WELCOME FROM HOLY CROSS & ST MARY'S CHURCH



Dear friends,

This year Valentine's Day falls on Ash Wednesday. St Valentine was a real person who was known as a risk taker and miracle worker. Ultimately he gave his life for what he believed. We celebrate Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, on the same day. Both days celebrate the meaning of true love which is difficult to find these days when TV programmes like "Love Island", "90 Day Fiancé", and "Married At First Sight", are gaining in popularity! These programmes and others exhibit the exact opposite of what true love actually is.

The most reliable accounts we have of the life of St Valentine includes the story of his house arrest in Rome because of his Christian faith during the dictatorship of the Emperor Claudius. The person assigned to guard him was Judge Asterius who had a blind daughter. Asterius challenged Valentine to prove that his Christianity was true by healing his daughter of blindness. Valentine touched the eyes of the child and her sight was restored. There are other accounts of Valentine standing up for people who were being oppressed and conducting marriage ceremonies to enable lovers to be together in a union recognised by the law. Valentine ended up losing his life because of his faith.

The New Testament was originally written in Greek, with a smattering of Aramaic here and there. You may be wondering what NT Greek has to do with Valentines Day! Well, all will be revealed...

We have over 15,000 manuscripts of the New Testament – whole or in part – dating back to the first century making these texts more reliable than any other classical work of literature. For instance, the writings of Herodotus in 488BC – the earliest manuscripts copies we have date 1300 years after the original and we only have 8 copies. Same with the Roman historian Tacitus who wrote in 100AD – the earliest copies we have date from 1000 years after he wrote his works and we only have 20 copies. Caesar's "Gallic Wars" are take as reliable documents, but he wrote them around 58BC and the earliest manuscripts we have are dated 950 years after he wrote them and we only have 10 copies.

In the original Greek of the NT, there are four words for "love" – *storge* – an empathy bond, philia – friendship love, *eros* – romantic love and *agape* – unconditional, sacrificial love. It's this last "love", agape, that is used most when describing the love Christ has for us, and the love we should have for each other. Now that's very different from the Hollywood, TV Soap, TV "Reality" Show type love.

May God help us to emulate that kind of love as we celebrate Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday.

Trained first aiders with the teams gave CPR and use of the QMH defibrillator saved the man's life. He is now making a good recovery.

Quainton Support Network: Shopping Bus?

I have been talking to our local councillors regarding a shopping bus. The Bernwode Community bus could be used for taking a small group of residents shopping to Aylesbury or Bicester for a couple of hours once a fortnight.

It would be a pre-booked service costing maybe £5 - £7 a trip per person. Bus passes can't be used.

No worries about bus timetables, parking and carrying shopping back on a bus and much cheaper than a taxi. Added bonus, shopping with friends from the village.

Would you be interested in having this service available? I don't know for certain if it can but if there are enough people interested then there is a good chance. It would need someone to take the booking and contact the Bernie Bus team.

Need some help? The Quainton Support Network is here. Volunteer driving scheme.

How does it work? A team of volunteer drivers take residents to appointments. The service tends to be used by older residents who do not drive anymore but it is for anyone in the village.

Phone Claire or Alison and they will send a call out to the volunteers to see if anyone is free. Users of the system pay 45p per mile petrol expenses and if necessary, any parking. The amount is worked out beforehand.

The support network was set up during the pandemic to collect prescriptions, deliver shopping, offer advice – we have volunteer counsellors who can maybe suggest the best place to go for advice.



Quainton Windmill Society's 50th Anniversary in 2024

In May 1974 a public meeting was held in Quainton to discuss the possible restoration of the village windmill which had been redundant for 85 years and left to deteriorate. The Quainton Windmill Society was formed and restoration started shortly afterwards.

Bernard Hall, remembered "Roddy Rodwell helped start up the Windmill Society, he was one of the best people ever, very courageous, climbing all over the mill, inside and out. For many years, the original team worked hard to restore the mill, which they all got great satisfaction from."

Over the next twelve months the Society will celebrate this significant anniversary and the hard work of the volunteers involved.

There are only forty working windmills in the UK, and Quainton is fortunate to have our own windmill dating back to 1832.


We have a huge variety of volunteer roles but, basically, they fit into two types:

RAMBLINGS FROM FINEMERE WOOD: Charlotte Karmali, Volunteer Warden

January is here again. Grey, cold, and wet, it is a melancholic time of year. The days are short and spring seems so far away. The wood displays a monochrome colour scheme, many shades of brown. Trees are defoliated; there is little sign of life. The wilderness seems to be in hibernation.



In contrast, the volunteers are bubbling with excitement. They have been at home for a month tucking into Christmas pudding and mince pies. Sugar levels are high. The woodland workers are happy to be back; it is time to get those bodies moving and to catch up on stories of the festive season.

But there is life in the wood, albeit quieter and less colourful than its human companions. Stand still, look, and listen. A green woodpecker yaffles in the distance, a robin chirrups its melodic warbling song. A variety of fungi can be spotted on deadwood. Mosses envelop tree stumps. And lichen is

everywhere.

Lichens are made up of two or more organisms living together in a symbiotic

relationship. A fungus provides a structure in which algae can live under its protection. The algae makes food for the fungus via photosynthesis.

Over 1800 species of lichen have been recorded in the UK, in many forms and colours, growing on bark and stone. **Oak Moss** (Evernia prunastri) grows on the branches of oak, other deciduous trees, and pine. Highly branched and bushy it is a pale green on top with a white underside. It is just one lichen that can be spotted in Finemere Wood.



Ancient woodland, which has had minimal disturbance over the centuries, is the ideal environment for lichens as they are slow-growing and highly sensitive to pollution. These extraordinary organisms support a diverse mix of wildlife, providing nesting material for birds and shelter for invertebrates.

I gather my loppers and saw together, leaving my ponderings on lichen for now, and join the gang to clear back encroaching scrub from the woodland rides. January seems more promising after a day in the woods: companionship, exercise, and wonders of nature.

HS2 in Quainton

February edition

We are delighted to announce that the reinstatement works to the Station Road Bridge, Quainton are now complete, with the bridge reopening on 2 January. Formerly subject to a 4-tonne weight limit, the bridge's structure has been strengthened by Network Rail to permit access without any weight restrictions.

In preparation for the realignment of the A41 this year, we will be hosting a number of community engagement events. Our first event will be our mobile visitor centre (MVC) at the Waddesdon Community Centre on 21 February at 10am-3pm. The MVC provides local residents with the opportunity to speak to us and gain insight into our upcoming works in the area.

Our key dates so far this year for the works around the area;

- Snake Lane/Fiddlers Field closure for the construction of bridges and structures associated with the Station Road realignment (2 January 2024 to December 2025)
- Blackgrove Road closure to construct tie-in between Blackgrove Road and newlyaligned A41 (26 February -3 March 2024)
- A41 Full road closure to enable utility works (February 2024, date TBC)


