Welcome from Holy Cross & St Mary's Church

Dear friends,

Grand Designs is a TV programme fronted by Kevin McCloud who now has well over 200 episodes under his belt since it was launched back in April 1999. It features interesting and often quite elaborate home building projects that capture the imagination, drawing the viewer in to the personal challenges and often disrupted plans of the property owners.

When I was a teenager, one of my passions was architecture and I think if a building project is alw I hadn't gone into the church I would have become an architect. Planning move towards its stated objectives.

Have you ever wondered if there is a "grand design" unfolding in terms of the future of our planet, or perhaps it's just fate that the world seems to be sliding into chaos!




Quainton PC Bonfire & Fireworks Night Returns with a Whizz, Pop and Bang!

The Chairman Reports:

Time passes quickly and while revelling in a holiday from writing this column, the Editor calls to remind me the holiday is over and this latest piece is overdue.

Clerk: Last time I wrote that we had a new clerk starting. Unfortunately, this only lasted for 23 days when the clerk resigned for personal reasons and I am back in an acting role. I can be reached at the above phone number or email. See notice board on p.39 for job description.

Crime: Last time the lead item was about a number of vehicle thefts; this time there is concern in Station Rd about a hooded youth seen twice who ran away when approached and somebody discovered in a bedroom. In all these cases they should be reported to the police.

Depending on its nature you cannot always expect a police response but each report can form part of a pattern that determines how they allocate scarce resources including driving through the village at various times.

This was explained by PCSO Danny Fahy who attended the last PC meeting. He also mentioned the successful use of wildlife cameras in Waddesdon and suggested they could be used around the sports sites.

Berryfields traffic lights: The CCTV has not demonstrated a need for lights and nor have there been any complaints since the lights removal as traffic has flowed normally. I wish officials would have listened to the common sense of residents who actually use these roads. The CCTV will be moved to the Waddesdon crossroads to see if lights are needed there. However other than for the Christmas lights I do not expect them to be permanent. At a recent meeting A Buckingham councillor asked why there was so many delays on the A41. I was able to enlighten him including the superb timing of extending the bus lane into Aylesbury and removal of the roundabout by TFB

HGVs: The closure on Station Road and the weight-limited bridge means there are an increasing number of HGVs coming through the village or down Station Road. The vast majority are for the 151 Station Road housing development and some even retain their HS2 or EWR boards to confuse you. The latter has been raised with HS2/EKFB as it embarrasses them also.

It is important to understand that the weight limit on the bridge prevents there being any other means of access to that site. I am trying to get the signs blocking the Station Road junction as the increased traffic increases the risk of an accident

I was recently asked for directions from Lower Street to Oaktree Farm by a large low loader. I told him he needed to turn round and given who he was speaking to made the fatal mistake of saying he wanted the HS2 depot there. I asked him where his board was and that he should not be in the village. He did not return.

Buses: The weight limit has long been obeyed by the 16 service and ignored by the school buses. New term and new contractor caused chaos as they avoided the bridge and Station Rd.

Courtesy of Iain MacPherson there will be a site meeting in the last week of September to investigate the use of the turning circle to restore buses to Station Rd. I tried this last year without success so fingers crossed.

Recreation: A number of things have taken place or are about to happen. This involves the cleaning and painting of the playpark equipment and the first tree has been planted in the community orchard in the Sports Field and Wildlife Meadow.

Planning: A plan to place an office/shed in the front garden at the corner of Lower Street was opposed because of the setting amongst listed properties, that it would be unduly prominent in this busy and central point in the conservation area and would require the removal of the hedge required in the original 2004 planning permission

HS2: Since I last wrote I have been able to meet the HS2 Minister and a director of EKFB. The meeting was arranged by Greg Smith MP. I left the minister with a long briefing paper on a number of issues but given the time limit I concentrated on the new road, which, at the time of the meeting, had been changed to only have the angled junction and the spur to the railway centre opposite the 151 development had been eliminated. I raised concerns about the speed of vehicles joining the existing road – speed limits do not work without regular enforcement. Instead, I proposed that the only junction should be the reinstated spur. This would force vehicles to brake and maximise the number of houses that would not have traffic to the Railway Centre passing them. It would also enable the bus stop to be retained on the residential part near the bridge and also be near the new 40 houses.

There was a subsequent meeting with the EKFB director and he is drawing up plans for this change. I also asked him to reinstate the straight-on link for Quainton Rd to and from Waddesdon. Bucks Highways had changed this to a southward dog-leg to join at the new road's inception nearer to the A41. They felt the dystopian landscape left by HS2 would be more enjoyable and rural. I also got a number of answers at our next liaison meeting with EKFB/Fusion; many had become relevant with time but I had been asking continually about work at Finemere Wood. The substation will now have an access road constructed across the field so walkers do not conflict with HGV's on the footpath.

Now take a deep breath, the hedges have been removed – not for construction purposes – but to ensure they have taken seriously their legal obligation to find and safely remove all the Gt Crested Newts. The hedge has been cut down to a few mm in the belief it will grow again!

Finally, I have just learnt that Bucks Highways is negotiating a package of six major repairs to be funded by HS2 where they have been the cause of substantial damage. Three of these will be in Quainton. It is not confirmed yet so I will not mention the roads which are all outside the village but as ever I remain hopeful.

Quainton's Village Store was once an alehouse called 'The Shepherd and Dog'

Built in the 17th century, and now Grade 2 Listed, this property was originally a "House, Bakehouse, garden and close" owned by James Curtis - but in 1730 James Anstiss had an Ale licence 1744 he there and in mortgaged the 'Shepherd and Dog' to Jonathan Rutland for £25. The licence was renewed each year until 1775 "but in 1779 John Lee, Carpenter, sold to Joseph Brazell, Shopkeeper, the



property formerly the Shepherd and Dog, in the tenure of James Anstiss, Victualler, for £70, and split up the garden with hedges, centred on the pond. 'Reserving for John Lee the free use of the water in the pond and also liberty of Eaves driping of the Southeast side of the Barn".

In 1833 the Property was bought by Joseph Curtis and a Mortgage dated 1845 states that the 'Property known as the Shepherd and Dog and now converted into and used as two private dwelling Houses and a Shop and Bakehouse occupied by Joseph and Thomas Curtis'.

When Joseph Curtis died in 1899, the property was sold to Frederick George Rose, Baker as "All that Messuage in Church St with the Meal house, Slaughter House, Stabling and Outbuildings - formerly known as the Shepherd and Dog, and then converted into two dwelling Houses and a Shop and Bakehouse, and secondly All that Butchers Shop and Coachhouse".

In January,1926, F.G. Rose sold the premises to Arthur Edward Uff who purchased the shop, house, buildings and paddock for the sum of £650, and as can be seen above, the shop doorway was on the end wall facing the Green.

Several owners later, the premises are now in the capable hands of Emma Rainbow and Sarah Thaker – and you can still buy alcoholic beverages there, although not quite in the way that they were sold when it was The Shepherd and Dog!

Message from Sue Evans about Quainton Guides:

After 39 years of being very much involved with Guiding in Quainton, I have decided that the time has come to leave. Of course, this has been an extremely sad and difficult decision.

However, I have no such hesitation in thanking everybody in Quainton who has supported me over the years and all the people who have helped me run the Guide unit and the Senior Section, from Val Alcock who was running Guides when I started helping and who encouraged me to train as a leader, to the various ex Guides who returned to help me at various times and the numerous treasurers who exercised considerable skill in keeping the accounts straight. It's impossible to mention all the other people who have helped make it possible but it is important to mention John Knox, Mrs.Celia Prideaux and other members of the Saye and Sele trust who allowed us to use the Saye and Sele Hall for such a reasonable rent even after it was so splendidly refurbished as a result of their hard work to raise the necessary funds.

I would also like to send special thanks to Mike Evans in Waddesdon who, until just recently, helped the Guides to obtain their First Aid Badge, year after year. This was always popular as Mike would show the girls how to make frighteningly realistic wounds. This led to a very unusual interest for a group of Guides joining with Mike as "casualties" in his Casualties Union Group. They gave their time to become casualties to help train emegency services even learning how to pump pretend blood rhythmically from a "wound" to differentiate between arterial and veinous wounds. This is a particular mremory for me of Heloise Bertram who practised this feat with Mike during a Guide meeting.

There is no way for me to say how much the support of the parents over the years has meant to me. I shall miss this as well as the Guides. We have had some wonderful times together from the cycle trips to Ivinghoe Youth Hostel when it was a pleasure to cycle along the quieter back roads, with no end of adventures especially at Mentmore Towers on the way, to the annual camping trips at 'our' wonderful site at Claydon House, our Water Fun Weekends at Longridge and those further afield such as Foxlease, Gilwell house and Brownsea Island. Always parents were there to support us in various ways and frequently helped with transport.

I feel very deeply that I am letting down the present Guides and the Brownies who were to come up in September. However, there would never be a good time to leave. At the moment there are no girls in the unit from Quainton. 50% come from Waddesdon and the others from the surrounding area. The older Brownies are happy to stay at Quainton Brownies with Sue and Sonia, which doesn't surprise me as they are such caring leaders who provide a haven where the girls learn, amongst other important things, respect for each other in the true Guiding spirit.

If the unit closes, hopefully, the present Guides will move to other units, there are plenty in Aylesbury, and there is always Scouts!

Kate, who has been such a great unit helper with the Guides recently, and I wish the present Guides all the best in the future. We shall miss you all.


We have a huge variety of volunteer roles and, basically, these roles fit into one of two types:





Ramblings afar from Finemere Wood By Charlotte Karmali, Volunteer Warden

September is a time of great change in Finemere Wood. As the dazzling colours of summer flowers fade, warm autumnal hues take their place. Leaves turn scarlet and gold and gracefully float to the ground. Clusters of berries, deep purples, and reds, are abundant along the hedgerows: blackberries, sloes, haws, and rose hips. Fungi, in shades of orange, yellow and brown take hold.

The volunteers are itching to get hold of saws once more and to move on to the winter work of cutting down trees and shrubs. But the endless summer cutting and raking of grassy rides and glades is not yet complete. This task is an important one as it not only prevents the encroachment of scrub but also keeps competitive plants under control, thus allowing a diverse array of the more delicate wildflowers to flourish year on year.

The scythe, with its long wooden handle (snath) and curved steel blade, is designed for cutting vegetation at ground level. Having been in existence since as far back as 500BC, the scythe only appeared in Europe during the 12th and 13th centuries. Originally used for mowing hay, by the 16th century it had replaced the sickle for reaping crops. It has since been succeeded by lawnmowers, tractors, combine harvesters, and brushcutters.

The imagery of the Grim Reaper with his scythe evolved in the middle ages, at a time of agrarian societies. With his scythe, he reaps those at the end of their lives, just as man reaps the harvest, and thus makes way for new life.

There are a handful of keen scythers amongst the woodland workers. For them, the meditative, peaceful work of mowing with a scythe is far more appealing than wrestling



with a relentlessly roaring brushcutter. Gently swishing and swaying through the tall grasses, it is a restorative workout for both the mind and body.

An important tool in the armoury of a conservation worker, the scythe is an efficient and sustainable choice for cutting grass. There is no pollution, no fossil fuels, no noise, and, properly maintained, a scythe will have a far longer lifespan than a machine. Not only that, but scything gives wildlife more time to get out of the way of danger.

I watch the scythers mowing in the golden autumnal sunlight. The ancient meadow and tracks of Finemere Wood seem a fitting place for the rise of the scythe.
