Dear Friends,

I get very bored with the predictable but seem to get caught out every time. For instance, I usually get the only table in the café with one leg shorter than the rest. I'm the one who grabs the trolley at the supermarket with wheels that go in opposite directions! I love iced buns, but whenever I remove the cellophane packaging, the icing sticks to it! If I'm in a hurry to get somewhere, I always get stuck behind a slow vehicle!

The Christmas story is all about an unpredictable God, doing something outrageous that no-one suspected – apart from a few wise men. The God who created the universe, decided to

break into time and space as a fragile baby, born in a backstreet stable in an obscure town called Bethlehem. No grand entry. No red carpet. No stretch limo. No formal cavalcade from the airport under police escort. Why would God do that? It wasn't long before the big plan became clear.

The surprising story of Christmas grabs my attention every year. It gives me hope, that even in a broken and uncertain world, there is a God who longs to break in to our lives in surprising and unpredictable ways, to enable us to see a bigger picture.

Did you know? Union Jack v Union Flag

It was lovely to see the Union Flag on the church over Remembrance, but did you know the origins of the flag's name?

The Union Flag, or Union Jack, is the national flag of the United Kingdom. 'Union' because it combines the crosses of the three countries united under one Sovereign – England and Wales, Scotland and Ireland (although since 1921 only Northern Ireland has been a part of the United Kingon). The Welsh dragon does not appear because when it was created in 1606, the Principality of Wales by that time was already united with England.

The origin of the term 'Union Jack' is uncertain. One possibility is that Charles II said that the Union Flag should be flown only by ships of the Royal Navy as a 'jack', a small flag at the bowsprit. It has been claimed that the Union Flag should be described as the Union Jack only when flown on the bows of a Royal Navy ship. However, in 1902 an Admiralty Circular announced that either 'Union Flag' or 'Union Jack' could be used officially for a flag used on land.

Also, did you know that it is possible to fly the Union Jack incorrectly by displaying it upside down? The official meaning of flying the flag upside down is a signal of distress, especially in a maritime context, but it's often done by accident because many people do not know! To display it correctly, the thicker white diagonal stripe should be in the top-left corner, closest to the flagpole.





Dear Residents,

Winter has well and truly settled in. My mornings now begin with the traditional ritual of pretending I'll leave the house on time, followed swiftly by the realisation that my windscreen apparently freezes faster than anywhere else in Buckinghamshire. If you see me scraping away at 7am, just nod knowingly.

Despite these challenges, we remain resolute in providing good governance at Quainton Parish Council during this winter period.

It was brilliant to see such an incredible turnout at the Harvest Auction, and the fundraising total was even better news. I'm delighted that the proceeds will be put to good use supporting our valued community groups.

Quainton Bonfire Night was once again a huge success. It was fantastic to see the village lit up against such a glorious backdrop, and the music certainly helped set the scene as we welcomed the colder months with a spectacular fireworks display. As Leader and Chair of the Parish Council, I want to give my wholehearted thanks to the team for putting together yet another smashing evening; it really was a night to remember.

Of course, events like this always come with their challenges. We'll be reviewing the parking arrangements for next year, though I have to say, watching people attempting to park while juggling hot chocolate and sparklers certainly added to the spectacle! Plenty

of notice was given, and arrangements were in place, but it seems some of us prefer to test our parallel parking skills under pressure.

I am thrilled to officially confirm that a contractor has been appointed and that all the formal mechanisms are now in place to get the MUGA construction underway. When I became Leader and Chair, I promised that we would have the logistics sorted before the end of the year and I'm delighted to say we've kept that promise!

Residents can now look forward to seeing the MUGA take shape, with completion expected, hopefully, by next summer. It's exciting to think that very soon, our community will have a fantastic new space for sports, activities and plenty of fun.


I recently announced the launch of a new community support fund. The Council has now resolved to rename it to avoid confusion with another scheme, and it will be known as the Quainton Parish Council Community Fund. The fund will open for applications in January, with up to £1,400 available to successful applicants in its first year. This fund will rise with inflation and be topped up over time, starting at £7,000 in year one and growing to around £12,500 by the end of this Council's term. We will be releasing further information about the fund, including guidance on how to apply, before the Christmas holidays.

I would like to provide an update on the Parish Council's opening hours over the Christmas period. To give our hardworking Clerk a well-deserved rest over the festive season, Quainton Parish Council will be closed from 19th December to 6th January. During this time, only emergency matters will be acknowledged and normal services will resume in the New Year.





Buckinghamshire Best Kept Village Award

As we are all aware, Quainton is a fantastic village and a lovely place to live with great amenities and a rural Buckinghamshire location. Quainton Parish Council has decided to enter the village into the Buckinghamshire Best Kept Village competition in 2026 as it is an excellent reason for everyone in the village to join together with a common goal and make the village look its best.

The Bucks Best Kept Village Competition was founded in 1957 as an initiative driven by Sir Francis Dashwood and the Local Councils' Association. The Competition's objective is to encourage entrants to work together as a community, involving all age groups, to make villages and towns more attractive places, not only for residents but also for visitors.

Judging normally takes place between 1st June and the middle of July. The results are usually announced at the end of July or early August. Judges inspect villages for overall neatness, cleanliness and community effort. They look at a wide range of public areas and facilities, which include:

- Children's play areas, village greens and parks
- Community facilities like village and church halls
- Condition of verges, ditches, and ponds
- Litter and environmental presentation

- Floral displays
- Local shops and pubs
- The War Memorial
- Noticeboards and public seating

Ramblings from Finemere Wood by Charlotte Karmali, Volunteer Warden

The winter tools are out, and the work of clearing scrub and trees begins again. Bit by bit, with determination and the quiet joy that only a sharp saw can bring, woodland workers will start opening up the targeted areas, making space for new growth when spring returns. They're so efficient and quick in their work that I challenged the team to take on two tasks in our latest session. The first task was to cut a new scallop along the woodland edge, an area we last tackled seven years ago. By rotating the sections that are cut, a mosaic of vegetation at different stages of growth is created, a pattern that supports a rich, resilient biodiversity.

On the woodland floor, hidden amongst the autumnal leaf litter, a remarkable variety of fungi emerge as the small trees are skilfully cleared away. I've become fascinated by fungi, though I can still identify only a few species with confidence. Their world is astonishing: over 15,000 species have been recorded in the UK, with many more yet to be discovered. Mycorrhizal fungi

form vital partnerships with trees, helping them absorb nutrients in exchange for sugars. The fruiting bodies we see are just the surface of a vast underground "wood-wide web", linking plants and trees in a network that shares resources and passes on signals.

The cut wood is stacked into a dead hedge around the newly opened area. Here, saprophytic fungi, the woodland's decomposers, will break down the timber, releasing its nutrients back into the soil where plants and countless creatures can use them. And so the cycle of life begins again.

We move into Long Close Meadow, at the heart of the wood, to prepare the ground for our Christmas gathering of bonfire and potatoes. I normally refuse to think about Christmas before December, but this tradition is the exception, something that all

look forward to. The grass is cut and raked around the bonfire site, and sections of birch and blackthorn are trimmed back to prevent them from encroaching into the meadow. The wood is chopped into manageable pieces. We're ready to go.

Stepping back, we admire the cleared spaces, stacked wood, and ready bonfire site. Each cut and cleared patch contributes to the woodland's health,

supporting its hidden networks of fungi, roots, and wildlife. The Christmas bonfire in turn will support the team's wellbeing, providing a shared moment of warmth and togetherness in the heart of our special wood.


December Edition 2025 - HS2 in Quainton

Construction works updates

During October the steel bridge deck which will carry pedestrians and cyclists travelling along the Waddesdon Greenway between Aylesbury and Waddesdon was delivered to our site. A huge logistical operation was required, with street furniture being removed and traffic management to allow the 5 metre wide sections to fit along the A41 delivery route. The two 20 metre long sections will be lifted into position between the bridge abutments in late November.

Progress on structures, roads and earthworks is continuing at pace.

In October and November, the permanent signage installation began for the A41 realignment, with all new signage posts installed. Some signs are yet to be



fitted to the new posts and we are working with our contractor to complete these works in the new year.

The 880m long Thame Valley Viaduct, which will carry HS2 across the River Thame now has almost 60% of the concrete deck poured and 225 of the 716 concrete parapet sections now installed.

In the north of Waddesdon, the WAD 4 footpath crossing abutment pilecaps have been cast this month.

The HS2 Autumn Newsletters were published in October on the HS2 website for the Aylesbury and Calvert areas. A Winter newsletter focused on our legacy and social value projects will be published in early December, focusing on our school engagement and social value projects we have completed during 2025. - The Grendon Underwood Public Right of Way (GUN 28) will remain open every Sunday as follows: 1 October to 31 March 8am to 4pm, and 1 April to 30 September 8am to 7pm.
- Station Road South continues to be closed until 19 December 2025 for the western tie-in

of the new alignment of Station Road.

- Station Road North, 2-way lights in place to safely manage the traffic flow and will continue until the eastern side of the new road realignment which leads onto Fiddlers Field Road, opens at the end of January 2026.
- The closure on Shipton Lee to enable the alignment of the new road over the new Edgcott Road overbridge will be completed by end April 2026.
- Fiddlers Field will remain closed until the new Station Road re-alignment opens in April 2026.
- In the Waddesdon area, there will be overnight road closures in late January 2026 for the completion of permanent signage installation. The roads affected will be the new A41 Bicester Road, the old narrowed section of Bicester Road and a small section of Blackgrove Road. Dates for these works are subject to confirmation.

Please check the HS2 website for regular updates and note that dates for planned works may change.

Community Engagement activities

The final community drop in event for 2025 will be held on Tuesday 25 November at The Railway Club in Aylesbury from 10.30am to 2.30pm. It will be our last engagement

for this year with a programme of events being planned for 2026. Check the HS2 events page for more information.

We have been working with our supply chain partners CMT to distribute a total of over 100 500g tins of coffee across the Aylesbury area.
