

The Chairman Reports:

As I write this another superb **firework display** is still fresh in my mind, although as you read this, you will be thinking of Christmas. Nevertheless, our thanks are once again due to the organisers and helpers for a great display.

On the **planning** front there is an application in principle for 2 houses in **Church Street** in front of the Croft The council resolved to opposed this as being unsuitable in the Conservation area amongst other objections.

Meanwhile more progress has been made in staffing in Bucks Planning Department and they are making a determined effort to clear a backlog of old outstanding applications including four in Quainton. Chief among these was approval of the new Faccenda application from 2019. This will mean the replacement of the existing building with a larger facility to the west with its access to the new road being constructed by HS2.

The bad news is that the bridge weight limit means construction traffic will add to the housing development traffic if they start within the next 12 months. Meanwhile the planners have agreed a travel plan aimed at moving staff from cars to buses. Currently the shift starts at 4am so I presume we should see an improved bus service!

We will engage with the constructors to try and alleviate this while continuing to chase Network Rail to hasten bridge repairs

The housing development at 151 Station Road electrical connection will involve digging up Station Rd and further to connect to a sub-station. In view of the disruption we are facing from HS2 and the history from Thames Water, I have asked Barwood Homes to carefully consider this in their talks with UKPN, especially as there may be alternatives afforded by the moving of cables in the HS2 area.

Speedwatch: Last month I talked about new SIDs and I am happy to say the problems with Bucks have been resolved. We are now finalising the quotes which will hopefully involve solar power. Meanwhile we need volunteers to help operate the sentinel unit. Speeding drivers caught on this are warned by the police and more serious action taken for repeat offenders. We are considering buying our own unit to increase the number of times we can deploy it. The current one is shared with several parishes.

Dog mess: Since Covid there has been an increase in the number of dogs in the village and sadly in the football field and tennis court meadow an increase in the amount of mess not picked up by the walkers. We will increase the availability of dog bins but it is down to you to clear up after your dogs. Many do and I thank those who do.

Next meeting: Thursday 9th December at 8pm

Finally, let me take this opportunity to wish you all a Happy Christmas and New Year.

THE BEACON

The Council has been asked by the Quainton Bonfire & Fireworks Committee to apply for Planning Permission to replace the current Certificate of Lawfulness and thus permanently install the Beacon on Mill Hill. There is a brief explanation below with a tear off strip. A more detailed explanation will be available on the Quainton Website: https://quainton.org.uk/

Dear Quainton Resident,

The Quainton Bonfire & Fireworks Committee have put together a proposal to allow the Quainton Beacon to be located on Mill Hill Quainton all year round.

The current practice of erecting and then dismantling the Beacon after use is time consuming, costly and causes damage to the shaft bolts and concrete base. The logistics of erecting, lighting and dismantling the Beacon takes up to 4 weeks for each event. In a normal year with 3 lightings envisaged, the Beacon will already be visible for up to 3 months of the year (which was significantly longer during Covid-19 restrictions) and therefore the difference in current visibility and proposed visibility is 9 months. The heavy steelwork which provides its strength requires careful handling to ensure health and safety concerns are addressed for each lighting event. The Beacon is designed to remain in place, therefore the granting of planning permission would mitigate these issues.

Quainton Parish Council has been asked to make this application for planning permission. The permission will then be decided by Buckinghamshire Council, the planning authority. We wish to consider the views of the residents in our decision to make the application and therefore we would like you to put your vote forward on the attached voting slip and return your anonymous vote to the Parish Council either to the Village Shop or deliver to 15 Lower St. Please note the post code is not intended to identify individual votes.


Quainton Parish Magazine - September 1952

The Quainton Parish Magazine from September 1952 cost 3d, is 8 pages long and comes with an insert from a national publication 'The Sign'. There are no photographs in the local section of the magazine although there are some in 'The Sign'. As with its modern day counterpart, the magazine contains a letter from the Rector, information on church services and church rota, Parish Register entries, news on events in the village and advertisements.


A few events in the village are mentioned, including the upcoming Harvest Festival and the British Legion Fete and the WI Annual Garden Party – both of which were held in the Rectory garden.

There's a report on the activities of the Missionary Sewing Party and the Choral Society's committee meeting. Also included is the balance sheet of Quainton Football Club for the 1951/1952 season.

It was interesting to see the names of those filling the roles in the running of the church – many surnames are familiar today:



There are a lot of advertisements in the magazine, many of them for businesses in the village (and Aylesbury) sadly no longer in existence. These from the village which are no longer in existence include Syson's Stores (Grocers & Hardware, The Green), Buckingham and Read (Painters and Decorators, Church Street), H Jackson (Drapers, The Green), Marshalls (Bakers & Groceries) and Buckle & Beattie (Butchers) & the Post Office on The Green.



In fact, the only Quainton business still in existence from those times is Quainton Garage.





Ramblings afar from Finemere Wood By Charlotte Karmali, Volunteer Warden

November and the days are becoming colder and darker. The pull to stay tucked up indoors is becoming greater. The woodland workers, however, are still coming out in their numbers, spirited and sparky. They love the winter work of chopping down trees and shrubs, it is difficult for them to contain their excitement at times.

Without management, Finemere wood would become a dark and gloomy place. It would eventually become dominated by large, mature trees. There would be no variety in the size and structure of vegetation, resulting in less biodiversity. The back of the wood is left to its own devices, but the rest of the wood is actively managed to ensure a diverse range of habitats is available for all wild things.

Each year, three or four scallops are created along the rides. A ride is a linear track designed for access. Scallops are large lay-by shaped areas that are cut into the woodland edge, approximately 10 metres deep by 30 metres wide. All vegetation within this area is cleared. This creates an undulating margin that maximises the woodland edge, providing a diverse range of habitats, hugely beneficial to wildlife. Extra sunlight will flood down to the ground, providing warm, sheltered pockets and protection from the wind for many a species of invertebrate, and butterflies in particular. The scallops are left to regenerate over a number of years, and thus develops a patchwork of vegetation of varying maturity and size, a home for every creature.

The volunteers work like machines, trees and shrubs thud to the ground like dominos. Gleeful shouts of "timber!" surround me. To stop them I must confiscate their saws, or shout "cake!'.

The cut wood is piled around the edge of the scallop, forming a dead hedge. It provides a valuable habitat for fungi and a wide spectrum of invertebrates which break down the vegetation, returning the nutrients to the soil. Mosses and lichens will thrive, birds will find a rich source of food, and amphibians will hibernate here.

Another scallop done. The volunteers look on with satisfaction. It has been an exhilarating day, a tonic for the workers. But for nature it is a tonic too, this act of cutting will kickstart new growth, new habitats, and a greater abundance and medley of life.


