Dear friends,

I think I am right in claiming that I was the first person to sit down to a full English at the George after the latest lockdown rules were eased in May. It was a delightful experience sitting there with my coffee and breakfast and looking out onto a rare glimpse of the sun! Things are changing and that in itself will bring delights but also challenges

I love visionaries. The kind of people that can inspire others to think outside the box, to make things happen, the movers and shakers of this world. People like that can enable us to have a bigger perspective on life

and extend the horizons of our experience.

The prophet Isaiah in the Bible was a person like that. One of his famous sayings goes like this: "Enlarge the place of your tent, stretch your tent curtains wide, do not hold back; lengthen your cords, strengthen your stakes." (Isaiah 54:2)

In those days the message was clear. There is much more of life to explore, so much more to enjoy, so much to experience. Don't limit your life by living in a box. Break out!

What a great message for today! As lockdown is relaxed, there is a world of adventure out there for us. Of course, that doesn't necessarily mean we have to jump on an aeroplane for some exotic far flung shore. But it does mean we need to pay attention to our inner life, so easily cramped by our own fear and anxiety, which can flourish with the right support and encouragement.

This has always been the challenge for people of faith, because faith can be passive unless it results in courageous, out-reaching action. For some in the world today, that means living dangerously in places where outward expressions of Christianity are outlawed. In China for instance, the underground Christian church is one of the fastest growing faith movements in the world and yet persecution is a common experience for many.

The famous stuntman Blondin made his first crossing on a tightrope across Niagara Falls on June 30th 1859, watched, it was calculated, by 100,000 people. It is said that on one occasion he attempted the same stunt pushing a wheelbarrow in front of him, then challenging someone to get into the wheelbarrow for the return trip! It's easy to believe that Blondin can do this amazing stunt, but quite another thing to be the one in the wheelbarrow!

But that is precisely what authentic Christianity is all about. I don't mean that we all have to jump in a literal wheelbarrow, although it could be fun! I mean that faith takes us into unknown territory, beyond the horizon of our understanding and challenges our way of life to be more courageous in loving God and neighbour.

It is not an easy task leading a parish council but Arthur, with his calm demeanour, level-headed and scrupulously fair approach managed to keep the discussions moving, enabling decisions to be reached. Over his time as a councillor, things moved from paper documents and planning applications being passed round the councillors in envelopes, then plastic wallets, and more recently to a situation where emails had to be checked for information and responded to regarding council business and of course the inevitable zoom meetings during the restrictions and lockdown. New words and phrases came into use, such as "You are on mute" alongside the frustrations over rural broadband speed. Arthur has taken all this in his stride, with maybe a bit of help from his son and Brian.

As Chairman, Arthur has always tried to do his best for the parishioners of Quainton in the clear knowledge that he couldn't please everyone all of the time but he was always there to listen, to help and offer advice. Arthur will, we are sure, continue to offer advice and guidance to those who seek it and to lend a helping hand but we hope that he will sit back and relax, read some books, do some gardening, take a nap or whatever else he likes without the pressure of parish council matters. You deserve it. A huge thank you to Arthur from us all and we wish you well.

We welcome John Knox into the Chairman's Chair!

As Arthur steps down, we welcome long-time Councillor John Knox into the chair...

Hi, I am John Knox, the new Chairman of the Parish Council. I was brought up in Leicester and moved here 36 years ago to Lower Street via Woodford Green when CBS Records/Sony Music relocated their Finance Department to Aylesbury. However, I soon found myself commuting back to London where the main office was situated. About the time I retired from Sony Music, my late wife, Sheila, had become a councillor and I later offered to help the PC by attending and reporting on the HS2 Community Forums. I then was co-opted as a councillor after my wife passed.

HS2 has and continues to dominate my time as councillor and I presented the council's petition to the HS2 Select Committee. My brush with the carpets in the corridors of power proved fruitless. We gained no concessions and are now experiencing the damage to the parish that we anticipated. Coincidental with HS2 I am also responsible lor liaising with Buckinghamshire on roads - an often-thankless task but more recently has seen some progress in getting some, but certainly not all, the drainage problems solved. Thames Water's 9-month project to replace some of our water mains lasted 3 years and involved many calls with their CEO's staff to try and resolve the damage and ineptitude caused by the contractors. With fellow councillor, Nick Butler we set about replacing all the streetlights. Not only did we discover some in odd places but we reduced our electricity bill by 80% and saved maintenance costs which would have been much higher today. The PC appointed me as a Saye & Sele trustee, although I strongly suspect that was because I live opposite the Hall. The Hall has undergone a major refurbishment involving several years of fundraising and grants and we now have a pre-school operating in the village again.

Throughout this time, I have been grateful for the support of my fellow councillors. Arthur and I attended the Local Area Forums which gave me the opportunity to meet with other parishes and county councillors, while other councillors took on the burden of planning, the Neighbourhood Plan, leisure and environmental activities. I look forward to co-opting 4 new councillors to take on these areas and serving the Parish for the next 4 years.

The Chairman Reports:

The first meeting of the new Parish Council took place on Thursday 20th May, a week later than usual. The delay was caused by a High Court ruling that meetings had to be held in a public place and could no longer be conducted over Zoom. This prevented one councillor attending as he was going to be away and we, therefore, would not be quorate. As the outgoing Chairman Arthur Evans opened the meeting and covered the first item which was to elect a new chairman, which resulted in my election.

Firstly, I would like to thank Arthur, Clare Lucas, Nick Heirons, Michelle Thompson and Malcolm Wearn for their service as councillors. The past few years have proved to be very busy with HS2, major planning issues, the Neighbourhood Plan, the provision of support during the COVID pandemic and the environmental survey of the parish's trees. Nor should we forget the longstanding activities such as the allotments, play park, skatepark and the bonfire night fireworks and speedwatch. Many of which have involved the participation of other residents.

The Council has had some expressions of interest to be co-opted and we will intend to meet with them so that they can understand what is involved in being a councillor. We look forward to being at full strength of seven councillors for our next meeting on Thursday June 10th.

Iain Macpherson, Phil Gomm and Jilly Jordan have been returned as Buckinghamshire Councillors. Having a multi member constituency is something new in this area and although they will represent everybody we expect to see more of Iain Macpherson in this end of the constituency and at our meetings. HS2 continues to dominate the area and the implications of the re-alignment of Station Road and its impact on residents are a cause of great concern. The Parish Council meets regularly with the local HS2 contractors – EKFB and Fusion and frequently talks with Buckinghamshire Highways.

We have asked for a public meeting to discuss the new road and as the COVID excuse expires I am more hopeful that this will happen and involve both the contactors and Buckinghamshire officers.

There appear to be several changes to the layout of the new road which will impact the residents close by. There are even changes to changes. The Act gives HS2 the power to give themselves planning permission (Section17) as long as it is within the land boundaries defined by the Act.

There is some confusion whether EKFB or Buckinghamshire initiated the changes. The new road

joins the existing road at an angle leading up to 110 and there was a spur coming off almost facing the new development at 151. The purpose of this was to facilitate access to the Railway Centre and to the existing houses as the village side of the old road would be closed off forming a cul-de-sac. A recent version seems to create a new access at the cul-de-sac end which suggests the removal of the original spur. Not only will the houses in this area be faced with all the visitor traffic to the Railway Centre, but now there will be the construction traffic for the so-called Romney Meadows development followed by the traffic generated by forty houses when occupied.

Other issues connected to the new road are that coming from Waddesdon, instead of going across the existing crossroads to join it, you will be required to turn left and join it close to its inception. The reason is supposed to be so that much of the rural nature of the area can be retained. The mind boggles at who thought this one up seeing the dystopian devastation already in this area. I had also raised concern for those who enjoy walking the route round the village via the crossroads and Snake Lane. The new road would have narrow verges and they would be faced with traffic

enjoying a new, clear, pothole-free road surface at 60mph. Placing a 30mph limit well outside the residential area would have no effect and the verges would provide no safety for the Speedwatch team. Instead, it has been proposed that you turn towards Waddesdon alongside the railway before using the accommodation bridge for Needles Farm to return on yourself along the proposed cycleway to Doddershall and re-join Snake Lane after its bridge. I have already said this is unsatisfactory as your quiet country walk along this route would be punctuated by 225mph trains every couple of minutes. I look forward to being able to tell you of a date for a meeting where you can express your opinions.

Other HS2 issues: Concern the damage to local roads by the increased traffic generated by HS2 vehicles and diverted traffic. A concerned resident has reported individually each of 56 potholes at the bend on Quainton Road. These have been raised several times by several local councillors at the Community Board meeting, so I hope that this has a bigger impact with TFB. Sadly, the discussions between Highways and HS2 drag on with HS2 apparently failing to provide adequate traffic reports that would enable compensation to be agreed and these repairs to be done.

We have also been asked to comment on HS2 plans to expand the compound by the crossroads. The plan is to have double stacked portakabins housing office staff and to have parking for 218 cars. 250 blue collar workers will also start their day at this site. As this expands into land outside the Act there is no deemed consent and they need Buckinghamshire's permission. I remember some time ago an HS2 PR release in the Bucks Herald saying that workers would be bussed in from the Bicester Logistics depot relieving the number of small vehicles on local roads and minimising lorry movements. This now seems not to be the case and we will raise this in objecting to this expansion. It also seems counter to the desire to retain the rural nature mentioned above in accessing the new road in this area.

Grass: Monday 22nd May saw the second cut of the verges by our new contractor. We received a number of complaints I have met with the contractor he has done some rectification. The initial long grass and its recent fast growth has not helped plus dodging the daffodils does not aid a tidy finish. Nevertheless, he agrees it should have been better. He will return earlier in two weeks' time to deal with the rapid growth and aim to use a different type of mower before returning to his original schedule. Our agreement provides that, if parked vehicles prevent the cutting of grass, he can leave the affected area and a BT vehicle parked at the top of Winwood Drive is responsible for the missed patch there.

There are many residents who tend the verges by their houses. If you do so, please let our clerk know so that we can build up a register. Meanwhile it is not always clear and although he does try and avoid verges obviously tended privately this is not always possible.

The Green: After checking the ownership of the listed cross on the green the Parish Council decided to accept ownership and responsibility, so we are now close to regularising the use of the Green by agreeing a five-year license with the School Land Charity who own the land. This will regularise the position that currently exists in practice.

Water Leaks: Thames Water fixed the leak on VAHT property on VAHT's behalf and in doing so realised the Main was in fact also leaking. This will require road closure permissions and so the water continues to cascade down Upper St and the pothole grows. Thame's rectification of leaks in Lower Street do not give me confidence that this will be fully resolved for a while and I fear Arthur will be making many more frustrating phone calls. VAHT also visited to see the problems at a flow of water further along. They are rectifying the fencing at this property but the drainage of spring water arises elsewhere and will involve another private landowner.







June - Butterflies and Moths

Congratulations to Jan Stiegeler on winning the Quainton Village Society's competition for the best photograph(s) of a male Brimstone butterfly! Her prize of a £10 voucher has been presented by the Society's chairman, Martin Jacobs. Many people found it difficult to catch the subject when still and there were not many days when weather conditions favoured the project, so well done to Jan for getting not just one photo, but three!







By coincidence, Quainton resident Ian Marriott had his camera out recently when he spotted a large and unfamiliar insect on his porch. He took a photograph (below left), which was used to identify the creature as a very rare Great Peacock moth. Such identification made more difficult by the damaged and part missing forewings of this, the largest (by wingspan) European moth (undamaged version pictured below right). It has a wingspan reaching 15–20 cm. Although not rare in mainland Europe, less than a handful of these amazing creatures have been identified and recorded in Great Britain, ever. The Bucks Herald reported on Ian's discovery on 7th May, with the photograph of the sadly damaged moth. Maybe we shall see more specimens with global warming, but Ian has certainly won the prize for the rarest moth photographed in Quainton – ever!



Ramblings afar from Finemere Wood By Charlotte Karmali - Volunteer Warden

Finemere Wood has stunned us once again with its majestic carpet of bluebells. For me, a sight more emotive than ever before, having missed out on it last year. The natural world has kept me grounded through this challenging era. My endless wanderings around fields and open spaces, noticing flowers, butterflies and tuning into birdsong has been uplifting. But it has also been reassuring, as I observe how the cycles of nature continue regardless of the pandemic. The volunteers have weathered the storm and now return to the woods to immerse themselves in this healing, nourishing sanctuary. James, a dynamo, knows only one speed, fast. He started his working






life in the Royal Navy, where at the tender age of 19 he took part in the Rock of Gibraltar Run. He won and held the record time for a couple of years. This revelation does not surprise me in the least, having observed how he works in the wood. From here through accountancy and financial services to, ultimately, a senior corporate financial planner with the Lloyds Group. James has always had an affinity with woodland. His decision to join the Finemere team, following a BBOWT wood management course, was easy. The prospect of a slice of homemade cake adding the finishing touch. James can also be found in the wilds on a Tuesday with the Upper Ray volunteers, in the flood plain meadows of the River Ray, or other woodland reserves such as Rushbeds Wood and Whitecross Green Wood. In addition to this, he works as a membership recruiter for BBOWT. Strategically placed in a variety of venues, his enthusiasm for the natural world no doubt draws people in like a magnet. His favourite Finemere activity? "Gorging on a scrumptious slice of homemade lemon drizzle cake, Victoria sponge cake, carrot cake etc..." James also loves to scythe, a skill which BBOWT gave him the opportunity to learn. He enjoys the camaraderie of the volunteer team, the physical exercise, and most importantly the rewarding feeling that he is helping to protect a wild space. Butterflies have become his area of special interest, and he is responsible for the Chilswell Valley transect butterfly count. The abundance of Gatekeeper butterflies in the lush grasses of Finemere last Summer was a highlight for James.

When not in the woods, James has many other pastimes. Baking, campanology at his local church, Clerk of Works for the church where he is kept out of mischief with plenty of maintenance chores, walking, cycling, visiting local nature reserves, and wood carving, which he finds extremely therapeutic, that is until he chops off the wrong bit! James is not a man I can imagine sitting still for long. He has an energy and an effervescence about him, always at least two steps ahead of me. Thus, no sooner have I explained the day's challenge than he is off. Before I have time to take a breath, several panels of deer fencing are up and secured. He continues apace, the only word that will stop him is "cake". But how is that going to work in these days of Covid, when the sharing of homemade cakes is banned? I fear he will never stop.

Exciting Plans for a Wildlife Meadow & Community Orchard

Where will it be?

The field is off Lee Road, behind the football field, next to the tennis courts and skate park. The Saye and Sele Foundation own the field but lease it to the Parish Council.

How do you get there?

There is a pedestrian and cycle entrance gate from Lee Road at the entrance to the football field car park. There is also a footpath which runs diagonally through the field to the right of Klee Close (opposite the bottom of North End Road), which then leads to the back of the skate park, although this section is very boggy at the moment.

What are we planning?

The field already has a variety of grasses and some wildflowers, but the plan is to enhance the area with a greater variety to encourage even more wildlife. Hedgerow Havens, an organisation run by Buckinghamshire County Council and BBOWT, is supporting the project. In May, a group of 13 volunteers made a start with a Thistle Pulling Day to rid the field of some of the thistles to allow the new seed space.

We also plan to create a Community Orchard that the whole village can enjoy. Some fruit tree saplings will be planted, and Quainton Gardening Society is providing two 'Aylesbury Prune' (plum) trees. An oak tree provided by the Prideaux family will be planted in memory of the Duke of Edinburgh near the orchard. Some other trees, in particular oaks saplings from Doddershall, will also be planted, going a tiny way to mitigate the loss of the beautiful trees along the route of HS2. Thanks to Michelle Ro-Bo for organising the gathering of the saplings. Some will also be planted in another field in the village. It is hoped that a grant application for picnic benches will be successful to create a peaceful area for village residents to enjoy.

In the meantime, there is lots of work to be done. In July, the field will be harrowed to give some space for scattering wildflower and grass seed gathered from a nearby BBOWT meadow. We will keep you updated with what's happening in each issue of *Quainton News*.

In June, their much anticipated 'Window' on The Green from will be installed. The display will have an explanation and will ask you to join in with their fundraising. There will be a prize draw on the day and lots of groups, charities, businesses and individuals have donated some lovely prizes but there is always room to add more!
