#### WELCOME FROM HOLY CROSS & ST MARY'S CHURCH



Dear friends,

I think it's true that we all have things that irritate us! For me, middle lane drivers on the motorway, potholes(!), trolleys at the supermarket where one wheel has a mind of its own, the table at a restaurant that has the wobbles, more potholes(!). I must confess, I do get irritated by people who say they don't believe in God when they have never actually taken the time to explore the historical, archaeological and mathematical evidence for themselves. For me, the question as to whether there is a God or not is the most important question of our time. If He exists,

it changes everything. If He doesn't, we are all a product of random chance without any ultimate purpose other than to do the best we can, while we have our limited time on earth.

The Easter story according to Christians is astounding. It is also an essential and core belief in the life and work of the church and the faith of Christians. If anybody came up with credible evidence showing that Jesus was never raised from the dead, the worldwide church would collapse.

One of the many people who set out to disprove the resurrection and thus the Christian faith was a lawyer named Frank Morrison. Using his clever legal skills, he examined all the evidence he could find, including the writings of eye witness accounts, and the testimony of ancient historians writing at the time of Christ. He ended up publishing his findings in a book called, "Who Moved The Stone?" in which he confesses that he had become a Christian after being convinced from the evidence that Jesus did actually come back to life again on Easter Sunday.

Lee Strobel was a top flight investigative journalist. He also set out to disprove Christianity and interviewed scientists, archaeologists, historians and theologians in his quest to discredit Christian belief. He also ended up becoming a Christian and has since written a series of books the first of which was entitled, "The Case For Christ."

Dr Francis Collins is an eminent scientist who led research to decode human DNA as director of the National Human Genome Research Institute, yet he converted from atheism to Christianity after reading several books by C.S. Lewis including, "Mere Christianity." On becoming a Christian, he says, "I had made a decision to reject any faith view of the world without ever really knowing what it was that I had rejected. And I was supposed to be a scientist!"

Whatever view you take on the issue, Easter time is a great opportunity to explore the facts because if it's true, it has a huge implication for us today and gives us great hope for the future.





# Quainton Windmill Society Fiftieth Anniversary 1974-2024

Fifty years ago residents of Quainton met and agreed to try to save our windmill, which had been derelict for over 85 years. As can be seen in the photo below, the mill was in a dreadful state. Three sails and the fantail had fallen off, the cap was open to the elements and many of the floors inside had partially collapsed.



In *May 1974* they agreed to set up the Quainton Windmill Society with the objective of restoring the mill. Over the last fifty years there has been several restorations and much ongoing maintenance to provide a community asset and visitor experience.

#### Life in the Mill Prior to 1974

1832 - Built by James Anstiss, an ancester of Colin Dancer who still owns the windmill.

For 48 Years - powered by the wind from 1832-80 and operated by the Anstiss family.

For Nine Years - converted to steam power from 1880-89. It was adapted for steam to increase its productivity. Milling was abandoned because flour roller mills had become established.

**85 Years** – The building became redundant and gradually deteriorated from 1889 to 1974.



#### GARDENING ADVICE FOR FEB/MAR

- 1. As the weather has been so wet, try not to get on the ground too soon just because the sun may be shining but the soil still needs to be warmed up by keeping it moving.
- 2. Mow your lawn but keep the mower adjusted to high.
- 3. Divide Snowdrops.
- 4. Sow seeds for early salad crops and spring flowers. Sow either in a greenhouse or in the ground under a cloche.
- 5. Rake up any leaves left from winter. Feed and weed the lawn ready for its first cut.
- 6. Clear your veg beds. Fertilize to encourage good growth in the coming weeks.
- 7. Prune roses and other perennials.
- 8. If you have a greenhouse, give it a good clean. And sharpen your tools.
- 9. Plan now what you may be able to grow in order to enter the Garden Societies Show of Produce on September 7th 2024.
- 10. Order your dahlias.

#### The late DENIS ALCOCK

Born in Aylesbury on 21st November 1934, Denis was educated at Queens Park School. He worked for many years at Rivets, marrying Doreen in the late 1950s. With their two children, Stephen and Joy, they lived in Upper Street before divorcing in the late 1980s.

Leaving Rivets, Denis became a chauffeur for Arrowtax Executive Car Hire where he met Gillian. They married in 1999, living first in Aylesbury before moving to Northend Road, Quainton. Denis always dressed smartly and transported several celebrities, notably Bob Monkhouse, during his driving work. Denis was in the Radio 2 studios the evening Gill interviewed her idol Justin Hayward on Jameson's Guest Request Spot.

In his early days, Denis was a volunteer at Bucks Railway Centre being close friends with Mick Rolley and David Morrison, who he often chauffeured in David's position as Oral B's chief executive. With another friend, Jim Horwood, Denis belonged to Buffs, the Royal Antedeluvian order of the Buffalos. After his laryngectomy in 2015, Denis could no longer wear a tie. He found speaking difficult and consequently his self-confidence suffered, which, in turn, lessened his social life, although he often visited friends at The Fountain Inn, Steeple Claydon until Gill's stroke led to the cancellation of her driving licence.

In his latter months, Denis was in and out of hospital, passing away in Stoke Mandeville, aged 89, on December 28th 2023. R I P.





#### **Quainton Wild Garden News:**

Quainton's Wild Garden is situated at the very end of Church Street, past the church, round the bend and then through the gate off the driveway to The Old School House.

#### A bit of history for those residents who haven't been in the village long:

In August 1986, with permission from the then churchwardens, I assembled a group of villagers in the derelict area below the church to clear the area of rubbish, docks and brambles in order to start creating a small wildflower meadow and village amenity.

Then, in the October, again villagers of all ages with wellies, forks and wheelbarrows bent their backs continuing to clear the two-thirds of an acre while excavators tackled the job of digging out the 12ft wide pond linked to the stream which runs through the garden and building the steps up to the churchyard.

The project was Highly Commended in the 1987 Bucks Village Ventures competition and the following year a grant of £300 was won from the Shell 'Better Britain' Campaign, which helped with the purchase of a lawnmower, seeds and plants. From then on work parties met twice a year to maintain the area which was visited by the Brownies and Beavers for activities, pond watchers and people just enjoying sitting in a peaceful place. Attempts at creating a wildflower meadow sadly proved difficult as the heavy clay soil is far too fertile for wildflowers. But new trees were planted, log piles created, and bird boxes put up, and we now have an offer of an insect habitat.

Unfortunately, Covid had a serious effect and the working parties stopped although a path was regularly mown through the garden.

Now 38 years later, I am no longer able to physically help which also applies to many of the past helpers, and many are no longer with us or have moved. In order to continue looking after the garden a new team of volunteers is needed to help preserve this area so if you are interested in wildlife, want some outdoor exercise, PLEASE think about joining us on Saturday 23rd March 10-12. Refreshments provided. Rakes and pruners useful.



#### RAMBLINGS FROM FINEMERE WOOD: Charlotte Karmali, Volunteer Warden

Mud, mud glorious mud. If you feel the need to wade and wallow in gloopy, sticky, slippery mud, Finemere is the place to be. There has been so much rain over recent months, natural ponds have appeared in dips in the footways and many of the paths through the wood present challenges to even the sure-footed. And yet the volunteers struggle on regardless.

As we wait in anticipation of Spring, and its biotic boom, energies are channelled to managing great thickets of blackthorn. Out on the edge of the Finemere meadows, a footpath meanders through an area of relatively new woodland, planted some 20 years ago. Blackthorn (Prunus spinosa) grows densely along much of the path, blocking out sunlight, it is becoming dark and gloomy. The trees are slender and very tall, their upper branches twisted and entwined with adjacent plants. There is little growth at the base of the blackthorn.

Amidst this entangled jungle of fiercely thorny vegetation, the woodland workers slip and slosh in mud as they lay a section of Prunus spinosa. Partially cutting through the stem a few inches above the ground, allows the tree to be pushed over on to an ever-growing pile of fallen blackthorn. This is conservation laying, the benefits of which are numerous.

The blackthorn trees are given a new lease of life. From the cut stems, new shoots explode, providing young growth where the rare brown







hairstreak butterfly may lay its eggs. The trees will continue to flower, and produce sloes, despite their horizontal stance, feeding many a wild thing. The interwoven pile of Prunus spinosa is now a thick, compact hedge where birds will nest and small mammals will live, protected from predators by a thick mesh of thorns. And, the path, no longer shadowed by tall trees, will be bathed in sunlight allowing flowers and grasses to bloom, biodiversity will soar.

> Mission accomplished, the volunteers stagger through the mud, limbs aching from wrestling tangled, spiky branches. Dishevelled, damp and grimy, they look a sorry state. But still they smile and laugh and I don't doubt they will be back for more of the same in a couple of weeks.






