Joop worked for Youth For Christ and set up tours for me around Friesland on many occasions. 'Christian' Coffee Bars were popular in those days, set up in retail areas and even on a number of converted barges, which were great fun to perform in. They gave a new meaning to "rock 'n roll!" One time I was playing in concert on one of these converted barges, when a druggy approached the small stage area brandishing a knife! Not sure if he didn't appreciate my music, or whether he just wanted my attention! Well, he certainly did get a lot of attention and was man-handled to a place of safety off the boat. I have never taken illegal drugs, but there were times when I felt light-headed in the bars and clubs where I played around Europe – the atmosphere could get a little smoky!

I ended up appearing on TV many times during my time as a professional musician, but this one occasion in Amsterdam was the only time I forgot to get all the orange make-up off my face before leaving the studio! I was in such a hurry to catch my flight back to the UK, I managed to travel all the way home with an orange face! I didn't understand why I attracted strange looks from people, until I got back on English soil and looked in a mirror!

I'm still prone to doing things that end up being quite embarrassing for me and my long suffering wife, who has got used to my funny ways after all these years. I don't set out to do stupid things, but when navigating life, I sometimes can't help it!

I take heart in the words of King David in the Old Testament: "Search me, O God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. Point out anything in me that offends you, and lead me along the path of everlasting life." Psalm 139:23-24



Dear Parishioners,

Due to recent incidents at Station Road Crossroads, we felt the need to reassure and update you with what's happening there. I don't need to tell everyone that the crossroads have always been dangerous for many, many years and we WARD Councillors had this as one of our projects to improve working alongside our neighbouring WARD councillors for various reasons but firstly we have had to catch up with many outstanding issues since elected and are making good progress.

Sadly, we've had some serious accidents there recently and with that in mind our project plans have been brought forward to start NOW and discussing the long-term strategy dealing with road safety and speeding around that point. Transport for Bucks and other partners are giving us full support to achieve some of our aspirations there although remembering we must work within the Highway Law. Hopefully, you will start seeing changes and improvements very quickly, for the better of our community and safety.

The Chairman Reports:

Instead of the 2nd Thursday February's PC meeting will be held on Thursday 17th February.

The eagle-eyed among you will notice that here are now only five councillors listed. Michelle Robinson-Boyce resigned before Christmas and I would like to thank her for her contribution. You will soon see a notice asking for nominations so if you are prepared to be a councillor, please put yourself forward.

Planning: After an increasing backlog of outstanding planning applications, a number of decisions have been made: The HS2 Construction compound at the Station Rd crossroads wanted to increase the parking to 240 cars and install a 2-storey office block. The PC objected as it would extend the site beyond the limits set in the Act and conflicted with a press release from HS2 about bussing staff in from the Bicester logistics depot. The application is now shown as decided but no decision letter is posted. However, EKFB decided to relocate 80 of 240 staff to Calvert and Fleet Marston and the parking will be reduced from 218 to 167. The office blocks however will still be 2 storeys high. The large package of HS2 works including the new road remains undecided and at this stage I view this as: no news is good news.

Other decided application saw rejection of The Croft, and the stables to the east of Oving Road, but the new agricultural building on the Ladymead land was approved. The collapsing building at 159 Station Rd now has permission for 2 houses but in agreeing the details of the original outline plan there is now a further single storey extension to the rear. The PC had objected to this late change. Of new applications, the PC has not objected to 12 Church St with the proviso that there should be no loss of off-street parking and that there be a minimal loss of the distinctive wall in front of the terrace which is a distinctive feature of the Neighbourhood Plan.

Bus Service: The school bus is now going down Station Rd and turning at the Railway Centre. Thank you to the Railway Centre for their cooperation. The 16 service is operated by a different company and there is a delay in finding staff to test the turning. Thank you also to Lou Fox for raising this whole issue.

SID: Funding has been obtained from the Bucks/HS2 Road Safety Fund to purchase two new Speed Indication Devices. They will be solar-powered and the existing SID will also be upgraded. The new devices will enable coverage on a rotating basis at the Strand, School, Townsend and Station Rd

CHOW: The Community Heritage Orchard & Wildlife Garden below the football field is taking shape with the planting of more trees and the siting of benches and a table. There was also a Wassailing event with Morris Dancers. No doubt the warm beverages were also enjoyed.

HS2: The resurfacing of the A41/Station Rd junction is set to start on the 24th Jan and this will involve an overnight closure. Weather permitting this should be completed early and probably will see the permanent lights put into operation. Meanwhile an aggregates lorry using the newly surfaced section after the bend decided to enjoy the countryside and help HS2 eliminate more hedges as it went into a field. As there will be a sharp increase in these lorries in the near future one can only hope that they will be more restrained. The section of the road by the construction site remains in a poor state and I am told that utilities need to be moved. I have doubts over this and am pushing for the resurfacing to be finished to the crossroads. Already the surface is breaking up into potholes due to the increased and heavy traffic.

Another issue is the constantly changing dates for road closures and lane closure. The de-veg work on Snake Lane has now been put back to the end of January. The closure of Station Rd between after the bridge to strengthen the cover over the water mains has gone back to the end of March and will last 4-6 weeks. This will prevent access to Waddesdon. As this main has frequently burst and caused strengthening problems at the A41 junction I would not be surprised if this work took longer. At present Snake Lane will also be closed for UKPN to move the electricity supply from mid-February to End-March. I continue to lobby EKFB to make sure that these roads are never closed at the same time.

Outstanding is the nearby moving of the water supply which will see the length of Snake Lane dug up as well as Lee Rd. Test holes were drilled near the junction this month and I have asked for the work to be coordinated with UKPN to minimise closure but suspect it is too late for this common sense. Unfortunately, the utilities work independently of EKFB and of each other making coordination very difficult.

Station Road Crossroad: (See update on this from Cllr Phil Gomm on p.5, which has been sent in response to residents' concerns after two traffic accidents have occurred here since this PC meeting took place. Ed.) The reopening of Station Rd to the crossroads has seen a major increase of vehicles ignoring the Give Way signs. This has always been a problem. The near misses go unrecorded and the accident statistics are not considered serious enough to warrant action by Buckinghamshire. The white lines were repainted last March and are still in reasonable condition but the muddy winter roads results in their being obscured. This is a common problem in winter and repainting will not last long. I have not given up and have suggested solar powered, vehicle activated, advance Give Way signs to warn of the junction. The use of solar power would overcome the high cost of connection to the electricity supply. Bucks Highways have at least met to discuss this and I have asked EKFB to consider if they can help.

Before Christmas Bucks Highways said they were talking with HS2 to fund some improvement packages. Two were to be for Snake Lane and the crossroads but they are still talking and with the utility disruption to Station Rd it will be many months before they could be fully implemented. I am becoming very frustrated with Bucks. They continue to talk to HS2 over who should pay for road repairs, they fail to coordinate the increased road closures around HS2 leaving local parish councils to deal with these matters.

Meanwhile the residents continue to dodge the potholes and guess which diversion to follow today.





Defibrillator Reminder!

CPR First and Foremost

If you see someone suffering a cardiac arrest, ring 999 and ask for an ambulance. The ambulance call handler will guide you through how to perform CPR, and they will also tell you where your nearest defibrillator is and guide through using it if you should need to.

Here in Quainton we have our own unit on the wall by the front door of Quainton School in Lower Street – see defibrillator unit circled on the photo of the school below. This unit is accessible at all times. There are also two units at Buckinghamshire Railway Centre at the end of Station Road, and although these are of course for general public use, they are located inside buildings and are therefore only accessible when the centre is open.



Defibrillation Explained

The heart is controlled by an electrical impulse that makes it beat in a regular rhythm, keeping you alive. When a person has a sudden cardiac arrest (SCA), the normal rhythm becomes disrupted and disorganised, which means their heart can't beat properly and they won't be able to breathe normally. For every minute that someone's in cardiac arrest without receiving CPR and having a defibrillator used on them, their chance of survival decreases by 10%. That's why it's so important to act immediately. A defibrillator gives a jolt of energy to the heart, which can help restore the heart's rhythm, and get it beating normally again. This simple piece of equipment is easy to use and doesn't require training, but it could make the difference between life and death – so it's important to find and use a defibrillator in an emergency. You might also hear a defibrillator be called a defib, an AED (Automated External Defibrillator) or a PAD (Public Access Defibrillator). Don't be scared – it's simple!

Public access defibrillators are designed to be used by the public. When you switch the defibrillator on, it will provide clear instructions and talk you through what you need to do. A defibrillator will not harm the person suffering a cardiac arrest and will only give them a shock if and when it is needed. There's no reason to feel nervous about using a defibrillator – just follow its simple instructions, and know that using it could save someone's life.



QUAINTON WASSAIL!

The Quainton Community Orchard team organised a traditional Wassailing ceremony in the new orchard on Saturday 22nd January. Wassailing is essentially toasting the trees – the word Wassail comes from the Saxon 'Waes Hael' and means Good Health. Good health not just for the fruit trees, but for the farmers, their crops, harvest and animals. Wassailing apple trees apparently developed in the apple-growing counties of England to ensure a good apple crop and therefore a plentiful supply of cider. Wassailers gave cider to the good spirits of the orchard, and then drove out the evil spirits with loud noises – which, back in the day, would have been with rough music and gunfire and was sometimes known as Apple Howling!

Arthur Evans very kindly 'volunteered' to be our 'Apple King' – the master of ceremonies – and we were joined by the Owlswick Morris Dancers. Together everyone, around 60 people, processed from the carpark to the newly-planted orchard, accompanied by music from the Morris Dancers. Lots of people were dressed up, but most wearing the obligatory hats, which are waved in the ceremony, and people carrying all sorts of implements with which to make a loud noise to drive out those evil spirits! Together everyone sang the wassailing song and then shared some warmed cider and mince pies. It was a fabulous ceremony and we've had much positive feedback – maybe we'll make it an annual Quainton Orchard tradition!










CONSULTATION: MODIFICATION OF QUAINTON NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN 2015-2033

Ramblings from Finemere Wood

Slowly, the dark silhouettes emerged from the freezing fog, the dazzlingly bright winter sun burning its way through the thick hazy curtain behind them. Several weeks have passed since the volunteers' last met, during which there has been much Christmas indulgence. The time has come to work those bodies once more.

Firstly, an unfinished job must be completed before the woodland workers can move on to a fresh new project. Armed with loppers, saws and hard hats, the group are herded into a ride side scallop to complete the clearance of the understory. Turkey tail (Trametes versicolor), is a bracket fungus, widespread in Britain, and it has caught my eye this January, with its exquisite form and markings. Turkey tail shaped and growing up to 10cm in diameter, it displays concentric rings of varying colours, blacks, browns, blues, whites, and oranges. Older specimens may look green due to the growth of green algae on them. Found on fallen or standing deadwood, most commonly hardwoods such as oak and beech, it gently breaks down the rotting wood. Trametes versicolor has been used over the centuries as a health supplement, and in Chinese medicine as a treatment for respiratory conditions. It is quite a beauty. David quietly busies himself with a substantial-sized hawthorn tree, a task that is a favourite of his. He finds clearing an area of vegetation and watching the subsequent natural regeneration very rewarding. Plus, I observe, David is drawn to the challenge of conquering sizeable trees, seemingly most happy and content at such times, always with a smile on his face. David's search for a local conservation group to join, with a commitment to improving the local ecosystems and natural environment, led him to the Finemere team. But why does he keep coming back? "The satisfaction of contributing something worthwhile to our natural environment," he says. Yet there is more to it than that.

Cake. David manages to squeeze the word cake into every conversation. Others carry work tools and first aid kits to our working place, David carries the cake. David has taken on the role of cake monitor, making sure that it is passed around and shared fairly. David has even made the effort to join the group for just the first hour of the day, to ensure his fix of cake prior to a dental appointment. "And is there anything else in Finemere Wood that draws you in?" I wonder. "The Purple emperor butterfly" is David's response, as he is yet to experience a first sighting. Come July, I hope he will be rewarded for his hard work and patience with a glimpse of one of these wondrous creatures. Perhaps with a smattering of cake?

- On the third floor, how the miller controlled the quality of the flour and an opportunity to step outside the mill and see the wonderful views of Quainton & Aylesbury Vale.
- On the fourth floor, the millstones, damsel and other original equipment from 1832.
- On the fifth and top floor the storage bins where the wheat started it journey down the mill. It is also a breath-taking opportunity to marvel at the gigantic brake wheel in the cap that transfers the power of the sails into vertical power down the mill through the wallower.


