WELCOME FROM HOLY CROSS & ST MARY'S CHURCH



Dear friends,

If you weren't able to attend the Brett Memorial Event at Quainton Church in May, you missed a treat! 400 years ago, Richard Brett was the Rector of Quainton and stayed in post for nearly 40 years. He was famously one of the Oxford team of translators of the King James Bible and was known in the village for his faithful preaching from the Bible – and in those days, the sermons would have been a lot longer than 12 minutes!

Our church at Holy Cross and St Mary was consecrated for the worship and glory of God, and to be a beacon of faith, hope and

love to the village through fulfilling the mission of God – proclaiming the good news of the Gospel. Richard Brett understood this and would have been passionate in preaching the words he translated from the Gospel of John, chapter 3, verse 16: "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.

At the church Annual Meeting on May 15th, we launched an ambitious programme of conservation, renovation and reordering of our beautiful and historically significant church. We want to honour the many faithful people like Richard Brett, who have served the church throughout its remarkable history by acknowledging and building on their mission to bring God's Word to the community. What an amazing legacy they have passed on to us and we don't underestimate the responsibility we have to continue to be faithful to their vision in making Christ known.

We are custodians of a beautiful church and as such we are grasping the nettle and alongside much needed conservation and restoration work, we will be reordering the church to make it fit for purpose for the next generation. If you would like a copy of the report I presented to the Annual Meeting about our project, just email or phone and I'll be happy to send it to you. My report has also been made into a video that you can watch from our church website at www.quaintonchurch.com – just follow the link at the top of the page for "Vicar's Annual Meeting Report 2022".

Some of you reading this page will have fond memories of the church going back many years and I know you will appreciate the desire we all have to honour the founders of our church in their determination to create a sacred place with a focus on reaching out in mission and ministry to the village.

One of the things we plan to do is open up the south side of the nave to create a prayer chapel, with a focus on the 17th century oak altar which is in place there.

This is our 'carpe diem' moment - it's time to seize the day!



Wow, life is so busy! Sometimes I need to just stop and breathe.



We held the Annual Meeting of Council on 12th April, starting with the re-election of Chairman Cllr Nicolette Smith. We have one new candidate to be co-opted in at the next Parish Council meeting on 9th June.

VACANCIES: We have 2 more vacancies on the council, we invite people from the Parish to contact us and apply for the role of Parish Councillor. Skate Park: The inspection took place on 10th May and unfortunately there are several areas that we're deemed too high risk and we had to close the skatepark, pending a solution. The closure seems to have triggered people's interest and we saw several people join the Skatepark Facebook group, if you're interested to help build the next Quainton Skatepark, please join the group: https://www.facebook.com/groups/996917390903081/

Jubilee Beacon: Remember to make your plans to view the Jubilee Beacon as part of the Queen's Jubilee celebrations on 2nd June. More information about the Queen's Jubilee celebrations can be found on the Buckinghamshire Lieutenancy's website: https://www.buckslieutenancy.org/platinumjubilee22

CHOW: We're very sad to have received reports of vandalism at our newly planted Community Heritage Orchard and Wildlife Meadow. CHOW is a community project, where volunteers work very hard to create an area for everyone. Seeing this destruction by people visiting the site is disappointing and unacceptable. We hope that having the police out more often will prevent this from happening in the future, but we're now having to consider putting public funds to use for security in this area. Parishioners, please talk to each other about this and let's make sure as a community we protect our community assets. Follow progress on CHOW and offer your help and support via https://www.facebook.com/groups/321040946212772

Planning: No new planning applications were received, but we discussed the request for a change to a previous application with permission at 62 Station Road. We did put in an objection to the new application at 135 Station Road and we're dealing with concerns about the height of the new builds at North End Road as well as the severe damage to the road surface at the building site. These issues are in progress.

Roads: We continue to follow up Buckinghamshire Council on our list of roads that needs repairs this ranges from potholes to damaged kerbs, damaged drains to bollards and traffic signs, as well as the issues with heavy traffic coming through the village.

The Bridge: We continue to press for the bridge on Station Road to be repaired so we can get the 3-tonne weight limit lifted and get Station Road re-opened. Rumours are that the bridge will be repaired, but we have yet to have confirmation of this. We will continue to chase this up.

Bus Service: The new timetable which started on 3rd May with an additional 9am bus between Quainton and Waddesdon, seems to be working for people, in addition to the Quainton Emergency Team being available to help people get to appointments. New bus timetable can be found here: https://www.buckscc.gov.uk/media/4518148/16-red-rose-travel-may-2022.pdf

Speed Watch: We're still progressing on the installation of the four poles and two new SIDs, we're currently awaiting quotes from companies to install the poles.

Station Road Traffic Calming: No further updates on this ongoing issue, we continue to talk with Buckinghamshire Council and Barwood Homes.

Station Road Crossroads: We continue to wait for news on this via Ward Councillor Iain Macpherson, however people may have noticed that signage that was obscuring the Give Way warning signs have been removed and the area is being kept as clear as possible, so the junction is visible from all 4 directions.

HS2/EKFB New Station Rd Layout: The new drawings have been presented to the Parish Council, we are working on printing some in large scale (the A4 versions we have are too small to see the details) and arrange a presentation with the residents of the village. HS2 / EKFB will be visiting the village on 31 May with their mobile information unit at the Memorial Hall. Further details will be published in this Quainton News as well as on our Notice Boards, Facebook Page, Quainton Village Life and our website.

Quainton Gardening Society News:

To Dos & Tips for June

- Plant young plants so they get off to a good start
- Keep sowing small batches of salad varieties
- Pinch out side shoots on tomato plants to produce better fruit
- Early June is your last time to sow pumpkins for the Autumn
- Don't mow your lawn too low as this will help keep the moisture in and keep it green
- Sow vegetable seeds straight into the ground; such as pak choi, spring onions and broccoli
- Sow nasturtium seeds. These are great for filling borders and climbing up trellis
- Keep on top of the weeding and hoe borders regularly to keep down weeds





Happy 100th Birthday to Dorothy Ayres!

Church Street resident, Dorothy Ayres was born on 24th May 1922, 'Empire Day', a birthday shared with Queen Victoria. Dorothy was one of three children, Margery (Madge) the eldest, and Donald the youngest.

Dorothy's ancestors are very much local to Quainton, especially on her mother's side. Dorothy's mother's name was Winifred Grace, before she married, and her mother was Annie King. Tracing the family ancestry shows there are many links between the Graces and Kings in the Quainton area. Dorothy's, Great Grandfather, Thomas Stevens Grace (1825-1875) was a blacksmith at the 'Sportsman's Inn', in Lower Street. Whereas Dorothy's three times Grandfather, Charles King (1753-1819) was Overseer to the Grange Estate at Shipton Lee belonging to Robert Dormer and later John Calcraft.

Dorothy's father was Jim Ayres, a Railway plate layer, who came from Radstone, near Brackley, Northamptonshire, to work on the railway at Quainton, when he was about twenty. The Great Central line passed by Radstone and working on the railway appealed to Jim, rather than farming like his brothers. Jim even continued to work on the railway for several years past retirement age.

Dorothy attended Quainton School, joining just before her fifth birthday on 26th April 1927. She stayed at school until she was fourteen, leaving school on 24th July 1936. During 1930 she saw the R100 airship fly over the village a number of times. In the same year, the school had installed electric light and a wireless set. Academically, Dorothy excelled and was presented with the County Prize of a watch, by Lady West and Rev. Cautley, just before she left school.

Dorothy's family were very musical and much of their family life centered around the Baptist Church. Jim Ayres was the choir master at the Chapel and

in his younger days played with the Waddesdon Temperance Band. Dorothy's aunts and uncles also played the piano, organ and other instruments so she was surrounded by music as she grew up. Dorothy had a rare music ability, she could read music, play by ear, change key to any music when playing the piano or organ. Dorothy started piano lessons with Mrs. Dancer when she was ten years old. In later years, when the divisions between Church and Chapel became blurred, Dorothy also played the Church organ. Dorothy would play at Weddings and Midnight Mass. Dorothy also played the accordion and would accompany her father, the choir master of the Chapel Carol Singers, when they toured the local farms and streets of the village in the weeks before Christmas, in the 1940s and 50s.

During the Second World War, Dorothy worked at her uncle's Shop and Bakehouse in Church Street. Uncle Arthur taught Dorothy to drive so she could help with the delivery of goods and bread. One memorable incident happened when Dorothy and her cousin Jean were delivering bread in the Denham area, when the van broke down. A sergeant at the Prisoner of War camp, at Denham, saw the ladies in distress and arranged for several Italian prisoners to push the van back to the Bakehouse yard in Church St.

After the war, Dorothy continued working at the shop and for her brother-in-law, Reg Harding, who had taken over the baking business, until its demise in the mid-fifties. Dorothy carried on working at the shop when Mr and Mrs Harrison took over the lease. Dorothy was able to demonstrate

her great mental mathematical skill by adding up columns of figures speedily and accurately in the customer order books. In 1969, Dorothy found new employment, first at Woolworths in Aylesbury, as a wages clerk, and later at Ginn's, an educational book firm, at Prebendal House, Aylesbury, and enjoyed the work and company that this job afforded, retiring in 1982.

Dorothy is now resident in the Almshouses in Church Street. She had been born in Leicester Cottage, a house at the junction of Lower Street and The Green. Soon after that, she moved with her mother, father and sister to 'Radstone', 1 Northend Road, a house built by her grandfather Thomas Grace. Unfortunately, soon after moving there, in 1930, her grandmother died, so the family moved in with her grandfather at Townsend/Woodbine Cottage.

Later on, and at the death of her grandfather, the house, 'Madordon' at 10 Townsend was built in 1937 and Dorothy stayed there for some years. Her mother died in 1945, and her sister and brother left when they married, leaving Dorothy to look after her father until 1964. Dorothy stayed at Townsend for several years but eventually moved to the Almshouses in 1996. She has been very happy and secure there.



RAMBLINGS FROM FINEMERE WOOD: Charlotte Karmali, Volunteer Warden

May, how I love May when our senses are flooded with wondrous sights and sounds of the natural world. The bluebells enchant us once again, interspersed with greater stitchwort their magical carpet stretches far and wide. Common blue butterflies are on the wing and can be spotted in the open areas of the wood, and the opera of birdsong is reaching a crescendo.

I took my parents on our annual pilgrimage to see Finemere Wood's bluebells. As we sat quietly together, soaking up the tranquil beauty, a movement caught my eye upon the trunk of a standing dead tree, a treecreeper (Certhia familiaris). Mottled brown, with white underparts, and a white stripe above the eye, this tiny bird will freeze if disturbed, rendering it difficult to spot, its camouflaged plumage mimicking that of the bark of a tree. The treecreeper, supported by its long rigid tail, scurries vertically up trees, often spiralling around the trunk. When it reaches the top, it will fly back down to the bottom of another



tree and start the process again. Its long, sharp beak is curved downwards at the end allowing it to pick out insects from crevices in the tree. Its nest will be tucked into cracks behind loose bark. Certhia familiaris has a very small territory, often just one tree. We watched as it disappeared into a deep fissure, and thus the value of a standing dead tree is exemplified.

Over the Winter, a large area of hazel was coppiced, underneath the canopy of oak trees. Normally, a number of the larger oak trees would be removed to allow plenty of light to hit the ground. But this is an important area of the wood for bats, and these oak trees provide many a valuable roosting site. Hence they will be left standing.





This area must be fenced to protect the new growth from the voracious appetites of deer, and so a new challenge is set for the volunteers. There is no need for fence posts this time. Rope can be tied between trees, and deer netting can be hung from this, secured to the ground with logs and stakes. And so my requests for the day were knot tiers,

stake makers, log lifters, and the ability to think laterally. Heated debates and opposing opinions gradually abated as a plan was formulated and each volunteer found their niche.

I never imagined such a fencing task could be completed in a day, but once the wheels were set in motion, the volunteers were off and would not stop until it was done. Admittedly, I did feed them cake, fulfilling the request for a hybrid bake: ginger cake with lemon drizzle icing. The ingenuity of the volunteers is second to none, the hybrid cake an inspired idea, and the fence a work of art.




