Christmas menu which will run throughout December. Enquiries are already coming in for Christmas party bookings and of course I will be happy to help.

Going forward there will be changes made to how the pub appears and operates, however until we have some dates for certain I cannot release these ideas. I have the community and the village I have grown up in at the forefront of my mind and would like the pub to be the community hub for socialising, dining and entertainment as well as employing local people and sourcing local produce.

Although Dave had an impressive bed of nine onions all over 4lbs, all grown from the plants supplied by Bob, any three of which would have won the Cup for 'best vegetable exhibit' at the Village show. The poor growing conditions from the seedlings, planting out and growing on made life difficult for our competitors and Exhibition growers all over the UK. Only two lifters improved on their last year's weights.

Malcolm Wearn's extra 7 ounces meant that he was rewarded with the Endeavour Salver and Martin Dorrell's added pound meant that he avoided repeating the dubious distinction of winning 'the pickling vinegar. This time it went to Tim and Kathryn Friedlander who having moved to a new and potentially better plot found it overrun and the onions swamped by a self-set squash plant. The 'newbies', Georgia and Ethan, based at Romney Meadows/Clifford Way joined our traditional competition and had very creditable first attempts and could be future contenders - with a little help from Grandad?

With a small lifting team going round the village, the traditional and very welcome refreshment break and 'social 'at Anne's was taken. She sent Pete Atkins to find the smallest onion in the garden as she had her eyes on the pickling vinegar while she made the coffee, with boiling milk, proper coffee. But it was a fruitless quest as the onions were like the Cheshire Cat's grin and had all but vanished, it was agreed that invisible onions did not count in the pickling vinegar competition.



We at HS2/EKFB are always looking for new ways to help impacted communities through our social value and legacy programme. So when approached by Edgcott Parish Council members for assistance in enhancing the appearance of a community space, we were glad to help.

In July, our contractors cleared and disposed of the thick brambles from an overgrown pond at the heart of the village, exposing the bank once more. This has greatly improved the visibility of the pond and created more space on the bank. In time, it is hoped this will allow rushes to grow back as well as provide a scenic view for the residents of Edgcott to enjoy.

Moving into our construction update, from August 2023 we will be continuing preparations for the Station Road realignment.


