Dear Friends,

I dusted off my Fender Strat, Korg O1W, Bouzouki and Ovation Balladeer! I even used a set of drum pads on stage – that was fun (for me!)

November always brings with it a certain stillness - the leaves fall, the air cools, and our hearts turn once again to

remembrance. As we gather this month for Remembrance Sunday on the 9th at 11.00am at All Saints, Oving and 3.00pm at Holy Cross and St Mary, Quainton, we pause together in gratitude and silence to honour those who gave their lives in the service of others.

At the heart of Remembrance is not only the act of looking back, but also the call to live differently because of what we remember. When we stand in silence, we remember with gratitude those who sacrificed so much and the many who still carry the scars of war, but we also stand to renew our own commitment to peace, justice, and reconciliation. We remember the cost of war — in lives lost, families broken, and futures changed — and we pray that such sacrifice might lead us to seek a better way.

For Christians, remembrance is deeply woven into our faith. Each time we share the bread and wine at Holy Communion, we hear the words of Jesus: "Do this in remembrance of me." It is an invitation not only to recall what has been done for us, but to be transformed by it. Just as Christ's self-giving love brings hope from suffering, so too we are called to be people who bring light into darkness, peace where there is conflict, and love where there is fear.

As we wear our poppies and gather in our churches, let us hold in our hearts those who continue to live with the scars of war — the wounded, the displaced, the grieving. And let us also remember those who work for peace today: peacekeepers, aid workers, diplomats, and peacemakers in our own communities.

This November, may our Remembrance not end with silence, but move us to action - to live as people of hope, compassion and courage.

In remembering the past, may we be shaped for a more peaceful future.

"Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called children of God." (Matthew 5:9) Blessings,

# The Chairman's Report:

The next council meeting is an 'extra-ordinary meeting of the Council' which is scheduled for the 30th of October, and the next full council meeting is on the Thursday 13th of November. Autumn has arrived in full force, the nights are creeping in, the leaves are falling fast, and the air is thick with that unmistakable scent of damp earth and woodsmoke. The veil between our world and the next is thinning once more... and, wouldn't you know it, sightings of the Quainton ghost carriage are reportedly on the rise!

Despite these seasonal vibes, your Parish Council remains firmly grounded continuing our work on good governance and pushing ahead with the strategic objectives we've set for the remainder of 2025.

After a short period of works and a healthy dose of investment, our Upper Street Play Park has now reopened!

We've resurfaced parts of the play area to help keep children and young people safe, installed exciting new equipment, and retired some of the older, well-loved pieces that had seen better days. A huge thank you to the Fireworks Committee for their incredible £10,000 donation, part of a total investment of £27,500. We'll continue to invest in our village facilities, with further improvements already planned for next year's budget.

Wait – there is more good news! At our recent Full Council meeting, I was thrilled to put forward a motion to provide £7,000 of funding for our local community groups. The Quainton Community Group Fund will launch in April 2026, with application details released in January 2026. Any group in the parish of Quainton can apply for up to £1,400, a fantastic opportunity to support the amazing work happening across our village. This comes at a time when our Community Boards have faced a whopping 80% cut to their budgets, so this fund is more important than ever.

Rest assured, as long as I lead the Parish Council, we will continue to fight for a fair deal for our community. That's a promise!

As part of the Council's ongoing plan to improve our village and support our community, Quainton Parish Council contractors will be out removing weeds and tidying our roads following a very warm summer. The work will take place on Thursday 23rd October on Lower Street and Station Road, and on Friday 24th October on Upper Street and The Green, between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm. We kindly ask residents to park away from your homes where possible while the work is underway. These dates are subject to change, and the Council will keep residents updated. We are also exploring alternative parking arrangements to make things easier for everyone. Thank you for your patience and support as we continue to keep Quainton looking its best!

I'm pleased to share an update on Quainton's 4-Year Plan. While it has taken some time to develop, the Council will review and formally approve the plan on Thursday 30th October 2025. Even after this date, Councillors will still be able to propose amendments where needed, ensuring the plan remains flexible and responsive. I'm also happy to reveal the title of the plan: "Working for Quainton: Preserving What Matters, Preparing for Tomorrow", which reflects our commitment to protecting what we value while preparing Quainton for its role over the next four years and beyond.

I'm pleased to confirm that, after working closely with HS2, the planting of daffodils on Station Road will now take place following the realignment. This is fantastic news, and I look forward to seeing the daffodils brighten our village in the spring. Our approach with HS2 has shifted to one of constructive collaboration and mitigation, rather than opposing every change. By working together, we achieve tangible, positive results and I hope all stakeholders will agree that this collaborative approach is the way forward after years of stagnation.

Exciting news for green-fingered residents - our Quainton Allotments are being reviewed! There are currently five plots available, still very reasonably priced. If you're interested, please contact Cllr Martin Pacetti or the Parish Clerk, who can guide you through the application process. Allotmenteers should also note that our terms and conditions are under review. No major changes are planned, but we will ensure all communications are sent out well in advance of any revisions.


A new team is now in place! Portfolio holders have been updated no major changes, but here's the latest:







## Ramblings from Finemere Wood by Charlotte Karmali, Volunteer Warden Illustrations by Sean Rathborne – instagram @seanrathborne\_art

Autumn sees a dwindling number of woodland workers; exotic holidays, health issues and new pastures call. It is a fitting time to be absent, for the daunting task ahead, removing a

> fence spanning 100 square metres, entangled in fourteen years of relentless growth is no mean feat.

There is much to admire as we venture into the undergrowth, carefully unravelling the fence metre by metre from the grasp of winding honeysuckle, vicious brambles and spiny blackthorn. Berries are in abundance

this year: glossy clusters of rich red haws, dusky

purple sloes with their frosted bloom, succulent blackberries, and bright orange rose hips, all adding vibrant colours to the foliage. Delicate fungi, with their mysterious and colourful forms, are scattered across the forest floor.

The volunteers emerge from the thicket for tea and cake, others not fit to work, join us for this cherished ritual of rest and connection. Amongst this gathering we have the Cataract Club, the Cancer Support Circle and the Pre-diabetic Posse (are my cakes to blame?). And in this place so special, away from the chaos of the outside world, we offer one another support, laughter and a sense of belonging.

Above us, the wind rustles through the branches of the oak tree. Sunlight shines through the leaves displaying a mosaic of galls, red disks of silk-button galls, flat discs of spangle galls and the round woody cherry oak galls. We are captivated by this natural spectacle.

> With a sigh of relief, the last sections of fencing are extracted, prickly branches are untangled from clothing and we gather to bid farewell to two of our own as they set off on new adventures. Husband and wife, Chris and Sue, have been at the very heart of our team. Sue has been amongst us for a decade and her vibrant presence and joyful spirit have made her a delight to work with.

Her many years of conservation experience, both here at Finemere and beyond, have brought immense value to the team. From fencing and

scything to hedge-laying and coppicing, her wide range of skills has played a vital role in what we've achieved. Five years after Sue joined, Chris became part of the team and, from day one, has worked like a trojan, always ready to take on any task with quiet determination and never shying away from hard graft.

On a personal note, both Chris and Sue have been an incredible support to me as team leader. Their dependability, encouragement and reassuring presence have meant more than words can say. # November Edition 2025 - HS2 in Quainton

We are pleased to tell you that our HS2 Autumn Newsletters have just been published for the Aylesbury and Calvert areas. They provide updates on the HS2 re-set, works in your area and local community projects EKFB/HS2 have delivered. You can download a copy of our current Autumn newsletters online:

#### Works in your area:

Progress on structures, roads and earthworks, is progressing well. The 880m long Thame Valley Viaduct, which will carry HS2 across the River Thame now has almost 60% of the concrete deck poured and 170 of the 716 concrete parapet sections now installed. The infill and water proofing works for culverts including Cranwell Farm and Fleet Marston are ongoing.

Along the realigned A41 and Old Bicester Road, works are starting to install the permanent road signage and other utility works. These are scheduled for November.

We are making good progress with the permanent landscaping earth bunds at Bicester Road embankment and Waddesdon embankment. These bunds are built reusing material excavated from the Calvert area of the project.

One of the best ways to see the progress we are making on site is from our aerial footage. Scan the QR code to view the latest HS2 works in your area.



#### Upcoming and ongoing works:

- Along the A41 Bicester Road, permanent road signage installation and finishing works will be completed during November 2025. These works will necessitate periods of traffic management on the new A41 Bicester Road and narrowed section of Old Bicester Road.
- The Grendon Underwood Public Right of Way (GUN 28) will remain open every Sunday as follows: 1 October to 31 March 8am to 4pm, and 1 April to 30 September 8am to 7pm.
- Station Road South will be closed from 20 October 2025 to 19 December 2025 for the western tie-in of the new alignment of Station Road.
- Station Road North, 2-way lights in place to safely manage the traffic flow and will continue until the eastern side of the new road realignment which leads onto Fiddlers Field Road, opens at the end of January 2026.
- The closure on Shipton Lee to enable the alignment of the new road over the new Edgcott Road overbridge will be completed by end April 2026.
- Fiddlers Field will remain closed until the new Station Road re-alignment opens in April 2026.
