# WELCOME FROM HOLY CROSS & ST MARY'S CHURCH



Dear friends,

I had an interesting experience a couple of weeks back and I'm convinced I was given a message from God to the village! No, I'm not insane or past it – I really believe that something remarkable has happened. Let me explain.

Most Tuesday mornings I meet with the Schorne Team clergy – these represent the eleven churches we have in our team of villages around us. We meet to catch up on news and say some prayers together. On this particular morning, Janet, in whose

home we were meeting, shared with us a Bible verse that meant a lot to her. It was Jeremiah chapter 29 verse 11: "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

What she could not know was that under my woollen jumper I was wearing a T-shirt with that Bible verse written on it in BIG letters! I lifted my jumper to reveal the verse. Just coincidence you might think. However, the following evening somebody shared in our Lent Group at the Rectory that a Bible verse had meant so much to them over the last few years since their husband sadly died. She held up a postcard with the same Bible verse written on it – Jeremiah 29:11. I lifted my jumper again to reveal the T-shirt.

But that wasn't it. The next morning, Sarah and I were listening to our daily devotional prayer and Bible reading APP, Lectio 365, and the speaker quoted the verse again – Jeremiah 29:11. Three completely unrelated incidents over three consecutive days, all highlighting the same verse. I came to the conclusion God might want to say something to me! But that's not all.

On that Wednesday evening at our Lent Group, we were reading the story about Jesus calming the storm from the fisherman's boat on the sea – it's in the Gospel of Mark chapter 4. The next evening, I was upstairs and heard an almighty crash. I thought somebody was breaking into the house. Molly, our German Shepherd, was startled too. As I came down the stairs, the large picture we have hanging on the wall, with a large glass pane covering it, had crashed to the floor – but it was standing upright and the glass and fragile wooden frame were not damaged at all. The picture is by John Hamilton and is called, "Master Of The Storms." It's depicts a scene with Jesus standing in the boat on a stormy sea, calming the storm. Mark chapter 4.

The message of hope from Jeremiah and the message of peace in the storm from Mark's gospel is not just for me! I'm convinced this story of hope is for all of us if we will grasp it.

Hello everyone!



# **HOPE LODGE**

Pictured is an Honours Board listing the names of members who served as Noble Grandmaster (Presiding Officer) of a Lodge (branch) of the Manchester Unity of Oddfellows. Before the establishment of the Welfare State the Oddfellows was the largest friendly society in the world, providing unemployment, sickness and death benefits, pensions and other financial assistance in times of need, plus medical treatment for members and their dependants. At its peak it had 4,000 branches in UK and was a blueprint for the Welfare State, after the establishment of which it went into gradual decline. Although much smaller now, Oddfellows still exists as a socially active organisation.

The Quainton branch was named Hope Lodge (is there any link with Hope House next to the Memorial Hall?). Meetings were held in the



White Lion in Church Street until that inn's closure when meetings moved to the Saye and Sele in Lower Street. Hope Lodge closed in January 1988 with remaining assets transferred to Aylesbury and later (1990) to the Albert Lodge in Hitchin. An anniversary dinner had been held at the White Lion in 1882 and its Golden Jubilee in 1895.

A few years ago the board was bought at Buckingham Flea Market for £40. The purchaser, discovering its link to Quainton, has donated it to our village and the Memorial Hall trustees have kindly agreed to display it in the committee room.




# **Quainton Support Network**

# Gardening advice for April

- 1. Keep on top of the tiny annual weeds emerging with a hoe. Only hoe on dry days.
- 2. As the very wet winter has washed away most of the nutrients in the ground most plants now need a feed to give them strength and colour, so sprinkle a general fertiliser around them and lightly fork in when the soil is reasonably movable.
- 3. Lift and part large plants using two gardens forks back too back to form and make several plants.
- 4. It is the time to sow most vegetables and plant onion sets.



- 5. Perennials such as bindweed will start to appear big-time now. Dig them out, tracing the roots as far as you can, or train the tip up a bamboo cane and then treat with a suitable weedkiller.
- 6. Give lavender plants a short back and sides with secateurs to snip off old flower stems and shoot tips.
- 7. Check on seeds that can be sown in March and April. Plant out early sown sweet peas.
- 8. Tie in climbing and rambling roses.
- 9. Start planning now what you may be able to grow in order to enter the Quainton Garden Societies Produce Show on September 7th 2024

# RAMBLINGS FROM FINEMERE WOOD: Charlotte Karmali, Volunteer Warden

Despite the never-ending grey and rainy days of recent months, Spring is here, a welcome sight for those of us who are winter-worn. And Finemere Wood is just the place to be to observe the awakening of the wild. Colour is returning. The cheerful, sunny yellows of primroses aplenty along the woodland rides, with brimstone butterflies fluttering past. Purple, tiny dog violets and brilliant white wood anemones, it is a feast for the eyes. Buzzards mew as they soar overhead. Birds are singing throughout the wood, amongst them a chiff chaff, the first I have heard this year. A green woodpecker yaffles and a greater spotted woodpecker drums.

It is the time of year to remove fences. Their job is done, shrubs and trees are now tall enough to thrive, and no longer require protection from deer. The window to do this is small, cutting back vegetation must stop now that birds will begin to nest. The volunteers work at breakneck speed to dismantle as many fences as they can. It is hefty work, involving much brutal bramble tussling, and squelching in murky mud. There are grumblings as endless fencing panels are carried around the site, I gather this is not a favourite task.





The greater spotted woodpecker (*Dendrocopos major*) makes its presence known as it hammers its beak against a trunk at lightning speed. In contrast to the melodious songs of other birds, drumming hard and loud is how this creature hopes to attract a mate. Both male and female will drum to defend their territory, choosing hard dead branches to create a deep resonating sound, and together the breeding pair will

excavate a hole in a tree in which to make their nest.

Catching a glimpse of these handsome birds is far more challenging, as they conceal themselves so expertly in amongst the trees. A striking black and white, with a bright red lower belly patch, the male can be distinguished by the red cap on the back of his head. Eating larvae of wood-eating insects, nuts and seeds, Dendrocopos major can be tempted to the garden bird feeder.

Thankful I am to these Spring delights of blooms, warbles and percussive excellence as they distract the woodland workers from the discomfort and tedium of lugging fencing materials back and forth. Dare I tell them it will be more of the same the next time we meet?

## April Edition 2024 - HS2 in Quainton

This planting season, EKFB donated surplus planting stock from the HS2 project to local community spaces and schools. In February, we donated young trees to several organisations and schools, including Waddesdon Primary School, Quainton Combined School, Whitchurch Community Woodland, Hedgerow Havens, Stone Primary, and William Harding School. The plants were delivered in the last week of February and will be put to good use in these schools, to thicken existing hedges or to create new features.

Last month, we helped promote our charity of the year PACE with their sponsored dog walk event. PACE provide life changing support to children with neurodisabilities, helping them to achieve independent mobility. The 'Winter Waggle' event, based at

the Waddesdon Manor Estate, was attended by EKFB staff from several compounds, raising over £600 in additional sponsorship.

HS2 Ltd has announced a one million tonne milestone, referencing the amount of materials moved via its freight trains from an Aylesbury Vale base. A small railhead near Quainton has helped HS2 take the equivalent of 101,000 HGV movements off Bucks roads. From the hub in Quainton, 646 trains have been carrying heavy items that would have otherwise moved between roads in Buckinghamshire, Oxfordshire, and Northamptonshire.


