Dear friends,

Have you ever played Jenga? Players take turns removing one block at a time from a tower constructed of wooden blocks. As a block is removed, it is then placed on top of the tower, creating a progressively more unstable structure. The player causing the tower to collapse loses the game.

We are living in troubling times. The eruption of violent conflict in the Middle East raises another shadow over the world where so many innocent people are suffering unimaginable hardship

and pain. So many challenges threatening to disrupt our lives are colliding all at once. The ongoing war in Ukraine; cataclysmic events around the world; earthquakes in unexpected places; devastating floods; unprecedented heat waves causing terrible forest fires threatening people and their homes; dramatic and unpredictable weather patterns; and then, of course, war and unrest in many other parts of the world where many marginalised people groups are suffering untold grief and devastation. Closer to home, we have the seemingly unstoppable flow of illegal immigrants arriving on our shores, together with people smugglers exploiting innocent people for their own financial gain, and then there is the ongoing upheaval in the financial markets and instability in our political system.

One by one we remove the blocks in the Jenga 'game of life', and create an unstable world where nothing is certain anymore.

Larry Norman, a rock ringer, famous for his song, "I Wish We'd All Been Ready", released an album way back in the 70's called "Only Visiting This Planet." A verse from one of the songs on the album "Peace Pollution, Revolution" was prophetic. It goes like this:

"The water is polluted and the air is filled with death Someday it won't be easy to stop and catch your breath But it's all in Revelation, it's part of the design And if you're truly wise, you'll keep your eyes on Palestine"

He was dropping a huge hint that what is predicted in the Bible is coming true before our eyes. The Middle East is not only the place God chose to break into time and space 2000 years ago, it's also the location of his second big entry, to put a stop to all this Jenga type madness!

On Remembrance Sunday, we will take time to honour those who paid the ultimate sacrifice and those who bear the scars of conflict. Please pray with me, that those living with pain, anxiety and stress, may find peace in the one who said, "My peace I leave with you... Let not your heart be troubled, neither let them be afraid." (John 14) One of the songs we sing in our Community Choir is "Donna Nobis Pachem" - "Grant Us Peace." May you and all those you love and care for, know this peace today.

#### **Quainton Support Network**

Just an update on the support network

Currently, the main use of the support network is providing transport for older people who no longer drive. The bus service is still just about running but it is difficult to get to hospital or dental appointments by public transport. The NHS does provide patient transport for some people.

The support network relies on volunteers from the village driving people to their appointment, so it can be pot luck if someone is available. Recipients pay petrol expenses at the government agreed rate to the volunteer driver and cover any parking fees if necessary. The administrators will let you know how much to give the driver.

There is a volunteer driver scheme in Aylesbury Vale but it does not cover Quainton. (Seen advertised on the Village Facebook page)

More volunteers are needed as people are busy so the more we have the more chance of finding someone free to take someone.

If you cannot get a lift to an appointment by family, friends or public transport then please call either Claire 655552 or Alison 655033 and we will try and find someone to take you – we are usually successful.

This support network would not run without the administrators or the lovely volunteer drivers.

**PLANNING APPLICATION STATION ROAD BRIDGE:** A planning application (23/03059/APP) has been submitted for the proposed temporary infilling of the three railway arches at Quainton Road Overbridge and within the adjoining field to the south west a temporary vehicle access from Station Road and a temporary site compound for construction purposes. This will allow for Station Road to be reopened with no weight restrictions.

**ROAD CLOSURES:** Due to road closures constantly changing it is impossible to keep up to date via printed media like Quainton News. We recommend people keep checking the internet on https://one.network. Ward Cllr Phil Gomm will inform you via Quainton Village Life on Facebook.

**KEEP REPORTING:** Potholes continue to be reported via FixMyStreet and continue to follow up with Buckinghamshire Council on the list of roads that need repairing. Please keep reporting and let us know if there are concerns.

**PLAYGROUND:** We have ordered the new piece of equipment for the playground which should be installed soon.


**ROSEFIELD SOLAR FARM CONSULTATION 2023:** A public consultation for a new solar farm of 2,100 acres in Steeple Claydon is open until 10 November 2023. Two meetings are being held, which will provide you with more information:

- Wednesday 1st November 7pm-9pm at Calvert Green Village Hall
- Friday 3rd November from 7pm-9pm at Steeple Claydon Village Hall

Both of these sessions will be presented by the Claydon Action group with a Q&A session.





#### Roy Moran 29.12.1943 - 13.09.2023

Roy Moran sadly lost his battle with cancer in September. His wife Bridget wanted to share a few words about him here:

Roy was born in Southcourt, Aylesbury, on 29th December 1943. His dad was a Great and Second World War veteran. At the age of 16, his dad had joined up as a Sherwood Forester and was wounded during the Somme Offensive. Roy's mum had worked in service and later was a chargehand at the Cow & Gate factory.

He went to Ceely Road primary school and then onto the Grange and Quarrendon secondary schools. On leaving school, he obtained an engineering apprenticeship with Aylesbury



Automation, part of the Rivets Group, which included study for five years at Aylesbury College. His next job, which he absolutely loved, was producing kit cars for the SIVA Motor Company based off the Gatehouse Road, Aylesbury. Sadly, the company folded after a few years and in 1976, thanks to Philip Roberts, Roy joined CBS Manufacturing at their old Chamberlain Road record factory, working as a Maintenance Engineer and transferring to the new Rabans Lane plant, which later became Sony Music.

Engineering was both an occupation and a passion for Roy. On retirement in 2008, he readily joined up with the team down at the Railway Centre on Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays, enjoying a great craic with Murray, Alan, Adrian, Vickie and Richard. Before that, in the 1970s and 80s Roy had also been one of the volunteers with the Quainton Windmill Society working to restore the iconic mill to working order. Furthermore, in the early 70s, Roy built a Lotus Seven sports car, which we had and enjoyed for several years. Whilst it was not the most comfortable of cars, that doesn't matter when you're young!

Roy's many other projects included building a traction engine steam lorry, a crossbow, and a navy colt gun. He still found time to be a member up at Chiltern Forest Golf Club and Wescott Archery Club. Roy was a man of many and varied interests. We worked together on our allotment and garden. He learned to play the banjo and, proud of his Irish roots, he also played the bodhrän (pronounced boran), an Irish drum. At family get togethers, many a happy evening was spent in jigs and reels!





He was a voracious reader, notably history. Another of his passions was motor cycling and his absolute pride and joy was his Harley Davidson. We also had a tandem, which we rode around "The Snake", our neighbour Phil would always tell me when he was about to change gears, but not Roy who had me hanging on for dear life! When I married Roy, my best friend also married a G.I. Years later, when we were both fifty, I asked "What did Tom get you for your birthday?" "A diamond bracelet," she said, "and a new car... What did Roy get you?" "A Shirley Bassey tape." "But Bridget," responded Roy, "you love Shirley Bassey!" I think he missed the point, don't you? Roy loved the village, and we could not have lived anywhere better.

I would like to give a heart felt thanks to everyone for their help, kindness and support to Roy and myself over the months. The donations made in Roy's memory to Florence Nightingale Hospice came to £723.30. Many thanks to all, Love Bridget x

#### Community Heritage Orchard & Wildflower Meadow, Lee Road

The project started as a lockdown idea and with the support, hard work and donations from many residents and village groups, Hedgerow Havens, BBOWT, the Haddenham and Waddesdon Community Board and the Parish Council, wildflowers have been sown and trees planted.

In the orchard there is a mix of apple, crab apple, plum, pear and greengage trees and round the corner of the little copse there is a Victoria plum and a mulberry tree. In the meadow there are a range of wildflowers. Wildflowers are audited by volunteers and bees are monitored and recorded by Kath. Maybe next year butterflies and moths and bats seen/heard will be recorded. We have had the offer of borrowing a bat monitor. A red oak, planted by the Prideaux family, to commemorate the life of Prince Philip, has red leaves this year and nearby is a parish council bench commemorating the life of Queen Elizabeth II. Other trees planted by volunteers are growing well in the little copse.

Recently, the orchard has received a donation of £70 for a tree, plaque and general maintenance. The Village Society and the Gardening Society have donated money for pear and apple trees. The drama group kindly donated money towards the maintenance of the orchard and meadow. Picnic benches, two other benches and a strimmer were purchased following receipt of a grant from Haddenham and Waddesdon Community Board. The Vale Conservation Volunteers have helped with thistle and ragwort clearing – a constant battle. The Beavers came along with their leaders, parents and grandparents to help pull some thistles and top up the wood chips.

The apple pressing day in September run by Paul Robertson and supported by Michelle, Peter and Ruth, plus the Lucas

family and Laura allowed us to press local apples to make delicious juice. The raffle and craft stall raised money for the project. Thank you to everyone who supported this event, particularly Carol who made beautiful knitted toys, Ruth who made the chutneys and jams, and Pete for the wooden chopping boards and games. Many thanks to Darren and George at the coffee shop and the pub for providing raffle prizes, plus electricity and water and their continued support. With donations and fundraising we hope to purchase an information board for the area.






#### What's next?

#### RAMBLINGS FROM FINEMERE WOOD: Charlotte Karmali, Volunteer Warden

October and the temperature rises to an unseasonable 22 degrees. You could be fooled into thinking that summer is still with us. But leaves are turning from fresh greens to deep warm autumnal reds and yellows as they float graciously to the ground. The sun is low and its rays are gentle, warm, and golden. There is no doubt that we are slipping into autumn. October 2023, ten years since the Finemere Volunteer Work Party was created.



With the summer task of scything and raking grassy areas completed, and the winter job of clearing scrub yet to begin, the volunteers busy themselves with removing fences from protected areas. As targeted sections of vegetation are cleared during the Winter months, fences are erected around these spaces to protect the new growth from being devoured by deer. After 3-5 years of growth, the trees and bushes are of a size that they can now fend for themselves, and thus the fences are removed.

The bramble bushes are alive with red admiral butterflies, more plentiful than ever before, feeding

on the juice of over-ripe blackberries. **Vanessa atlanta** is a handsome creature. Its wings are black velvet, intersected by distinct red bands and with a scattering of white spots. The underwings resemble tree bark, providing great camouflage when the wings are closed.

Seen anywhere in the UK, in a wide range of habitats, the majority of red admirals spotted are European migrants. Arriving in May and June, they produce just one brood of offspring from mid-August and into October. Eggs are laid upon stinging nettles, the host plant. A few of these butterflies manage to hibernate through our winter and thus there is a small resident population, mainly in the South of England. These beauties provide a welcome distraction as the woodland workers heft fencing panels around the site.

But there is work to be done. Fences must be removed. Honeysuckle is entwined through wire netting, securing panels firmly to the ground. Brambles, with fearsome thorns, encompass the metal, ready to attack those who approach. With protective gear, the valiant





volunteers venture forth, releasing the fencing panels from the powerful grip of these vigorous plants. The wood becomes one again, no evidence of human intervention remains.



#### **HS2** in Ouainton

At EKFB and HS2, we are always seeking opportunities to engage with and inspire young people about the project. In September, we hosted a wall mural painting competition with 12 students from Buckinghamshire College. In preparation, the students were able to visit the site and see the scale of the engineering up close and speak to our staff on the ground. Each of the teams designs were created and presented to a panel of judges and the winning design chosen and painted. This stunning art installation is sure

to motivate and inspire our staff. Thank you to the students and everyone involved at Buckinghamshire College.

In October, we will be progressing with the excavation works. We will be excavating near the Waddesdon Greenway crossing in October, where the new railway route crosses the existing footway.

Consequently, we must temporarily divert the Waddesdon Greenway while works are being undertaken. While we build the temporary diversion, Waddesdon Greenway will be closed for approximately five days in October. During that time, there will be no access across the HS2 worksite via Waddesdon Greenway.

Elsewhere in our construction programme, in October we will also be continuing works for the first phase of the A41 realignment.

- On the A41 between Waddesdon and the Blackgrove Road junction, there will be traffic management between 16-21 October between 9:30am and 3:30pm. This will also involve a closure of the layby next to the worksite. This is to enable utility works in connection with the A41 realignment.
- On Blackgrove Road, our temporary 2-way traffic lights will remain in place at the plant crossing point.
- On the Waddesdon Greenway cycle path and bridleway, we will be closing the path for five days between 23-27 October while we construct a diversion to enable the public to continue to use this route across the HS2 worksite.

Please note, these dates may change due to conditions outside of our control. Please refer to the HS2 website regularly to check for any changes and updates or to view the detailed Advanced Works Notification.


