Welcome from Holy Cross & St Mary's Church



Dear friends,

Russia's invasion of Ukraine has produced a human tragedy that we haven't seen since the Second World War. One of the shocking things for me is that millions of Russian people actually believe Putin's rhetoric spewed out mindlessly through his propaganda machine. When this is all over, it will be very difficult for him to hide the evidence of numerous atrocities perpetrated on the innocent victims of war. In the middle of all this mess, stories have been emerging about

the way Christian Churches in Ukraine have been reaching out to those in need with medicines, food and shelter. And many Russian Orthodox priests have made a stand against the war, at the risk of their own lives.

When times are tough, we look for solid, unchangeable things to base our lives on: the love of those closest to us, good friends, work which satisfies and fulfils us. These give us footholds when our world is rocking: anchor points that help us through the challenges of life – illness, redundancy, bereavement, debt, broken relationships and more. The Christian faith is based on the death and the return to life of Jesus, and Easter is the time that the Church marks these two pivotal events in world history. Christianity is less about religion, with its rules and rituals, than about relationship – a vital, living, two-way friendship with Jesus. Not a long-dead figure from a dusty book, with no relevance to our lives today, but someone who knows us inside out, yet still loves us, and longs for us to become the people we were made to be. The one who said: "I am the resurrection and the life..." (John 11: 25).

But is it true? Did it really happen? The evidence is compelling:

- An empty tomb
- Countless appearances of Jesus, referred to by the apostle Paul in 1 Corinthians 15: 3-8
- A reborn and revitalised group of followers, once living in fear of the Roman authorities, suddenly and inexplicably prepared to face death and persecution because of what they had witnessed.
- A rapidly growing Early Church, charted through the book of Acts, leading to a global Church of billions around the world today.

If Jesus is alive, it changes everything: our attitude to life and death, our past, our present – and our future. It means death is not the end, and there is a life that last forever. Life wins! It means we can know the Creator of the universe, and live life as He intended it to be lived.

Join us this Easter to celebrate the most amazing news of all: Jesus is alive today and loves you more than you can imagine!



April Jobs for the Garden

- Sow hardy annuals, herbs and wildflower seeds outdoors
- Harden off seedlings that were started indoors
- Sow perennials i.e. hollyhocks, delphiniums, echinaceas
- Tie in climbing and rambling roses
- Pot cuttings of tender perennials taken last summer
- When the soil warms up and ground is prepared, some salad veg can be sown
- Plant early peas and broad beans. Sow peas in large pots for shoots or in the ground for peas. Choose hardy, early varieties for sowing in March/April. Sow seeds in single or double lines, 5cm deep and 30cm apart
- First early potatoes can also be planted



Your Parish Council Reports:

Councillor News: We first wish to extend our thanks to John Knox for the hard work he has put in over the past 10 years as a Councillor for Quainton Parish. We wish him well in his future endeavours. Our first priority this month was to appoint a new chairman. On this occasion, the council elected Cllr Nicolette Smith for this position. With Brian Fludgate temporarily returning as clerk and Katherine Richardson joining us as our new clerk, the Quainton Parish Council is now left to fill three Councillor positions to form a full council. We invite people from the Parish to contact us and apply for the role of Parish Councillor. Skate Park: We wish to move forward with the new skate park. There was a preliminary meeting last autumn and now that the weather is looking better we're sure kids will be out to use the skate park again. An inspection is scheduled to take place during May. We know it needs replacing within a couple of years. A new Facebook group has been created and we invite people who are interested to join: https://www.facebook.com/groups/996917390903081/

Playground: a new bin has been installed!

Jubilee Beacon: As part of the Queen's Jubilee celebrations the Beacon will be lit on June 2nd and we have approved funding for a piper to play the special Jubilee piece 'Diu Regnare'. Thanks to Louisa, your editor, for arranging. More information about the Queen's Jubilee celebrations can be found on the Buckinghamshire Lieutenancy's website: https://www.buckslieutenancy.org/platinumjubilee22 Details about Quainton's event are on p.13.

CHOW: 30 saplings have arrived from the Woodland Trust. They've received silver birch, Rowan and wild Cherry to plant in the meadow and copse at the Community Heritage Orchard & Wildlife (CHOW) project. The plaque for the red oak has arrived as well. We'd like to extend a special thanks to Claire, Michelle, Carol, Nick H, Nick B, John, Kath, Greta, Jane, Simon, and all the volunteers who have continued to work hard to get this community orchard and wildlife meadow looking great for the village; clearing the area of thistles, planting new trees and hedges, learning all about trees, wildflowers and grasses, ordering equipment and put benches together, the ditching work and generally keeping on top of everything, including organising the Wassailing ceremonies. Work continues over the next few weeks to create a beautiful space for us all to enjoy. Follow progress and offer your help and support via https://www.facebook.com/groups/321040946212772

Litter Picking: we have noticed there's a group of people who go about doing marvellous work picking litter along our village roads and outlying areas. We wish to thank these people and we're also looking into how we can support an organised effort again as we had an organised group before Covid disrupted our lives and schedules. A big concern is an increase in traffic in the area and we're looking into ways to make this activity safe for everyone.

Roads: There is a list of at least 16 items that are being discussed with the Local Area Technician, this ranges from potholes to damaged kerbs, damaged drains to bollards and traffic signs, as well as the

issues with heavy traffic coming down Lower Street. We're investigating which companies these lorries are from and where possible communicate with them to use alternative routes. Apart from the main route into Quainton from Blackgrove Road, The Willows, The Strand and Station Road and North End via Lee Road, the village roads are not on the Buckinghamshire recommended roads for HGVs, so they shouldn't need to drive through the village unless they have a destination within the village.

Speed Watch: We're still progressing on the installation of the four poles and two new Speed Indicator Devices. Cllrs Lee Whitlock and Nicolette Smith have checked on the locations of the four poles; they will be installed at the entrance to the village on The Strand, on Townsend, near Scrags Hill and a new location on Station Road to replace the current one there. We have agreed to a maintenance contract for the SIDs, which means we don't need people to download and analyse the data coming from the SIDs and if - like the ones currently on Station Road and Lower Street - something goes wrong, we can call the contractor to fix the problem. Once the SIDs are up and running we will be able to proactively monitor speeding in the village and mitigate any issues arising.

Station Rd Traffic Calming: Cllr Sue Weldon and Clerk Brian Fludgate met with Barwood Homes about the exact proposal regarding the bus stop near nr 108 Station Rd and the 'chicane' near the allotments. The 'improvement' to the bus stop would be a dropped kerb to aide with crossing the road near the bus stop. The proposed 'chicane' is more a widening of the footpath. We have agreed that some adjustments need to be made to the existing proposals to allow for wide loads at the 'chicane' as well as extending the length so traffic doesn't sit and wait outside someone's kitchen window. We await the new drawings.

Planning: There were no new applications to be considered at the last Council Meeting.

Bus Service: Ward Cllr Iain Macpherson reported that he's in contact with the bus company. He will report back if the public transport department will agree to the Red Rose bus using the Railway Centre car park to turn just like the Redline school bus does. It would speed matters up if we don't have to wait for a trial of the regular bus service, when we know this is a workable solution for the school bus.

Station Road Crossroads: Ward Cllr Iain Macpherson reported that we are still awaiting police reports, until then we cannot progress this situation.

HS2/EKFB New Station Rd Layout: Ward Cllr Iain Macpherson reported that there are new drawings that have not been presented to the Parish Council yet, so we have requested these so we can see any new plans. On the walk around for the SIDs poles, Cllrs Nicolette Smith and Lee Whitlock have established that the new SID will be placed after the new road layout enters Station Road, which should help remind drivers to slow down as they enter Station Road. The bus stop at 108 is after this and the dropped kerb crossing should also help traffic slow down.

Road Closures: In addition to the long list we already have: HS2/EKFB: There was an overnight closure to the Station Rd 'South' for road surface corrections. Station Rd was fully closed, 24 hours a day, at the end of March as part of the continued preparatory works. HS2/EKFB carried out Ground Investigation (GI) works along Station Rd between the entrance to Bucks Railway Centre and the crossroads. The GI works will involve surveys and trial holes to allow for accurate detection and identification of existing services/utilities. Communication: We realise not everyone accesses the same media to get info about the village. Along with our wonderful monthly Quainton News, we also like to highlight the Quainton Village Website on https://www.quainton.org.uk/ There are also physical message boards on The Green and at the Memorial Hall to keep you up to date with Village News. The Queen's Platinum Jubilee Beacon Burning: Thursday 2nd June 2022

The official Platinum Jubilee beacon burning event, as organised by the Queen's Pageantmaster Bruno Peek, will take place on 2nd June at 9.45pm. Ouainton will host this on Mill Hill.

More than 1,500 beacons will be lit throughout the United Kingdom, Channel Islands, Isle of Man and UK Overseas Territories, and one in each of the capital cities of Commonwealth countries in recognition of The Queen's long and selfless service. The beacons will enable local communities, individuals and organisations to pay tribute to her as part of the official Platinum Jubilee Weekend of celebrations. The order of the event, as stipulated by the Pageantmaster, will be:

Town Crier (Do we have one in the village? If not, Mr Evans you should expect my call...!) At 2pm local time, Town Criers are being invited to undertake the pre-written Proclamation (Clue, it starts with: Oyez Oyez!) to announce the lighting of the beacon later that evening.

Bag Pipes

At 9.35pm local time across the UK and the Commonwealth, pipers are being asked to play 'Diu Regnare' as their personal tribute to Her Majesty The Queen. This unique tune has been especially written for this historic Jubilee. I have hopefully secured a bag pipe player, who will play this piece for us on Mill Hill!

Bugle Call

At 9.40pm local time, to officially announce the lighting of the beacon, a unique Bugle Call has been written, entitled 'Majesty,' adding another colourful element to this special tribute to Her Majesty the Queen. Quainton's very own bugler, Martin Dorrell, has agreed to learn this piece of music and play it on the night for our event.

Choir

At exactly 9.45pm local time, to coincide with the lighting of the Beacons, choirs of all types and sizes within local communities are warmly encouraged to sing this unique 'Song for the Commonwealth.' The song is the winner of a Commonwealth-wide song competition organised over the last few months. Our vicar and Community Choir leader, Steve Flashman, has agreed to teach this new song to Quainton's Community Choir, to be sung on Mill Hill as the beacon is lit. If anyone would like to be a part of this, we meet on Fridays at 10am in the Memorial Hall.

The Beacon:

The Beacons will all be lit at exactly 9.45pm, local time. We hope to enlist the help of someone to 'run' less-mobile residents up the hill like we did for the previous beacon event, to ensure as many of us as possible can enjoy the occasion. Our huge thanks to Warren, Ian, Richard, Steve and Pete of Quainton Bonfire & Fireworks committee, who will erect the beacon on Mill Hill and prepare it for lighting for this momentous occasion of our Queen's Platinum Jubilee!

I hope you all agree that it looks set to be a fabulous night of celebrations up Mill Hill!

Ramblings from Finemere Wood By Charlotte Karmali - Volunteer Warden

Spring is in the air and Finemere Wood is coming to life. Warming yellows are the first colour to catch the eye: pretty, pale yellow Primroses bursting into bloom, lemony-yellow Brimstone butterflies flitting effortlessly by. These are such welcome sights after the gloom and colourlessness of the Winter months.

The volunteers met in the gentle March sunshine to tidy up their winter mess, dealing with the piles of wood that have accumulated during the recent scrub clearance activities. A fire was built and potatoes set to bake, a Finemere Wood delicacy. For today we must celebrate Pete (BBOWTs Reserves Officer for North Buckinghamshire), who is leaving us as his career progresses upwards.

The **Ash** tree (*Fraxinus excelsior*) is one of the most common and striking trees in the UK. Living for up to 400 years, and even longer if coppiced, it may reach a dizzy height of 35 metres. Its pinnate, light-green leaves allow sunlight to reach the ground, thus providing an airy canopy. Flora takes advantage of this; dog violet and dog's mercury are just two plants that will flourish underneath an ash tree. Ash trees provide a rich habitat for a variety of wildlife. Birds, such as woodpeckers, owls and nuthatches nest, and bats roost, in the cracks and hollows of large mature trees. Bullfinches eat the seeds. Lichens and moss grow on the bark, and the leaves provide a food source for many species of moth.

Sadly, Ash dieback, a fungal disease, is now widespread across the country. The fungus is spread by the wind and a large number of ash trees in Finemere Wood are showing considerable damage. The result is structurally unstable trees which present a hazard to the public. The deadwood of the trees plays a vital role in the ecosystem of the wood and so wherever possible, the ash trees will be left to die and decay naturally. Because of the danger of falling dead trees and branches, the path to the back of the wood is now closed. And so, the time has come to say goodbye to Pete, who has been a joy and an inspiration to work with. Calm, fun, always supportive, and hugely knowledgeable, he will be sorely missed by all. Thank you, Pete, for all you have done for Finemere Wood and its woodland workers. Come back and visit us one day to appreciate the results of your contribution.
