WELCOME FROM HOLY CROSS & ST MARY'S CHURCH



Dear friends,

I used to travel extensively around the world in Developing Countries, working with, and learning from local indigenous people groups. One country I worked in many times was Tanzania, so I love to hear stories of their heroes. It reminds me how resilient these wonderful people are in every walk of life. One such story you may well remember if you are as old as me! It was October 20, 1968 at the Olympics in Mexico City. Twilight

filled the stadium, and the floodlights began to shine as the closing ceremonies ended and the medals were awarded. Then

there was an announcement asking people to stay in the stadium for a few more minutes as the last runner made his way into the arena and around the track to the finishing line. What had taken this man so long? As he came into view his appearance told the story.

John Stephen Akhwari a fine marathon runner from Tanzania, was covered with blood and with his leg wrapped, staggered into the stadium. Thousands of people rose to their feet and roared their encouragement, applauding his courage. He had taken a dreadful fall, thumped his head, damaged his knee, and suffered a trampling before he could get back on his feet. And there he was, more than 25 miles later, hobbling his way to the finishing line.

When Akhwari crossed the finish line, he collapsed into the arms of the medical personnel, who immediately whisked him off to the hospital. The next day, he appeared before sports journalists to field their questions about his extraordinary feat. The first question was the one any of us would have asked, "Why, after sustaining the kinds of injuries you did, would you ever get up and carry on to the finish line when there was no way you could possibly win a medal in the race?" John Stephen Akhwari said, "My country did not send me over 11,000 kilometres to start a race. They sent me over 11,000 kilometres to finish one!"

Perseverance is something we are all called to as people of faith, and it is something we need in today's uncertain world. It takes determination to stay on track with life and to finish the race. As the writer of the book of Hebrews in the Bible says in chapter 12, verses 1 and 2: "As for us, we have this large crowd of witnesses around us. So then, let us rid ourselves of everything that gets in the way, and of the sin which holds on to us so tightly, and let us run with determination the race that lies before us. Let us keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, on whom our faith depends from beginning to end."

Whatever challenges you are facing at this time, don't give up. You have people around you who love and care. We are here for each another, to support when things are tough. God's blessing on you and those you love and care for.

Our next event is Oxford Golf Club on Thursday 6th April (the day before Good Friday), playing for the Chairman's Trophy.



Gillian Miscampbell OBE DL 31st December 1935 - 13th January 2023

Much loved and hugely respected Quainton resident Gill Miscampbell sadly passed away in Stoke Mandeville Hospital on Friday 13th January 2023, aged 87 years.

Gill moved to Upper Street in Quainton in the 1960s with her late husband Alec and their sons Andrew and Ian. Their younger son Alexander was born not long after. Gill played a huge role not only in village life here in Quainton but also around the whole of Buckinghamshire. I could write a book on all her acheivements but this one page will have to suffice.



Born in Dundee on New Year's Eve, with a childhood spent commuting to India, Gill spent her younger adult years living in London. When she married Alec in 1958, they moved first to Haddenham, and then to Quainton in 1963 where they remained. Gill lived a life characterised by her strong and independent mind and spirit, her absolute belief in public service and most importantly by her love of family. Public Service was a cornerstone of her life for over 50 years, making a huge difference to the people in Buckinghamshire and the surrounding area. Gill and Alec will be remembered for playing an extremely important role in the battle against the proposed Third London Airport at Wing, which they fought for several years through the 1960s but which they finally won in 1971.

Gill's professional life focused on at least five different strands of service: with Bucks County Council starting as a councillor, rising through the education department and ultimately ending up as Chairman; as Chairman of the Stoke Mandeville Hospital Trust; as a Governor and a Trustee at the Aylesbury Grammar School; her involvement with Buckingham University – for which she was awarded an honorary doctorate; and most recently through her position as a Deputy Lieutenant of the County. It's no wonder she was awarded an OBE! In all of these roles she made a real difference to people's lives locally, whether it be the teaching profession at AGS and the other local grammar schools, both in the education department at the Council and at AGS where, as Governor and member of the School Academy Trust, she had an active role for decades – or fighting to ensure that Stoke Mandeville would continue to exist and to provide care for people in the North of the County.

In Quainton, Gill played a big role in the church not only attending church services, but by being on the rotas for cleaning and flower arranging, both of which she did for many years. She was a keen member of Quainton Village Conservatives (she was in fact the chairman for a time) and would turn her home into a committee room whenever there was a General Election, and her hospitality on Election Night is warmly remembered!



She will be sorely missed by many in the village and beyond, and our thoughts and prayers go to her three sons and their familes.

Mrs Laura Eugene Saunders, from Cautley Close, has died aged 100.


She was born on May 31st 1922 and grew up in Steeple Claydon with her farming parents George and Laura Blake, and three older sisters. She attended the Royal Latin School and met her husband Stewart when they were in just teenagers. They were married at Steeple Claydon Church in 1947 and moved to Warwickshire shortly after where Mr Saunders was the Station Master at Dunchurch. They returned in 1958 and moved to Quainton where he became the last Station Master at Quainton Road station before it closed. Mrs Saunders worked



for a while at the Post Office with Mr and Mrs Mole, and then as an unqualified teacher at Quainton School with Mr and Mrs Lawes. In her 40s, she learnt to drive and was able to attend Bletchley Park Teacher Training College and gain her teaching certificate. On qualifying, she returned to Quainton School where she taught until her retirement. She is still remembered fondly by some of her former pupils!

Her other interests over the years included Country Dancing, her membership of the Baptist Church Women's Own and the Women's British Legion, where she especially enjoyed the Whist Drives. In addition to two daughters and four granddaughters, she has eight great grandchildren.

She celebrated her 90th birthday with a tea party at Buckinghamshire Railway Centre in 2012. She died aged 100 on 12th January 2023



180th Anniversary of Inclosure in Quainton



It is just 180 years on 22nd February 1843 that the final approval was granted for the Inclosure (the correct original spelling) at Quainton. The map, 36.5 inches by 32 inches, was required to be drawn to show what had been written down in the Act of Parliament. To be more precise the approval for Inclosure was for Quainton Township as the areas that are now part of Quainton Parish, Denham, Doddershall and Shipton Lee had already been inclosed by their landowners.

The Commissioners were John and Richard Davis of Bloxham, Oxfordshire who detailed the Enclosure (the modern spelling for Inclosure) of the land. John Davis had extensive experience in this work and had overseen thirty-six such commissions. Thomas Anstiss of Quainton, a land surveyor and builder of the mill assisted in the activity. The Enclosure at Quainton was one of the last to be undertaken in Buckinghamshire, Waddesdon had enclosed land in the previous century. Ridge and farrow land of Blackgrove field, Hill Field and Seech Field was completely abandoned and the way of farming changed forever. The Enclosure also included waste and common ground so all the area of Quainton Township were attributed to somebody. There were some 193 allotments, including an area known as Finemere Woods, with a total area of land of just over 1673 acres 1 rod and 35 perch enclosed.


The enclosure not only divided the land into fields it also specified the improvements to roads and water supply in the Township. The following were built:

Seven Roads thirty-feet wide / Four Private Carriageway and Drift Roads twenty-five feet wide / Four Public Bridleways, fourteen feet wide / Eleven Public Footway, four feet wide / Public and Private Aqueducts channeling water from five springs on the hills.

Roads were named. The road to the east of the Church, which is commonly known today as 'New Road' was called 'Church Leys Road', because it ran across the fields owned by the Rector. The road is a good example of the specification of a new road which is 30 feet wide with grass verges then the boundary ditch and hedge on both sides.

Lee Road was Winslow Road for just a short distance until it met Shipton Lee where the road became Lee Causeway. The name 'Causeway' suggesting that the track crossed watery land presumably due to water flowing off of Grange Hill.

Seech Field Road was a completely new Road. The part of Station Road nearest the centre of the Village was called Hog Lane. Hog Lane finished approximately at Beaks End, where the bend in the road is today. The road continued straight as Seech Field Road until it hit another refurbished road The Seech Road. The Seech Road straightened an existing track between Staple Gate (near the Osier Beds in the parish of Waddesdon), over Seech Common to Fiddlers Field Gate (near Doddershall bridge). The Seech Field Road continued in a straight line when it crossed The Seech Road but then called Westcott Gap Road, where it joined a track in the parish of Waddesdon. The crossing of The Seech Road is called Station Road Crossroads today. (Seech is a name for marshy land). Before extensive drainage works were instigated, the area of Seech Field and Seech Common must have become waterlogged at different times of the year. The Westcott Gap Road close to the Seech Road has a large flourishing pond, which is an area where water drains. Westcott Gap is the name of a field in the parish of Waddesdon and presumably it refers



to an area of ground that is a gap in the marshy Seech.

Further roads were improved. The Strand became The Aylesbury Road after it passed The Church Leys Road. At Blackgrove Crossroads the road toward Waddesdon parish became the Blackgrove Road until it reached Lapstones Gate

There were many hedges to be planted at Enclosure, but additionally the map shows that trees were planted along all roads, about every two rod (33 feet). The Seech Field Road had at least three types of tree; Elm, Poplar and Oak. Poplar trees could still be seen along Station Road until the 1970s, when they naturally died out. Elm trees died out due to Dutch elm disease and only some Oak trees remain today. A good example of some remaining oak trees are by The Seech Road (Station Road Crossroads to Waddesdon). Unfortunately, some oak trees have recently been cut down by HS2 contractors. The life cycle of the trees gives a clue to when the trees were planted, using a variety of methods, from girth circumference, life of species and tree ring count gives an approximate latest date of around 1870.

The considerable work of the Enclosure must have taken some time. The requirement for material to build roads has been documented by Rodwell in 2008, and gives a clue.

'In 1842 they tried boring for stone in Grange Hill without success. This work with an average of at least 100 ton of Flint and 120 yards of Stone per year continued until 1860 when the quantity suddenly increased to 200 tons of Flint and 100+ wards of stone. This continues until the quantities start to tail off in 1867, and the detail in the Cash Book becomes sparse. The book finishes in 1879 but the work seems to have stopped in 1878'

The building of the roads and planting of the trees seem to correlate, showing that the Enclosure work took some twenty-five years to complete with the majority of trees planted by the end of the road works.

In the 180 years since the Enclosure there have been many changes in the parish. The railways came in 1868, 1871 and 1899. Shipton Lee joined the parish of Quainton in 1886. Mains water came in the year just before the Second World War so the old pumps in the streets were no longer required. But change continues today. The Station Road Crossroads (Junction of The Seech Road, Seech Field Road and Westcott Gap Road) will no longer exist as HS2 realign roads in that area.



News from The Railway!

The main Railway Centre is closed throughout March for maintenance work to continue in readiness for the new season, which starts on Sunday 2nd April. Warning re batteries: Please DO NOT throw batteries into normal bins, even the recycling bin!

You may have seen a recent news item where a Recycling lorry had caught fire and this was due to batteries not being disposed of properly, so a reminder to everyone that batteries cannot be put into normal bins, not even inside the blue-top recycling bins. In February 2023, as part of our ongoing commitment to enhance and improve our local community spaces, EKFB were able to assist the Quainton Orchard with a donation of wood chippings. 



RAMBLINGS FROM FINEMERE WOOD: Charlotte Karmali, Volunteer Warden

It is a gloriously sunny February day. There is a chill in the air, but the welcome warmth of the sun seeps into our weary winter-weathered bones. There is just a hint of Spring. The birds are singing gently, and the crinkled rosettes of primrose leaves are emerging from the cold soil, signs of new life, it is a heartening time of year.

The volunteers gather along the 'New Ride', armed with their winter weapons. They are eager to slash their way into the undergrowth to create a scallop along the woodland edge. This work is fun,



rewarding, and a whole-body workout. The cake today is a solid creation, packed with dried fruit, calorific, with the sole aim to get as much work out of the woodland workers as possible.

I have worked in Finemere Wood for over 12 years now, and it has been fascinating to be involved in the transformation of this area of the reserve. In the 1960s, this section of ancient Finemere woodland was cleared, and a Forestry Commission conifer plantation was generated in its place. The Winter of 2010 saw BBOWT commencing work to restore this expanse to the broadleaved woodland it once was. Tree-harvesting machinery moved in and clear-felled conifer trees in tens of thousands. Volunteers advanced and dragged tree debris through the thick, tenacious mud. It was known as 'The Somme', and the work here was hardcore.

For a couple of years, we watched the hesitant beginnings of natural regeneration, and then through a tangle of brambles and birch saplings, armed with brushcutters, we carved out the New Ride. Tree stumps hidden amongst thorny foliage hindering our way. Sculpting of the ride followed, with diggers to remove the many tree stumps, and a ditch was dug on either side. Each Summer thereafter, the ride has been cut, scrub kept in check, grasses and flowers have flourished. Posts line the side of the ride, and an electric fence can be attached. Cattle can now be moved from the meadows through to Long Close Meadow, in the centre of the wood, for grazing.

We observe as The Somme metamorphoses, astonished at the predictability of secondary succession. Short-lived annual plants become established first, followed by grasses and perennial plants. Next, shrubs and small trees. Birch quickly colonises this new and open land. Over time the variety of species increases, blackthorn, hawthorn, willow and oak. The miracle of natural regeneration.

Twelve years on, the wood is still young, but it is vigorous and diverse. The first scallops can be carved into the woodland edge of this new ride, enabling sunlight to reach the ground. These sheltered areas of new growth will provide an ideal habitat for a diverse array of invertebrates and butterflies.

The cake did the trick. The volunteers work at a frightening speed. A 30m x 10m section of the woodland edge was cleared of vegetation in a matter of hours. These woodland workers never fail to amaze me. The 'New Ride' is evolving, year after year it matures, becoming more diverse and more beautiful. Working alongside nature, to enable this, is a truly wonderful experience.


