Welcome from Holy Cross & St Mary's Church



Dear friends.

Expectations ran high. The nation held its breath. The heroic Lions battled to the end. Then came the dreaded penalty shootout. On 26th June, 1996, England Manager Terry Venables comforted Gareth Southgate after he missed a penalty, costing England the Semi Finals of the European Cup at Wembley. Global audience: 507million. On the 11th of July, 2021, now England Manager Gareth Southgate comforted Bukayo Saka, after he missed a penalty costing England the Finals of the European Cup at Wembley. Global audience: 845million.

When Gareth, the England Manager, was 16, he joined Crystal Palace, just around the corner from Spurgeon's College where I did my four years theological training. As a member of the youth team, Gareth was told to man up or get out. His manager, Alan Smith, recalls how after losing a match against a British Army Eleven, he spotted Southgate shaking hands with the opposition and thanking them. Smith called him in and said, "Gareth look, if I was you I'd become a travel agent because I don't think football's going to be for you, if you go on like this!"

These days Gareth leads the England Team with superb leadership skills, empathy and courage. They transformed our dreary days, into days of hope with the expectation of glory. So much pressure on them, with the world watching. But consistently he has shown care for the players, win or lose. A minority of the England fans didn't conduct themselves in such a worthy manner as we have seen on social media. Shame on them.

Bukayo Saka, who's penalty kick was saved by the Italian goalkeeper, will have his faith tested in the coming days. He said recently, "I was brought up in a Christian family. This always made me curious to get to know God more and I have done so by reading my Bible a lot and going to church a lot over the years."

Reheem Sterling, who has become one of the nation's heroes during this competition, is also open about his Christian faith often Tweeting Bible verses and statements like "Trust in Him" on Twitter, and has described in interviews how he prays before every match.

Football's history is intimately connected with the church. English clubs such as Everton and Fulham were founded by churches, fans chant songs such as "When the Saints Go Marching In", and the hymn "Abide With Me" is sung before every FA Cup final - the oldest cup competition in the world.

Olivier Giroud, the French forward, attends Holy Trinity, Brompton, the church led by Alpha founder Nicky Gumbel. The Chelsea striker has been seen wearing a t-shirt under his official kit with the slogan "Choose Jesus, eternal life." He has also shared his positive experience of attending the Alpha course on YouTube.


Hello everyone,

The Chairman Reports:

Parish Clerk: Firstly, you will note that the Clerk details have changed above. Unfortunately, Tony has had to give up the post. He joined us during last year's lockdown and nearly all the council meetings were conducted online making the job more difficult. We thank him for the effort and dedication he has put into the job during these past 9 months.

On August 1st Anthea Cass will be taking on the role of Clerk. She is connected to the village, but lives outside it and we will probably have to change the parish phone number to a mobile number.

Thefts from vehicles: There have been a number of thefts from vehicles reported in another popular medium. If this unfortunately happens to you, please report it to the Police. This enables them to react quicker to prevent future thefts and even catch those responsible. There is often a pattern with thieves coming from outside the area to target a village and then moving on to the next. They can come from as far as Birmingham or London.

HS2: A webinar was held on 14th July. I was unable to join for technical reasons. I am unhappy that this means is no substitute for a public meeting where both sides of the argument can be put. The changes they have made to the original plan result in more traffic to Bucks Railway Centre and the new housing development passing more houses. Their planning of the revised junction presupposes abnormal loads for BRC will have to cut the corner, which has to be unacceptable. Meanwhile, travelling to or from Waddesdon means travelling to the southern end of the new road rather than accessing a junction near to the existing crossroads as originally planned. Safety issues on the new road for pedestrians, a bus stop and the speed of vehicles coming off the new road into Station Rd are a major concern. Speed limits on a new open road will not be followed unless rigidly enforced.

I am still pushing for a public meeting, especially now that COVID restriction can no longer be used as an excuse and latest indications are September.

Berryfield Traffic Lights: Gone at last. The CCTV is to monitor traffic levels which I am confident will prove that the lights were never needed. The next fight is to stop them closing Blackgrove Rd and diverting all the traffic through Quainton and down Station Rd. I have been asking about this for the past 9 months, only to have it dropped casually as an afterthought in a fortnightly meeting. My reaction is not printable but I will continue to oppose this in the strongest terms.

Road Repairs and Drainage: I toured the area with Iain Macpherson, our Buckinghamshire Councillor, in mid-July so that he was better informed about the problems we face and so that he can better tackle TFB ensure that works are done sooner. In recent years many promises about drainage have not been kept or overtaken by winter flooding crises elsewhere. This year TFB have doubled the budget to £8m for drainage and gulley work recognising that there has been much neglect. Meanwhile our long-term problems continue to persist. The Willows has had much-needed extensive work done at last, and blockages were jetted and cleared in

Northend, Winwood Drive and the Strand. Past experience tells me that these will require repeat attention in 2 years' time. Major problems remain including the Strand where the road has to be closed to fully repair the damaged drain. Meanwhile the pothole expands. Other drainage problems include Townsend/Northend, two sites on Station Rd and the crossroads at Berryfields.

At a recent HS2/EWR meeting there was considerable criticism of Buckinghamshire Council for not fixing the roads while still arguing with HS2/EWR. This is a difficult one as there are large sums involved and HS2 are relying on surveys undertaken before work started which ignores the fact that many of these roads were never designed to take the weight of traffic that they are now seeing.

Elsewhere in HS2 Land: Work at the A41 junction is now not due to finish until December as Thames Water has insisted that extra work is taken to protect their fragile water main. It is unclear whether Station Rd will remain closed as there are concerns that three-way traffic lights may cause extensive jams on the A41.

There will be a new roundabout on the A41 by the construction site near Fleet Marston although this has now been delayed until September, and during July, 19 days were spent fencing in Great Crested Newts for relocation and the closure of the Edgcott Rd. If anybody was denied access to Finemere Wood please let me know as there is an undertaking to keep this open.

Please note there is an update on forthcoming road closures on the Quainton website. It changes as soon as we are informed and typically often sees works delayed.

Buckinghamshire have employed the first of two HS2 Marshals. He starts in August and will be familiarising himself with the area and problems. I look forward to meeting him and showing him around Quainton. His job will be to quickly respond to issues with HS2 and EWR. I will explain more after I have met him.

Skatepark: There have been a number of parties at the skatepark. Complaints have been minimal and given the importance for teenagers to socialise at this time in their lives, which have been severely limited by COVID, I would hope people remain tolerant. I am sure these events will not become a regular occurrence over the summer.

Planning: There was a planning meeting for parishes which illustrated the challenges faced. There are 1300 applications per month, up 36% but similar to other SE councils. They had 9 vacancies in the main planning area and currently some officers are handling over 100 applications. Strangely, they were unable to say what the proportion was of the total. There are a number of enforcement problems in our area and across the county there are 1600 open cases.

More recently we have received news that objections will no longer be viewable on the planning website after an instruction from Government citing GDPR. If true this is of great concern. The PC references other objections – particularly from the specialists such as Highways and Heritage.





LOCAL SPECIES - BROCK THE BADGER

There's a lot of misinformation and "fake news" about badgers in the media these days and the "lunatic fringe" are having a field day. As with politics, it's best to heed the science and ignore the emotive claptrap if you can! Let's look at the ecology of the creature itself – an animal that has inhabited Britain for at least 250,000 years.

The European badger (*Meles meles*) is part of the

stoats, polecats, ferrets and pine martens. Male badgers are called boars, females are sows and the young are cubs. Unlike dogs and foxes badgers have five toes and very long, powerful claws, particularly on the front feet, which equips them well for their lifestyle of digging. (As well as for "uncurling" hedgehogs, as mentioned last month).

Badgers live in social groups of between six and up to twenty adults and spend about 70% of their time in systems of underground tunnels and chambers known as setts; some of which are centuries old and cover vast areas. Cubs are born in February in specific nesting chambers, lined with grass or bracken, within the core sett. Truly omnivorous, badgers eat everything from insects and earthworms to small mammals. Legally protected since 1992, populations have increased considerably and while a few badgers used to travel round field margins looking for food, nowadays large numbers are spreading everywhere as the search for food gets harder. The decline in hedgehog populations is almost certainly partly due to there being twice as many badgers competing for food as there were three decades ago. The same goes for the lack of bumble bees now. Ground nesting bees and wasps provide Brock with the ultimate delicacies – grubs and honey. Interestingly, badgers are one of very few animals who have enough fat in their cheeks to enable them to continue digging while being stung.

Fascinating animals but rather like Marmite; love them or hate them. They do spread TB in cattle and how to prevent the spread and resultant decimation of hugely valuable cattle herds is the current debate. Farmers going about their important tasks have also been known to be upset when their tractors and tackle have suddenly disappeared into the ground whilst unknowingly working above a badger sett. Some years ago, friends who had bought a delightful rural property not more than 15 miles from Quainton decided to install a grass tennis court at vast expense. Soon after, they returned from a short holiday to find that badgers had constructed a new sett underneath the court with the inevitable resulting earthworks. It is a serious crime to interfere with badger setts so that was the end of the tennis court.

So, many of us who are not directly affected by the growth and decline of species like badgers, bumblebees and hedgehogs for example are trying to sort facts from emotional (often misguided) information. Whatever your views, badgers will probably still be here long after the human race's apparent desire for self-destruction has run its course.





Ramblings afar from Finemere Wood By Charlotte Karmali, Volunteer Warden

June is a time for repairs around Finemere Wood. As nature unfurls in all its summer glory, the volunteers turn their attention to a fencing project out in the meadows. A local farmer grazes sheep on these meadows, a mutually beneficial arrangement. Sheep help to control scrub and dominant plants, and thus the more delicate meadow flowers are given space to bloom. Each year these meadows are more diverse as a result. But good fencing is needed to keep the sheep in the areas where grazing is required.

Fortunately, I have some expert fencers in my team, and Judith is one of them. She knows her dragon bars from her monkey strainers and her flamingo bar from her spinning jenny. Petite, but mightily strong, she can be seen tackling trees or rolls of fencing wire many times her size. Judith has the biggest and most beautiful of smiles, there is much laughter when she is around and many an animated debate or discussion.

Judith spent her working life as a Civil Servant, enjoying a varied portfolio career. From a VAT inspector and a training officer to a policy advisor to ministers and everything in between. She spent time working in the Treasury which she greatly enjoyed. Now, much of her time is given over to volunteering for BBOWT. In recent weeks she has taken on the position of Bucks Reserves representative on the Volunteer Voice Forum, a perfect candidate for this role. Alongside this, Judith leads work parties at College Lake, as well as volunteering at the Upper Ray Reserve.

A key player in the Finemere team, Judith has been there since its inception eight years ago. So why has she kept coming back throughout this time? "The peace and beauty of this wonderful place, and the feeling you get that it is timeless. It was here long before any of us, and (hopefully) will be here long after we have gone. Favourite Finemere activity? "Everything" is her response, even pulling ragwort, "but if I had to choose one thing it would probably be the work we did to uncover the old drovers track and watching as that area has come back to life. And the work we now do every year to keep it that way. But I love fencing... of course!!" Judith captures the magic of working in this bewitching place in her answer "The thing I love the most is the rhythm of the tasks in line with the seasons, it makes you feel even more in touch with the natural world."

Her favourite wildlife species is the swift, the harbinger of summer, "it's amazing that they spend nearly their whole lives on the wing and fly so far to get here to breed. I was lucky enough to watch them up close when we lived in a house where they nested in the eves."

So what does Judith get up to when not out in the depths of a BBOWT reserve? She plays the flute, having taken up the challenge to learn an instrument at the age of 50. Very recently she could be heard playing in an outdoor concert where there was heavy rain and flyaway sheet music to contend with. She cooks, she reads, and in pre-Covid days enjoyed summer holidays abroad.

A remarkable woman in so many ways. "Tell me something about yourself that not many people know," I ask. "When I was about 10 years old, I was featured in the ITV children's TV programme "Seeing Sport" having my ice skating lesson!!" A film star as well, what can I say?
